National AI-Qu'ran Reading Competition For Adults 1433 Hijrah/2012 Masihi HM: AI-Qur'an as guidance for human perfection

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, May 3 - The Al-Qur'an should not merely be read but its teachings must be followed. Al-Qur'an is a remedy and cure for all diseases.

His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam said in a *titah* (royal speech) at the closing ceremony of the National Al-Qur'an Reading Competition For Adults 1433 Hijrah/2012 Masihi at the International Convention Centre in Berakas.

Also present were His Royal Highness Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee, The Crown Prince and Senior Minister at the Prime Minister's Office, His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah; and His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah.

His Majesty added that Allah will raise the status of Muslims if they truly hold and practice Al-Qur'an. The only way for Muslims to reclaim the past glory of their era is by making Al-Qur'an as their guide and a complete way of life.

From physical development aspect, His Majesty said that the Al-Qur'an does not hinder Muslims from physical development, provided they do not overstep the boundary of the Islamic law. Physical developments in Islam, apart from generating prosperity, also maintaining well-being and impeding any damage or destruction on the face of the earth, consistent with a reminder by Allah in Surah Ar-Rum which states, "Mischief has appeared throughout the land and sea by (reason of) what the hands of people have earned."

In regards of the competition's theme, His Majesty described the theme Al-Qur'an Asas Kesempurnaan Insan' or 'Al-Qur'an Guidance For Human Perfection' as most appropriate. Whoever adheres to its teachings would surely obtain well-being and happiness, while those who do the contrary would surely be disappointed and ruined.

The highlight of the ceremony was the presentation of the

Brunei - Malaysia: Bridge construction works commence

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, June 10 - Construction of a bridge across Sungai Pandaruan, Sarawak, Malaysia to the Temburong District under a joint-venture between Brunei Darussalam and Malaysia costing \$10 million is expected to be completed in August next year.

Hence, a ground-breaking ceremony for the project was held at the site. This marked the beginning of construction works for the bridge.

Brunei Darussalam's representative at the ceremony was Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Communications, Dato Paduka Haji Awang Alaihuddin; while his counterpart was Yang Berbahagia Datuk Himmat Singh, Chief Secretary of Malaysia's Ministry of Public Works.

The project was sealed on September 12, 2011. Construction works on the 189-metre long and 14-metre wide pre-cast

concrete bridge with double two-way lanes will take 15 months to complete.

Brunei Darussalam and Malaysia wish to complete the Sungai Pandaruan bridge construction project before the ASEAN Summit in Bandar Seri Begawan in November next year. Dato Paduka Haji Awang Alaihuddin added that the building of the bridge will become a success symbol of close bilateral cooperation and friendship between the two neighbouring ASEAN countries.

The bridge is vital as 'machine link' for Pan Borneo and the Brunei Darussalam-Indonesia-Malaysia-Philippines East ASEAN Growth Area (BIMP EAGA) where it has been identified as one of the places to have 'machine link' in connecting the BIMP-EAGA and Pan Borneo.








MoU on expansion project of COGEN Energy Plant

LUMUT, May 15 - The expansion project of the Co-Generation (COGEN) Energy Plant at Lumut Power Station is important both strategically and economically for Brunei Darussalam and is part of the country's 9th National Development Plan.

This was disclosed by the Minister of Energy, Pehin Colonel (Rtd.) Dato Dr. Awang Hj Mohammad Yasmin at the signing of Memorandum of Understanding at the Brunei Liquefied Natural Gas (BLNG) in Lumut, Belait District.

The new COGEN Energy Plant will improve the reliability of power supply with overall efficiency of greater than 60 per cent, as compared to the power plant in Bukit Panggal and Gadong with an efficiency of only 45 per cent and 23 per cent respectively.

Signing on behalf of the Department of Energy, Prime Minister's Office was the Permanent Secretary for Downstream and Power, Haji Awang Jamain bin Haji Julaihi; while representing BLNG Sendirian Berhad was its Managing Director, Dato Paduka Awang Haji Matsatejo bin Sokiaw.

This project is expected to be completed in 2014. When completed, it will save natural gas consumption of gas reserve for over 20 years.

OIC 5th Islamic Conference of Environment Ministers

KAZAKHSTAN, May 19 - The 5th Islamic Conference of Environment Ministers from the Organisation of Islamic Conference in Astana, Kazakhstan concluded with the endorsement of Documents on Green Economy, its role and relevance in Islamic countries: Executive Work Plan for the Implementation of the Strategy for Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Islamic Countries, the Islamic Declaration on Sustainable Development within the Framework of the Islamic World's Participation in the Rio+20 Summit, General Framework of the Islamic Agenda for Sustainable Development and Progress Report on Implementation of the Project of Islamic Academy for the Environment and Sustainable Development'.

Representing Brunei Darussalam at the two-day conference was the Minister of Development, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Suyoi and senior officers from the Department of Environment, Parks and Recreation.

The minister in his statement emphasised the need for finding a balance between what is needed in securing the sustenance of environment and natural resources and sustaining the people's quality of life and economic development. The minister also emphasised that each country has its own strength and capability as well as limitations in facing and addressing these challenges. The minister said by putting the action together through collaborative and concerted efforts, such as this forum, countries will be able to build individual strength and experiences in dealing with those challenges.

Closer cooperation in agriculture discussed

BANGKOK, THAILAND, May 23 - Brunei Darussalam and Thailand proposed to promote respective halal food industry. Thailand is good at farm products and *halal* science; while Brunei Darussalam wants to develop a Halal Industry Centre and promote *halal* standard.

The matter was discussed during a meeting between the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources (MIPR), Pehin Dato Awang Haji Yahya and Thailand's Foreign Minister, His Excellency Surapong Tovichakchaikul. The minister is on a sixday official visit to Thailand.

The Thailand Foreign Minister noted that both countries should join forces and Brunei Darussalam could use Thailand as a base of its export-oriented production. His Excellency Surapong also said Thailand could share expertise in agriculture including paddy cultivation, fishery and chicken farming that interests Brunei Darussalam.

The minister said Brunei Darussalam is trying to promote the production of its indigenous rice called 'Laila'. The minister also said Brunei Darussalam wants to learn rice cultivation technology and processed rice products from Thailand,

Brunei Darussalam is the ninth largest Southeast Asian trade partner of Thailand. The value of trade between Thailand and Brunei Darussalam last year was estimated at USD269 million. Thailand exports to Brunei Darussalam include rice, transformers and parts, cement, ceramics, rubber products and paper. While Thailand imports Brunei Darussalam's oil and other products.

Museum's role needs to intensified

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, May 19 -In line with the national vision of 2035 and the Malay Islamic Monarchy concept, museums should be modern, sophisticated and attractive to visitors in addition to their appearance aspects and artistic values.



Brunei Darussalam's Quarterly Gross Domestic Product (Fourth Quarter 2011)

Department of Economic Planning and Development, Prime Minister's Office in their recent media release announced that in the fourth quarter of 2011 (Q4 2011), Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for Brunei Darussalam at current prices was estimated at \$5.5 billion compared to \$5.2 billion in Q3 2011.

In terms of GDP growth at constant prices, Q4 2011 recorded a growth of 1.3 per cent. This was mainly attributed to the growth on Non-Oil and Gas sector by 5.1 per cent. However, the Oil & Gas sector fall by 3.5 per cent.

The Agriculture, Forestry & Forestry sector grew by 15.5 per cent due to the increase in Forestry by 41.7 per cent; production of Livestock and Poultry by 24.7 per cent; Vegetables, Fruits and Other Agriculture 15.8 per cent and Fishery 0.6 per cent.

The Industrial sector fell by 2.6 per cent due the negative growth of Mining sector by 5.1 per cent. Meanwhile the other Industrial sectors increased, with Construction recorded the highest growth of 6.7 per cent, followed by Electricity & Water 1.5 per cent and Manufacturing 0.8 per cent.

The Service sector grew by 5.0 per cent. Trade recorded the highest growth of 9.2 per cent, followed by Private Services 7.9 per cent, Transport & Communication 6.7 per cent, Real Estate & Ownership of Dwellings 5.7 per cent, Government services 3.6 per cent and Finance 1.3 per cent.

By the expenditure approach, GDP at constant process also showed an increase of 1.3 per cent compared to Q4 2010 (year on year). This is due to the Imports of Goods and Services which recorded the highest growth of 17.4 per cent, followed by Personal Consumption Expenditure 8.8 per cent, Government Consumption Expenditure 3.2 per cent and Capital Formation 3.2 per cent. Meanwhile Export of Goods and Services recorded a decrease of 17.5 per cent.

Note: Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is a measure of the total value of goods and services produced in particular period after deducting the cost of goods and services used up in the process of production.

Consumer Price Index (CPI), March 2012

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for March 2012 decreased by 0.3 per cent over February 2012. Meanwhile, the CPI increased by 0.1 per cent in February 2012 over January 2012. This was due to the decreased prices of Transport services particularly maintenance and repair of vehicles; and spare parts and accessories of vehicles.

On the other hand, increases were

recorded in Recreation and Culture due to higher costs of television and radio broadcasting; and Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance as a result of higher costs of furniture and furnishings.

CPI for March 2012 increased by 0.1 per cent compared to March 2011, largely due to the higher index for Recreation and Culture; and Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages. Note: CPI is measure of price changes of goods and services paid by the consumer in a specific period. The list of goods and services in the CPI is based on the average expenditure per household from the Household Expenditure Survey. >> BRUNEI IN BRIEF

- Official name is Negara Brunei Darussalam.
- Capital is Bandar Seri Begawan.
- It is located on the north-west of Borneo Island in Southeast Asia.
- Land size is 5765 sq. km
- Population is estimated at 422,700 people (2012)
- It is divided into four districts Brunei Muara, Tutong, Kuala Belait and Temburong.
- Malay is the official language but English is widely spoken.

>> HOW TO GET TO BRUNEI DARUSSALAM? There are a number of ways to reach Brunei.

- By air Brunei's national carrier, Royal Brunei Airlines travels to more than 20 destinations around the world. The airline also has worldwide office for you to book a return flight to Brunei (to know the nearest RBA's office at your place, please log to: www.bruneiair.com)
- International airlines such as Singapore Airlines, Malaysia Airlines and Thai Airways also fly frequently to Brunei. Beginning July 2006, Air Asia, one of Malaysia's lowest airfare carrier has direct flight from Kuala Lumpur to Brunei.
- Arrival by plane would land you to Brunei International Airport (BWN), the sole airport in the nation.
- For those who enjoy journey by sea, you can reach Brunei by boat or ferry. The main ferry terminal in Brunei is the Serasa Ferry Terminal at Muara. You can catch a ferry from Labuan, Sabah or Lawas and Sundar, both in Sarawak, a state of the neighbouring country, Malaysia. Another option is via a boat from Limbang, Sarawak which will arrive at the jetty around Jalan Residency area in the Capital.
- You would have two options of entry point to Brunei by land transport. You can enter through the Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait District or the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post in Brunei Muara District. The Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait is the entry point for those from Miri, Sarawak and Kalimantan. While the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post is the entrance for those coming from Limbang, Sarawak and Kota Kinabalu, Sabah.
