Germany invited to participate in Sultanate's nationbuilding

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has called on the German Government and German private sector companies to participate in the Sultanate's infrastructure development and economic diversification.

"These priorities have been recently set out in our 7th National Development Plan, 1996-2000. In this regard, the initialling of our Investment Agreement will promote more investment on both sides," stressed His Majesty in his address at a dinner he hosted in honour of the official visit of Chancellor Dr. Helmut Kohl of the Federal Republic of Germany at the Istana Nurul Izzah, on 1 May.

Bilateral Investment Treaty

The initialling of the Bilateral Investment Treaty concerning the Encouragement and Reciprocal Protection

of Foreign Investment between Brunei Darussalam and the Federal Republic of Germany was held earlier in the day. His Majesty's Government was represented by Dato Paduka Haji Yakub, the Permanent Secretary of the Finance Ministry, while His Excellency Ingmar Brentle, the republic's Ambassador to Brunei Darussalam signed for his country.

According to a press release issued by the Finance Ministry, the agreement

was reached during early discussions held in Bandar Seri Begawan in March and in Bonn in April this year.

The press release added that the initialling of the agreement is aimed at providing protection on investment, and giving favourable and profitable investment returns.

MOU between Brunei-German private sectors

In his address, His Majesty also spoke about the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the two countries' private sectors which will encourage business people to consider joint ventures in the East ASEAN Economic Growth Area. "We are ready to enter into partnership with German businessmen in developing this vast area," the ruler pointed.

The MOU was also signed on 1 May. It is aimed at fostering friend-ship and understanding between the business communities who feel the need to intensify cooperation and facilitate continuous interaction between them on private initiative so as to increase the two countries' trade and economic cooperation.

Therefore, the National Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Brunei Darussalam which signed on behalf of the country's private sector and the Association of German Chamber of Industry and Commerce representing the republic's private sector, have agreed to carry out promotional activities for business cooperation, trade, investment, technology transfer, services and other industrial sectors.

His Majesty also highlighted other areas of cooperation. These include in education and technical training in which Germany has the expertise.

"For this reason, Brunei Darussalam hopes to send more students to Germany to learn from your industrial experience. Such efforts will also help to promote more people-to-people contacts," said His Majesty.

Earlier in his address, His Majesty noted Germany's long recognition of Asia as an important economic area for investment which is now in a period of dynamic growth.

His Majesty said: "This needs European investment, trade and technology. At the same time, Asia's expanding markets and rising incomes offer Europe boundless opportunities."

The monarch further pointed that the inaugural Asia Europe Meeting (ASEM) in Bangkok last year brought the Heads of Government of the EU member states, ASEAN, China, Japan and South Korea together and laid the foundations for regular interaction that will build strong ties between the two regions.

As ASEM members, said His Majesty, Germany and Brunei Darussalam could strengthen bilateral ties and enhance cooperation. Overall, the monarch added, German-Brunei Darussalam relations are good and harmonious, and the bilateral trade has shown a significant increase since the 1980s.

In his reply, Chancellor Dr. Helmut Kohl, among others, stressed that since diplomatic relations were established in 1984, the two countries have successfully cooperated in a spirit of mutual trust, both bilaterally and in the multilateral context.

He added that the cooperation could be intensified and further developed in many areas. "Therefore," he said, "I very much welcome the conclusion today of an investment promotion and protection treaty. This sets a positive signal for the future."

Speaking on efforts towards strengthening relations between Asia and Europe, the German leader said that the European-Asian Summit Meeting (ASEM) in Bangkok was an important forum on the road to this common goal. The results of this summit and also of the meeting of our foreign ministers in Singapore in February this year were a major step forward.


The Chancellor pointed that a long-term partnership between Europe and Asia based on trust is indispensable.

"We should therefore commit ourselves to an open and comprehensive exchange between the cultures in both regions. In this way we can learn from one another and use the creative power

Monarch continues visits to ministries and government departments



His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has always ensured that his government runs smoothly, effectively and efficiently. This is evidenced by the monarch going on a series of visits to ministries and government departments with the most recent being to the Immigration and Labour De-

partments under the Ministry of Home Affairs.

The visit came six weeks after the ruler took a first hand look at the Ministry of Communications and the six departments under it.

During his latest visit on 28 April, His Majesty was welcomed by the Special Adviser to His Majesty in the Prime Minister's Office and the Home Affairs Minister, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Bakti Diraja Dato Laila Utama Haji Awang Isa.

Dato Paduka Awang Haji Omar, the Permanent Secretary of the Home Affairs Ministry briefed the ruler on the structure of the ministry and its departments. The departments under the ministry comprise the Brunei-Muara District Office, Belait District Office, Tutong District Office and Temburong District Office as well as the municipal boards in the respective districts, and the Departments of Labour, Immigration and National Registration, Prisons, and Fire Services.

After the briefing, His Majesty asked various questions on matters pertaining to the ministry and departments under it, including problems faced by members of the public.

The monarch then went on to view an exhibition on immigration-related offences and laws.

The department, His Majesty heard, among other things, plans to introduce a 'High Security Longlife National Identity Card,' based on the technology that has been widely used in Europe and other Western countries. The card is difficult to forge and will come in a smaller size, similar to credit cards. Also exhibited were forged passports.

His Majesty then took a close look at the Labour Department, a government agency which among others is responsible on matters relating to the entry of foreign workers to the Sultanate. According to the department's statistic, there are more than sixty thousand registered foreign workers in the country, engaged as construction workers, domestic helpers, nurses, teachers and others.

of cultural diversity for the good of mankind," he said.

"The Federal Government has already made clear in its 1993 Concept on Asia that Asia is a focal point of German foreign policy," stressed Chancellor Kohl.

He said in this framework, the strengthening and deepening of a partnership based on dialogue takes on a central importance which must include aspects of securing peace, political and social development, free trade, the environment and culture.

Chancellor Kohl was leading a

more than seventy-member delegation. He was officially welcomed at the Brunei International Airport at the start of the visit on 30 April by His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Foreign Affairs Minister. At the airport he inspected a guard of honour mounted by the Royal Brunei Armed Forces personnel.

The Chancellor's delegation included the Federal Minister of Education, Science, Research and Technology, Dr. Jurgen Ruttgers; the State Minister at the Federal Chancellory, Herr Anton Pfeifer; senior officials and members of the private sectors.

Monarch grants audience to Malaysian Land Forces Commander

During the visit on 29 April, His Majesty heard a welcoming remark by the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Setia Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Abdul Rahman.

Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abdul Rahman spoke on the importance for an urgent creation of competitive industrial and investment environment in the country. He said that this is a priority towards achieving the Sultanate's aspiration to diversify the economy and become less dependent on oil and gas.

Progress towards this end does not only depend on internal factors, but more on external influences such as the global economic condition and competition with other countries in order to attract investment.

The minister added that the enhancement of competition also requires many specialities including promotion drive, international and regional cooperation, provision of basic infrastructure, sectoral specialisation on the industries that are to be developed and supporting administrative services.

The main factor for its effectiveness, however, depended on an adequate manpower resource in terms of numbers and knowledge, in which the ministry is still experiencing some shortages, the minister said.

Policies of MIPR since its formation in 1989

Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abdul Rahman also outlined the policies of the Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources since its formation on 1 January 1989.

These include an open policy to attract direct foreign investment; developing the existing non-oil industries; encouragement of new industries both for home markets and export markets; promotion of food manufacturing and production; and promoting industries based on domestic primary resources.

Strategy towards creating competitive industry and investment

The minister highlighted that all industrial activities need competitiveness. Such a climate is needed by local industry and investment, but more important is direct foreign investment

The German Chancellor was also granted an audience by His Majesty at the Istana Nurul Iman on 1 May, at which the ruler stated that the visit provided an excellent opportunity to strengthen bilateral relations between the two countries and would open up German interest in participating in the Sultanate's development programmes. To this end, both leaders agreed to enhance bilateral cooperation especially in trade and investment.

The two leaders also exchanged views on the latest regional developments in Asia and Europe.

MOU on oil refinery

Brunei Darussalam and the Federal Republic of Germany also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on the proposed project "Fully Catalytic Cracking Export Oil Refinery," involving the Brunei Oil and Gas Authority and the IAB Consortium.

The MOU recorded the understanding reached between the two parties on their carrying out economic feasibility study, the establishment of a fully catalytic refinery with a capacity of 120,000 barrels per day.

The memorandum further provides for the involvement of Bruneians in all stages of the designing and development of the refinery as well as the transfer of German technology-knowhow to Brunei Darussalam.

The export-oriented refinery, when realised, will place Brunei Darussalam on the map as an exporter of value-added petroleum products instead of merely a crude oil exporter.

Signing on behalf of the Brunei Oil and Gas Authority was Dato Paduka Haji Selamat, the Deputy Minister of Finance while Prof. Dr. Jean-Pol G Delhougne and Mr. Franz Vierbucher signed on behalf of IAB Consortium



Changing trends in health and greater life expectancy call for new strategies, says Health Minister

Both developed and developing countries have witnessed improvements in health which have led globally to the increase in the life expectancy of its population for the past several decades, stated Brunei Darusslam's Health Minister, Yang Berhormat Dato Paduka Dr. Haji Johar at the 50th World Health Assembly, held in Geneva for 10 days, beginning 5 May.

However, the longer life expectancy is coupled with rapid "greying" or aging of the population, which together with changing lifestyle, have led to an increase in the incidence of non-communicable diseases,

particulary cardiovascular diseases, cancer and diabetes.

"These chronic conditions in many countries, including Brunei Darussalam are major causes of deaths, ill-health and disability", he told a plenary session of the assembly.

He said developing countries in particular, are now experiencing the 'double burden' of continuing the fight against endemic infectious diseases and the challenges created by noncommunicable deseases and chronic conditions.

These are challenges which require

interdependent action and solidarity not only at local and national levels, but also at regional and international levels, he stressed.

The theme chosen for discussion at the fiftieth assembly "conquering suffering, enriching humanity" was most apt and very timely in view of the suffering and social and economic burden on families and societies presented by these phenomena, he pointed.

Dato Paduka Dr. Awang Haji Johar, who headed the Brunei delegation to the assembly comprising the Deputy Director of Health, Dr. Hajjah Intan, Acting Assistant Director of Medical and Health Services (Public Health), Dr. Hajjah Kalsom and Head of Research, Awang Idris, stressed that the realities of the demographic trends, greater longevity, economic progress and behavioural changes can no longer be ignored, and that efforts to develop and implement more innovative and lasting solutions are needed.

According to the minister, in the Pacific region, national and regional strategies for health are being directed towards the themes: preparation for life, protection for life and quality of life in later years - these being the composition of a vision "New horizons in health" initiated by a senior WHO (World Health Organisation) official.

More Muslim converts get assistance from SHHB Foundation





The Yayasan Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah (Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation) has continued to render assistance to Muslim converts in the country. The latest to benefit from such assistance were converts in the Belait and Tutong districts.

On 3 May, two convert families in Belait district and seven others in Tutong district received the keys to their new houses which had been build under the foundation's housing scheme. His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal

Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam personally handed the keys to the heads of families concerned during a ceremony held at a school in Kampong Merangking in the Belait district interiors.

The latest nine bring to 21 the number of houses built by the foundation for converts - 11 were built earlier for converts in Temburong district and one other in Tutong. The assistance in the form of housing are aimed at helping the converts settle in their new lives as Muslims more comfortably.

During his visits to other villages in both the Belait and Tutong districts the same day, His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam witnessed more residents in the two districts converting to Islam.

The ceremony in Belait district was conducted by the State Mufti in which the head of Mukim Bukit Sawat who is also the headman of Kampong Merangking and his family embraced Islam.

Two other ceremonies took place in Tutong district for a family of three in Kampong Benutan and for a family of ten in Kampong Belabau.

His Majesty witnessed all three ceremonies before ending his visits to the interiors, aimed at taking a first hand look at the development and ensuring the well-being of his subjects therein.

He said these themes recognise that what happens in earlier life has an important influence on health status in old age.

"The multisectoral and multidisciplinary approaches proposed in the document are align appropriately withWHO's priorities for action in having an integrated, coordinated approach to the prevention of these non-communicable diseases and chronic conditions in all the entire life-cycle of an individual".

The minister also called for appropriate strategies to meet the needs of the elderly who now represent a fast-growing section of the population due to longer life expectancy.

Such strategies should include efforts towards improving their health and their life quality, he said.

"This will be achieved through ap-

proaches aimed at promoting healthy lifestyles throughout life, preventing or delaying the occurrance of noncommunicable diseases so as to maximise disability-free and productive lives in older age. They must be helped to maintain their independence and dignity to enable them to continue to play their role as productive members of the community", he went on.

He also spoke on the need to review the mandatory retirement age of working population, saying that with increased longevity to age 75 years and even beyond, 55 years retirement age as being practised by many countries, is still too young for many to retire when they can still make valuable contribution to the socio-economic development of their countries.

He affirmed that as it enters the new millennium, Brunei Darussalam remains firmly committed to Health for All through the primary health care approach.

"We believe the principal themes of New Horizons In Health are in line with this primary health care approach as well as the six priority areas for international action in health to improve humanity's ability to prevent, treat, rehabilitate and where possible, cure major non-communicable diseases, and to reduce the enormous suffering and disability that they cause", he concluded.

A number of imporatant health issues were discussed in the assembly, including proposed budget for the financial year 1998-1999, WHO Reform in relation to renewing the health-forall strategy, and prevention of violence. Reorientation of medical education and medical practice, guidelines on the WHO Certification Scheme on the Quality of Pharmaceutical Products moving in International commerce, reproductive health, Tabacco or Health, HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases, and Control of Tropical diseases were also topics of discussions at the assembly.

Brunei Darussalam Singapore 'open skies' air agreement

Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Singapore have scored a first in the region when they signed an 'open skies' air agreement on 24 May.

The agreement provides for unlimited number of services by airlines designated by the respective country to carry passangers and cargo between the two countries, as well as from destinations prior to or beyond either country.

Signing the agreement at a ceremony held at Singapore's Changi International airport on behalf of the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was the country's Communications Minister, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Amar Pahlawan Dato Seri Sertia Awang Haji Zakaria, while the Republic of Singapore was also represented by its Minister for Communications, His Excellency Mr. Mah Bow Tan.

The two governments hope that the agreement will lead to a further expansion of air services and serve as a catalyst towards the further enhancement of relations between the two countries, which are neighbours in ASEAN.

They also hope it will bring great benefit to businessmen especially, and other users of air travels, through unlimited number of services.

Brunei Darussalam and Slovenia establish diplomatic relations

The Government of His Majesty
The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan
of Brunei Darussalam and the Government of the Republic of Slovenia
have established diplomatic relations,
with effect from 28 April, 1997.

The signing of the Joint Communique took place at the Office of the Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in London.

Signing on behalf of the Government of Brunei Darussalam was His Excellency Pehin Orang Kaya Lela Utama Dato Paduka Awang Haji Jaya bin Abdul Latif, Brunei Darussalam's High Commissioner to Britain, while His Excellency Mr. Matjaz Sinkovec, the Ambassador of the Republic of Slovenia in London signed for his country.









New Brunei envoys appointed and foreign diplomats take up assignments in Bandar Seri Begawan

The Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has appointed the country's new heads of mission overseas, namely to the United Nations Organisation in New York, Myanmar, Cambodia and Laos.

that is greatly needed to speed up industrial development. This would enable the Sultanate to compete with other countries, which also require direct foreign investment.

Towards achieving competitiveness, the ministry has provided an incentive package; infrastructure; transparent law and regulations; faster and more effective processing methods; transparent government policies; and financial assistance to local entrepreneurs.

The setting up of Semaun Holdings Sendirian Berhad as a government corporate body under the MIPR is one of the strategies to speed up the formation of strategic industrial activities involving foreign investment.

The minister also pointed the role played by the private sector as an engine towards a sustainable economic growth. In this regard, the ministry has enhanced the effort to cooperate with the private sector to jointly work together to achieve the country's aspiration in diversifying the economy.

The long-term objective is to turn the private sector into an engine of economic development, while the government acts as controller and facilitator of such development, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abdul Rahman explained.

The minister went on to say that the ministry is responsible in the promotional works to woo foreign and local investment, especially the setting up of joint ventures between local and foreign businessmen. Aside this, it is also responsible for bringing in the expertise in management, technology and wooing the foreign market for exports.

The minister added that enhancing international economic cooperation is a very important strategy because with it comes the technical assistance, foreign investment, increased export opportunities, improved information network, technological flow, human resource development and entrepreneurship progress.

Special emphasis is also given to sectoral development on areas of potential towards creating supportive industries that can significantly contribute towards economic growth. These include tourism, the development of high value-added industries, forestry resources and small industries based on the by-products of such industries as oil and gas.



Express bus services between Brunei Darussalam and several towns in East Malaysia in the pipeline

An express bus service between the Brunei international airport and the Sarawak border town of Miri was scheduled to begin on 21 May, with a view to further facilitate greater mobility of people between Brunei Darussalam and the East Malaysian State.

Announcing this during a meeting between the Permanent Secretary of the Communications Ministry, Dato Paduka Malai Haji Ali and officials of the Land Transportation Department on 15 May, the land Transportation Department Director said the service was being operated under joint-venture between a local Brunei company and a Sarawak firm.

He said the establishment of the service would certainly support Brunei Darussalam's goal of becoming a service centre for trade and tourism. Already more than one million people cross the border at Sungai Tujoh between Kuala Belait in Brunei Darussalam and Miri each year, making it the second busiest point of entry into the Sultanate after the international airport.

The Land Transportation Department Director also disclosed that similar services to other towns in Sarawak as well as to those in Sabah are also being planned.
