

DUBAI, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES, March 29 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam attended a bilateral meeting with His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the United Arab Emirates and Ruler of Dubai, which took place at the Dubai Exhibition Centre.

Accompanying His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Mateen.

During the meeting, His Majesty and His Highness Vice President and Prime Minister of UAE discussed enhancing bilateral relations between the two countries, boosting the level of trade, and facilitating cooperation between investors from Brunei and UAE in financial services.

His Majesty thanked the cooperation of all parties, which has managed to break the chain of COVID-19 transmission with the implementation of strict control measures resulting in Brunei Darussalam reaching 'zero' COVID-19 cases and return to normal life, guided by Standard Operating Procedure (SOPs).

However, on August 7, 2021, the first local cases arose, resulting in another wave in the country. Again, control measures were tightened in response to prevent this pandemic from further spreading.

Pandemic Phase to the Early Endemic Minister of Health states that majority of Phase since December 15, 2021, when the National Vaccination Programme reached 80 per cent.

However, the emergence of a new variant, Omicron - which is considered easily transmitted has caused cases to rise daily, causing concern.

However, the information relayed by the

the active cases are of categories 1, 2 and 3 only. Meanwhile, some of those refered to as categories 4 and 5 are fully vaccinated or have other health problems.

Similarly, in death cases amongst COVID-19 patients, some are categorised as deaths due to COVID-19 whereas some are not categorised as deaths due to COVID-19.

In His Maiesty's opinion, there is no need to search for another cause of death as they were also COVID-19 patients.

His Majesty was made to understand that the nation is making efforts to protect citizens and residents through a vaccination programme where 94 per cent have received two-dose of the vaccine while over 56 per cent have received the third-dose or booster, where according to foreign studies, vaccination could reduce the symptoms of COVID-19.

His Majesty stated that the COVID-19 Steering Committee has devised several strategies in ensuring that the outbreak of COVID-19 can be controlled and at the same time enable the citizens and residents to live life in the new norms. can generate income, and secure employment.

Among the strategies include restricting the entry of foreigners and obtaining approval from the Prime Minister's Office for each trip abroad.

His Majesty highlighted that we should not forget that there are two SOPs namely normal and religious, where both should be seen as equally important.

Normal SOPs are based on human discretion while religious SOPs come from the Almighty, the creator of mankind. This matter needs to be seen from the knowledge perspective based on faith.

His Majesty further said, the emergence of the Omicron variant has greatly affected the existing strategies with the increasing cases of infection breaching the four digits, compared to one or two digits earlier but has increased so far to over 4,000 cases and may soon reach the figure of 5,000 if the numbers continue to spike.

His Majesty added there is still information that is not transparent resulting in citizens and residents being afraid of such a situation.

His Majesty also questioned if the method currently used to screen COVID-19 is appropriate.

His Majesty noted that the increasing daily statistics are based on the number of antigen rapid test (ART) kit screening tests conducted privately starting February 18. In foreign countries, positive cases are confirmed through PCR testing and also ART screening conducted professionally.

In this matter, His Majesty also believes that if other countries follow the method used in our country, the average rate of their positive cases will also be much higher. Perhaps this method may be accurate, but the question is whether or not the public understands that the absence of sharing this information has caused comparisons with other countries to the point where some question whether Brunei has failed to address the COVID-19 outbreak

His Majesty believes that from a public health perspective, Brunei has tried its best.

His Majesty also called on the Ministry of Education to be transparent about the drop in school attendance during the Early Endemic Phase.

His Majesty sought clarification from the COVID-19 Steering Committee on the current situation of students.

His Majesty believes that the declining attendance among students was due to parents' concerns who did not want their children to attend school as they believe that there was an outbreak and presence of COVID-19 transmission in schools.

In that regard, His Majesty urged the committee members to take note of this matter.

His Majesty also asked for an explanation

regarding the issue of clusters which, in the first wave since March 2020, the number of new clusters were shared with the public but now in the Early Endemic Phase, it is no longer shared, while the public still needs the information.

His Majesty highlighted that by not sharing this information, the public are at risk of entering the premise of the cluster.

His Majesty questioned what else must we do. Although we have a good vaccination programme, positive cases remain and continue to increase, even with SOP guidelines implemented and followed.

His Majesty went on to say that we are still recording positive cases from the entry of foreigners as well as local cases. It is also important to see and find out the reason for the decreasing and increasing number of cases.

His Majesty added that the nation has never declared a lockdown compared to some countries in the world. Some of those countries have repeatedly taken the stance of first easing restrictions, then re-instating them.

It is a crucial matter that needs to be discussed by this committee, instead of just recording or counting the number of infections.

According to His Majesty, this means that research is vital and once we have obtained results from the research we can then path to the next step.

His Majesty added that they are obliged to always evaluate and carefully consider all aspects without hesitation, adhere to one opinion or one opinion alone, including not hastily imitating or using illogical approaches and beliefs such as taking an open and independent attitude no longer want to care about the infection and then continue to remove or just open these restrictions.

This is an incorrect approach because it likens throwing oneself into destruction, which is forbidden by our religion.

In His Majesty's opinion, in this worrying situation, it is too soon to ease or loosen restrictions by taking a simple stance, reducing monitoring, control and treatment as well as ending the daily announcement on COVID-19 developments in the country.

His Majesty stressed that if there are no announcements made, it is as if we are hiding information from the people regarding the developments of the COVID-19 situation in the country.

If there are no effective alternatives to convey important information on the state of COVID-19 transmission in the country, the daily media conference by the Minister of Health is still the best platform to disseminate information on the daily situation and reduce the impact that may arise from the committee possibly overlooking the direction in which to synchronised efforts on all levels.

His Majesty said that the explanation on why COVID-19 is described as neverending is incomprehensible because according to religion, every disease has a cure and Allah the Almighty cures all diseases.

The statement that COVID-19 will never end shows that it is as if we are superior than Allah the Almighty and we are denying His authority.

Throughout history, various pandemics have occurred, such as the Black Death epidemic in 1340, that once invaded South East Asia to spread to Europe and at the end of the First World War, in 1918 there was an outbreak of the Spanish Flu and others. But all these pandemics ended, thus why do we believe there is no end to COVID-19.

"Similarly, it is often heard that people are determined to fight COVID-19, and some even believe that we humans are capable of winning the war with COVID-19," His Majesty's added.

In this context, His Majesty asks for an

explanation; is such a statement not against faith because according to the logic, the Coronavirus was specifically sent by Allah the Almighty as His army to teach mankind a lesson.

Brunei Darussalam will not lose if it is always careful in all matters, including the use of medicines, and that the vaccination of children aged five to 11 years should be thoroughly studied before implementation.

Touching on the distribution of food rations assistance to those who are in quarantine, His Majesty called for it to be carried out perfectly and smoothly.

It was rumoured that many in quarantine did not receive the rations or had to wait a long time to receive them without knowing what to do since for some cases, the whole household is in quarantine, so no one can go out for food. His Majesty questioned on how the committee handles this.

"In the structuring of the Islamic Da'wah Centre, there is no designated post as a preacher, because of that there is a conflict over who will be assigned to preach or speak to fill the preaching Programme.

His Majesty added that the existing officials regularly pushed each other until some have said, "I have nothing to do with the talk. My position is not that of a speaker or a preacher".

His Majesty went on to say that in this pressing need, the centre instead desperately asks help from religious teachers or mosque officials, or university graduates to preach by providing them with allowances.

If this is continuously practised, His Majesty believed that preaching in the country will not stand out, instead will continue to fade, and wither.

His Majesty also took note that in order to produce local preachers of calibre, MoRA has carried out formal training through seminars, forums, courses, conferences, study tours and has also sent preachers to participate in programmes through the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with MABIMS (Religious Council of Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore) and other countries.

Therefore, His Majesty described that although such a way is basically good, it certainly has not been able to produce preachers of high calibre.

The concept of enlivening staff or officers is indeed a common tendency but adding manpower alone does not necessarily guarantee to ascertain the department's big responsibility if the workforce is not or lacks in quality.

His Majesty also stressed the importance of quality preachers.

"Before adding more to the workforce, the welfare of the existing preachers should be taken care of and empowered with quality," said His Majesty.

"Among the ways in empowering high-quality preachers is by establishing a training scheme to provide the officers with proper guidance to preach effectively," added His Majesty.

"Under this scheme, these potential officers will be planned and encouraged to take a PhD in preaching where among the methodology of the study will include interviewing those identified preachers of calibre either domestically or internationally and share their experiences in delivering effective preaching or any necessary recipes for success in such field.

If candidates pass their PhD with a thesis that is rich in facts and research details, then there is no doubt that the individual will automatically become an expert preacher or will act as a certified mentor to the existing preachers," His Majesty added.

If this happens His Majesty further believes that major changes can be seen in the preachers and to the world of preaching itself, from gloomy to bright and the centre is equipped with qualified workforce to be given opportunities.

His Majesty also took note that the MoRA has applied for the addition of 195 posts for the Da'wah Division alone to realise the needs of dakwah.

Later, His Majesty went to take a closer look at the session of the basic guidance scheme course for Muslim converts at the centre's multipurpose room.

The centre started operating on 8 Rabiulakhir 1405 corresponding to January, 1, 1985 with His Majesty gracing the official opening ceremony on 1 Muharam 1406/September 16, 1985.

Among the centre's main functions include the propagation of Islam, keeping updated on relevant and current issues in the Islamic world, and the publication of religious reading materials apart from frequently running educational Islamic courses and holding Islamic exhibitions.

According to the centre, some 20,030 Muslim converts were registered from 1971 to 2020. Meanwhile, in 2021. statistics show some 175 Muslim converts in Brunei-Muara District, Tutona District recorded some 96 converts while Belait and Temburong Districts recorded 68 and 17 Muslim converts respectively.

COVID-19: Travel Green List reactivated

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 30 - The Travel Green List which was announced previously is now reactivated with the updates and inclusion of several countries namely Australia, Cambodia, People's Republic of China, Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia (air travel only), New Zealand, Republic of Singapore, United Kingdom, United Arab Emirates, and Saudi Arabia.

Travels to and from the aforementioned countries are no longer limited to essential travel only and are now open to non-essential travel commencing early April 2022.

This was stated by Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Seri Kerna Dato Seri Setia (Dr.) Haji Awang Abu Bakar bin Haji Apong, Minister of Home Affairs, at the daily Press Conference on the current situation of the COVID-19 infection in Brunei Darussalam at Al-'Afiah Hall, Ministry of Health.

Foreign nationals travelling from countries under the Travel Green List are not required to obtain Entry Travel Pass approval for inbound travel to Brunei Darussalam.

"However, inbound travel of foreign nationals from the Travel Green List countries who wish to work or visit Brunei Darussalam are still required to apply for employment visa, dependent visa, visit visa (for foreigners who require entry visa), or professional and business visit

visa prior to entering the country, as per existing regulations. In addition, they are also required to adhere to enforced health measures such as the completion of COVID-19 vaccination.

Travellers arriving from Travel Green List countries, are required to adhere to health protocols," said the Minister of Home

The updated Health Protocol firstly is to undergo an RT-PCR Swab Test no more than two days before departing from the country of origin or to undergo a certified ART not more than one day before the departing country of origin.

Secondly, to undergo RT-PCR swab test and ART on the day of arrival in the country and subsequently undergo ART only on the second and third day, whereby test results must be reported through the BruHealth application.

An ART kit with a QR Code for this purpose will be provided upon arrival in the country.

Thirdly, to undergo quarantine upon arrival in the country until a negative RT-PCR swab test result is obtained.

Travellers can undergo quarantine in their respective home residence or hotel accommodation.

Lastly, travellers who have previously been infected by COVID-19 and have

evidence of infection such as a Recovery Certificate, whereby the date is no longer than 90 days, are exempted from the measures mentioned earlier.

They are also exempted from undergoing the RT-PCR swab test upon arrival and are only required to undergo ART on the day of arrival.

70,870 - highest new COVID-19 cases recorded

In 1988, with the addition of the inspection scope of the examination and the narrowing of the laboratory conditions, the laboratory then moved to the Agricultural Research Centre, Kilanas, and was renamed as the Diagnostic Laboratory.

The Diagnostic Laboratory expanded the existing inspection scope such as clinical pathology, turning the lab into a referral centre for livestock health status.

Laboratory was changed to UPMV until now. the needs of importing countries.

UPMV is the only national veterinary laboratory responsible for providing support for the increase of livestock industry production and towards the accreditation of the department as a Competent Veterinary Authority

Several measures have implemented by the department to realise this role, including obtaining ISO/IEC 17025 accreditation, increasing the scope In 1997, the name of the Diagnostic of laboratory testing services, and meeting

Therefore, the department through the budget allocation of the 11th National Development Plan (RKN), with the title of Animal Diseases Research, Analysis and Reference Centre Programme under the Livestock Industry Development Project, has already implemented a project to upgrade the Veterinary Laboratory.

Meanwhile, livestock operators who wish to obtain laboratory inspection and analysing services can obtain more information from the website of the Department of Agriculture and Agri-Food.

The Minister of Health stated that Brunei Darussalam is among the world's highest rates of end-stage kidney disease, where diabetes and hypertension are identified

as the main causes of kidney disease.

The Brunei Dialysis and Transplant Registration for 2020, showed that there were 881 end-stage kidney patients, of which 217 of it are new cases.

"This leads to an increase of 12.1 per cent over the previous year where 138 kidney patients passed away in 2020. We need to continue to understand that when the kidneys fail to function properly, the patients have only two options, either undergoing dialysis treatment or a kidney transplant. If left untreated, it can lead to death.

This year's World Kidney Day Celebration themed, "Bridge the Knowledge Gap to Better Kidney Care" gives the impression that many in the community have low basic awareness, limited health literacy, and lack of readiness to know about chronic kidney disease," said the Minister.

This knowledge gap restricts the fight against kidney disease and increases the incidence of death among patients. The essence of this theme calls on all people of the world to reduce the barriers to gaining knowledge about kidney healthcare and towards better including complex information on kidney disease.

The Minister also agreed that this year's theme is also very relevant and important to the current COVID-19 pandemic.

In general, people with kidney disease have a higher risk of getting worse if they are infected with COVID-19 disease. compared to other patients. This includes those undergoing dialysis treatments and those undergoing a kidney transplant.

"The Ministry of Health through the Department of Renal Services undertakes various efforts and initiatives towards improving the quality of life of kidney patients and those around them with continuing education and the use of patient advocacy, which includes urging kidney patients to get the COVID-19 vaccine earlier during the pandemic, especially for patients undergoing dialysis treatment.

Within two months, more than 70 per cent of the patients have received two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine in November 2021. Prior to that, patients who received two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine were less than 5 per cent. This initiative is to promote and provide specialised vaccination facilities so that it is easy for patients to get the vaccinated and to provide the appropriate type of vaccination for kidney patients," added the Minister.

The Minister went on to say, the department has also increased the amount of peritoneal dialysis treatment (water wash) among kidney patients which is the second-best and easiest treatment for kidney replacement therapy. Treatment through a kidney transplant is the best option but involves many factors that are often difficult to obtain.

"Meanwhile. haemodialvsis (blood) washing) treatment," said the Minister "is the last resort but has its risks. One of the barriers for patients to choose peritoneal dialysis treatment is feeling fear, anxiety, or less confidence in carrying out their treatment at home even though it has been explained, that they will continue to be guided, counselled, trained, and monitored until the patient and family members can do it themselves.

The misinformation they received from non-knowledgeable, or non-professional people is also one of the factors causing them to choose haemodialysis over peritoneal dialysis treatment."

"However, Alhamdulillah, with the continued cooperation of all patients, there has been an increase in 2021, which is a 40.7 per cent increase in Peritoneal Dialysis patients from 2020.

The next initiative is to improve communication access between kidney patients and nurses according to their respective types of treatment. With the introduction of the hotline, patients and nurses of the Renal Services Department can communicate, including outside office hours, every day, if necessary," added the Minister.

The Minister further said this year's World Kidney Day Celebration campaign will focus more on efforts to increase kidney health education and awareness and reduce the high knowledge gap of chronic kidney problems at all levels of kidney

This includes initiatives of providing early awareness through counselling to chronic kidney patients and end-stage renal patients on the treatment options available, namely haemodialysis, peritoneal dialysis, and kidney transplantation; education of kidney patients (including practical advice on diet and lifestyle) to increase the resilience of patients, their caregivers, and their support systems toward achieving meaningful health outcomes and life goals; the integration of chronic kidney problems and the prevention of renal failure into the national non-communicable disease programme for comprehensive kidney disease.

and integrated services, which are important in improving early detection and detection of kidney care at the national level: recognition of the rights of patients and caregivers to be able to assess, understand and use health information related to chronic kidney problems; and to offer information related to chronic kidney problems according to various levels of health literacy.

"Alhamdulillah, we are very fortunate in Brunei Darussalam because health services are accessible to all citizens and residents in this country.

In addition, various treatments and medicines are given for free compared to other countries. However, it is our responsibility to jointly strive to adopt a healthy lifestyle, be physically active, avoid tobacco and follow a healthy and balanced lifestyle with effective medication." said the Minister.

The Ministry will continue to strive in providing excellence in the provision of care that is accessible to all, not only in the aspect of kidney disease but in all aspects of non-communicable diseases.

With the celebration of World Kidney Day, the Minister hopes to see more people who understand kidney disease, especially patients, caregivers, and family members of patients so that all can enjoy a healthy and prosperous life.

In his speech, Yang Berhormat Chief Justice outlined the Courts' key developments and work done in the past In this regard, the Chief Justice expressed

where parties attended remotely from various locations in Brunei and abroad in Canada, India, Malaysia, Singapore, and the United Kingdom.

The Chief Justice reinforced the Judiciary's commitment to ensuring that technology enables safe and effective access to justice and capitalising on the greater use of technology to administer justice efficiently.

The Chief Justice also spoke on the past year's statistics and how it reflects the court's best efforts to cope with the demands arising from pandemic.

The Chief Justice reported that from January to December 2021, the clearance rate for civil suits in the High Court was 64 per cent whereas civil suits in the Magistrates Court had a clearance rate of 70 per cent.

"As for matters in the Intermediate Court,

criminal trials had a clearance rate of 63 per cent whereas commercial and civil matters were cleared at a rate of 65 per cent and 77 per cent respectively, 66 per cent of judgments at all levels of the court were delivered between one to three-month," the Chief Justice added.

On the advancement of mediation in the courts, the Chief Justice highlighted the introduction of Practice Direction No.1 of 2021 on the use of alternative dispute resolution for matters involving family law disputes.

"The Practice Direction which took effect from December 2021, requires that as part of divorce proceedings, couples with at least one child below 18-years of age must undergo mandatory court-annexed mediation. Mediation will better assist families in reducing the emotional burden, time, and cost of resolving their disputes," expressed The Chief Justice with hope.

It was also announced that with effect from January 2022, one Intermediate Court Judge and one Senior Magistrate are now stationed full-time at the Tutong District Court.

According to the Chief Justice, this was part of the court's efforts to provide access to justice across the country, to offer court users and the community in Tutong more convenient access to judicial services, and to ensure cases can also be dealt with more expeditiously.

The Chief Justice's speech was followed by speeches by Yang Berhormat Haji Ahmad bin Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Bakti Diraja Dato Laila Utama Haji Awang Isa, the Attorney General, and Haji Mansur bin Dato Paduka Dr. Haji Latif, the President of the Law Society.

The ASEAN Secretariat briefed the meeting on ASEAN's economic outlook where Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is expected to grow by 2.9 per cent in 2021 and between 5.1 - 5.8 per cent in 2022.

In this regard, the meeting took note that the several ASEAN Member States will soon shift towards the endemic stage with the re-opening of borders.

To this end, the ministers reaffirmed the need for continued close cooperation for supply chain resilience and enhanced cross-sectoral collaboration in areas of digitalisation and sustainability, particularly through regional initiatives undertaken through the ASEAN Comprehensive Recovery Framework (ACRF), Bandar Seri Begawan Roadmap on Digital Transformation of ASEAN (BSBR) and Expansion of the List of Essential Goods under the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on the Implementation of Non-Tariff Measures on Essential Goods under the Hanoi Plan of Action.

The meeting also called for the acceleration of the implementation of the ASEAN Travel Corridor Arrangement

Framework (ATCAF), which can further facilitate the resumption of travel across

The Economic ministers discussed the latest status of ASEAN's Free Trade Agreements (FTA).

Notably, the meeting launched the ASEAN Trade in Goods Agreement (ATIGA) upgrade negotiation, with the objective to promote deeper and wider economic integration in the region, provide a conducive environment for growth and development as well as facilitate trade.

supported the realisation of ASEAN 2025 and Sustainable Development Goals 2030 was also emphasised during the meeting.



Over the course of three weeks, participants examined best practices in combating trafficking in persons, focusing on both slave labour and sex trafficking.

Activities included reviewing United States legislation, visa regulations, and enforcement against and prosecution of traffickers; exploring initiatives to identify, protect, assist, and provide services for trafficking victims; efforts to raise awareness through the media; and local,

national, and international cooperative efforts to combat trafficking in persons.

Participants also discussed strategies to end trafficking, both domestically and internationally, with local, state, federal government agencies, law enforcement officials, educators, non-governmental organisation leaders, and advocacy groups.

Following the completion of the programme, Aminudin Zaki met with U.S. Ambassadordesignate to Brunei Darussalam, Her Excellency Caryn McClelland, to discuss lessons learned from the programme and explore how Brunei can work together with the United States to combat the shared concern of human trafficking. This was later followed by a presentation of certificate of completion.

Her Excellency Caryn McClelland stated that the United States is deeply committed to combating human trafficking and is keen to collaborate with Brunei to ensure that traffickers are caught and fully prosecuted by the law.

"International cooperation is fundamental to cracking down on human trafficking since the traffickers themselves operate across multiple borders," Her Excellency

of Brunei Products project in 2020 in to help local products enter the Japanese collaboration with DARe to assess and develop existing Bruneian-made products for the Japanese market. The project engaged product experts from the Japan Association of International Business Advisors (AIBA) to provide consultancy to 10 local manufacturers over-improving different aspects of their products, which includes branding, packaging, and taste.

The inaugural participation of Brunei businesses in FOODEX is also part of DARe's Market Access initiatives, which aim to provide opportunities for local businesses to access new markets locally and abroad through business matching, tradeshows, and the provision of direct online and offline sales channels.

Market Access also offers training and consultancy programmes that will help businesses improve internal competencies and achieve international standards.

Pengiran Mohd. Azian Pengiran Dato Paduka Haji Maidin, Chargé d'affaires at the Embassy of Brunei Darussalam in Japan said Brunei's participation in FOODEX is part of ongoing joint efforts

"Japanese customers have always been naturally curious to know more about Bruneian products. Our participation in FOODEX is a valuable opportunity as it showcases what we can offer as well as raise awareness about Brunei as a whole," he said.





CPI increases 1.9 per cent in November

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 5, - The overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) in November 2021 has increased by 1.9 per cent year-on-year from 101.5 in November 2020 to 103.4 this year. Both food and non-alcoholic beverages and non-food index have recorded an increase of 2.4 per cent and 1.8 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the goods, as well as services index, have increased by 2.6 per cent and 0.9 per cent, respectively.

On a month-on-month basis, the CPI has increased by 0.3 per cent compared to October 2021. The food and non-alcoholic beverages index has recorded an increase of 0.7 per cent. Meanwhile, the non-food index recorded an increase of 0.1 per cent.

For period-on-period, the CPI for January to November 2021 registered an increase of 1.7 per cent compared to the same period last year.

The CPI in November 2021 has increased by 1.9 per cent compared to the same month in 2020.

Among the major groups which contributed to the increases were the indices for transport (5.3 per cent); food and non-alcoholic beverages (2.4 per cent); and clothing and footwear (7.9 per cent).

Based on the contribution to change, transport has contributed 52.8 per cent to the overall year-on-year increase of the CPI in November 2021. This was followed by food and non-alcoholic beverages (24.4 per cent); and clothing and footwear (16.1 per cent).

Increases were recorded in transport (5.3 per cent) due to increase in prices of motor cars; passenger transport by air of a

few limited scheduled flights as well as maintenance and repairs of vehicles; food and non-alcoholic beverages (2.4 per cent) due to increase in prices of meat; oil and fats as well as vegetables; and clothing and footwear (7.9 per cent) due to increase in prices of clothing materials; garments as well as shoes and other footwear.

Meanwhile, decreases were recorded in housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels (0.2 per cent) due to decrease prices of miscellaneous services relating to the dwelling as well as materials for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling; and recreation and culture (0.0003 per cent) due to decrease prices of stationery and drawing materials; recreational and sporting services as well as recording media.

The CPI in November 2021 has increased by 0.3 per cent over

The indices which contributed to the increases were the indices for food and non-alcoholic beverages (0.7 per cent); transport (0.6 per cent); and miscellaneous goods and services (0.4 per

Based on the contribution to change. food and non-alcoholic beverages have contributed 53.9 per cent to the overall month-on-month increase of the CPI in November 2021. This was followed by transport (47.5 per cent); and miscellaneous goods and services (12.7 per cent).

The increases were recorded in food and non-alcoholic beverages (0.7 per cent) due to an increase in prices of vegetables; fruits as well as meat; transport (0.6 per cent) due to an increase in prices of passenger transport by air; and miscellaneous goods and services (0.4 per cent) due to increase in prices of other services; hairdressing salons and personal grooming establishments as well as other appliances articles and products for personal care.

While the decreases were recorded in restaurants and hotels (0.3 per cent) due to a decrease in prices of restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets, and other eating places: furnishings, household Equipment, and Routine Household Maintenance (0.1 per cent) due to a decrease in major household appliances; small electric household appliances as well as furniture and furnishings; and Health (0.02 per cent) due to decrease prices of therapeutic appliances and equipment.

The indices of communication; recreation culture and education remain unchanged.

The average CPI for the first eleven months (January to November) of 2021 has increased by 1.7 per cent year-on-year compared to the same period in 2020.

Increases were recorded in food and non-alcoholic beverages (2.4 per cent); health (0.9 per cent); transport (6.6 per cent); communication (0.6 per cent); recreation and culture (0.4 per cent); education (0.3 per cent); restaurants and hotels (0.7 per cent); and miscellaneous goods and services (0.2 per cent).

On the other hand, decreases were recorded in clothing and footwear (1.5 per cent); housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels (0.2 per cent); and furnishings, household equipment, and routine household maintenance (1.3 per cent).

For November 2021, the indices for durable goods, semi-durable goods, non-durable goods, and services have increased year-on-year by 6.8, 3.8, 1.2, and 0.9 per cent, respectively.

Figure 1: CPI Year-on-Year Changes, November 2021





Figure 2: CPI Month-on-Month Changes, November 2021



Compared to October 2021, the indices has decreased by 0.03 per cent. for semi-durable goods, non-durable goods, and services have increased year-on-year by 0.03, 0.4, and 0.3 per

cent, respectively.

For the period January to November 2021, the indices of goods and services increased by 2.4 and 0.8 per cent, respectively compared to the same period Meanwhile, the index for durable goods last year.

Total Trade increase 86.1 per cent


BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 7 - In November 2021, Brunei Darussalam's total trade was valued at \$2,351.7 million, an increase by 86.1 per cent from \$1,263.4 million during the same month last year. Meanwhile, for month-to-month changes, total trade for November 2021 increased by 3.7 per cent compared to October 2021.

Referring to the International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) in November 2021, total exports increased by 144.0 per cent year-on-year to \$1,331.4 million compared to \$545.7 million in November 2020. This was mainly due to the increase in mineral fuels exports to \$1,080.9 million (November 2021) from \$405.8 million (November 2020), and chemicals exports to \$217.9 million (November 2021) from \$118.6 million (November 2020).

The increase in mineral fuels exports was largely due to an increase in the value of exports of crude oil, Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG), and petroleum products from the downstream activities. The increase in exports of crude oil was attributed to a significant increase in average price to USD83.91 per barrel (November 2021) from USD41.32 per barrel (November 2020), as well an increase in the volume exported to 67.63 thousand barrels per day (November 2021) from 48.73 thousand barrels per day (November 2020). Furthermore, the increase in the exports of LNG was due to an increase in the average price to USD10.94 per MMBtu (November 2021) from USD6.06 per MMBtu (November 2020), as well as an increase in the volume exported to 769,174 MMBtu/day (November 2021) from 675,165

MMBtu/day (November 2020). Meanwhile, the exports value of petroleum products from downstream activities increased to \$507.6 million (November 2021) from \$175.8 million (November 2020), of which the main commodity was automotive diesel fuels.


In terms of the commodity by section, mineral fuels represent the major contributor to Brunei Darussalam's exports (81.2 per cent), followed by chemicals (16.4 per cent), and machinery and transport equipment (0.8 per cent).

The main exports market in November 2021 was Australia (22.9 per cent) followed by Japan (21.3 per cent) and Singapore (16.6 per cent). The largest export commodity to Australia, Japan, and Singapore was mineral fuels.

For imports, the total value increased to \$1,020.3 million (November 2021) from \$717.7 million (November 2020) mainly due to a significant increase in imports of mineral fuels.


The five main imports by commodity were mineral fuels (68.4 per cent), followed by machinery and transport equipment (11.6 per cent), food (6.2 per cent), chemicals (5.3 per cent), and manufactured goods (4.1 per cent).

By End-Use Category, imports of intermediate goods accounted for 57.9 per cent of the total imports, followed by capital goods (37.9 per cent) and consumption goods (4.2 per cent).

For imports by trading partners, the highest share was from Malaysia (34.3 per cent), followed by Russia (26.7 per cent), and Japan (12.6 per cent), with mineral fuels as the largest import commodity.

According to the mode of transport, in November 2021, the highest share for both exports and imports was transported by sea, which amounted to \$2,246.4

million (95.5 per cent). This was followed by air transport (\$76.1 million or 3.2 per cent) and via land (\$29.2 million or 1.2 per

RSI Q4 2021 performance decreases 8.6 per cent

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 21 - In the fourth quarter (Q4) 2021, the performance of the Retail Sales Index (RSI) in Brunei Darussalam showed a year-on-year decrease of 8.6 per cent with an estimated retail sales value of \$417.1 million.

As for the food & beverages services Index (F&BSI), it has also decreased by 22.9 per cent compared to Q4 2020 with an estimated sales revenue of \$74.2 million.

A press release issued by the Department of Economic Planning and Statistics (DEPS) stated that for retail sales, almost all retail activities have shown a decrease in sales compared to last year driven mainly by the sales of textiles, wearing apparel, and footwear which decreased by 33.3 per cent, followed by sales in petrol station 25.7 per cent; sales of furniture and household equipment 15.7 per cent; sales in Department Store 10.3 per cent; and sales of electrical household appliances and lighting equipment in specialized stores 6.2 per cent.

As for food & beverages services, the decrease in sales compared to the previous year was attributed to the decrease in sales revenue of restaurants by 25.9 per cent, followed by fast-food outlets 16.7 per cent and beverage serving activities 16.2 per cent.

Compared to Q4 2020, the decline in sales of most retail activities and sales of food & beverages services was in line with the

reinstatement of control measures for the most part of Q4 2021 following the second wave of the COVID-19 outbreak such as dine-in prohibition effective until November 18, 2021 and allowed only at 50 per cent capacity starting November 19, 2021 compared to full capacity the year before.

The RSI in Q4 2021, compared to the third quarter (Q3) 2021 has recorded an increase of 7.0 per cent mainly due to an increase in sales of recreational goods by 40.6 per cent, followed by sales of computer and telecommunications equipments 28.5 per cent; sales of watches and jewellery 25.6 per cent; sales of hardware, paints and glass in specialised stores 22.0 per cent; and sales of electrical household appliances and lighting equipments in specialised stores 17.2 per cent.

As for the F&BSI, it has recorded an increase of 0.1 per cent in Q4 2021 compared to Q3 2021 mainly due to the increase in sales revenue of beverage serving activities by 11.5 per cent and restaurants 2.5 per cent.

This was in line with the Transition Phase starting November 19, 2021 where commercial premises including restaurants, cafes, and food courts are permitted at 50 per cent venue capacity.

RSI and F&BSI are preliminary indicators of economic performance for both activities and provide an outlook for consumer spending trends in Brunei Darussalam on a quarterly basis.
