At the Bilateral Meeting with The Right Honourable Prime Minister of New Zealand, His Majesty congratulated the Prime Minister of New Zealand on his appointment, and said that the meeting reaffirmed the important ties between Brunei Darussalam and New Zealand as this year marks the 40th anniversary of diplomatic relations.



MERAGANG, March 1 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam graced the new Az-Zakireen Mosque at the Kampung Meragang National Housing Scheme and performed the Friday Prayer at the new mosque.

The mosque built on an 8.159-acre site was allocated \$4.3 million under the National Development Plan.





Call to practise Islamic values, regulation in governance

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 2 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam made an unscheduled visit to the Religious Teachers University College of Seri Begawan (KUPU SB).

His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Brunei Di-Pertuan of Darussalam attended a lecture by Dr. Nurussa'edah binti Haji Abu Bakar and toured several blocks of the college building, including the Ta'lim Hall, hostels and the library.

His Majesty then delivered a titah (royal speech), stating that KUPU SB has undeniably produced a great number of well-trained and knowledgeable religious teachers. However, to keep to its vision and mission, the institution must always

be on the right track. Therefore, its structure and governance must be looked after, clean, in order and in accordance with the law.

Recalling His Majesty's visit to the institution in 2020, the Monarch noted that several of the institution's weaknesses still remain, particularly in governance and financial management. These weaknesses

cannot be left unheeded, especially not by the KUPU SB Council and management. His Majesty further called for all members of KUPU SB to practice Islamic values and regulation in all matters of governance.

His Majesty also brought to attention issues concerning the institution's auditing, stressing that audit findings should be taken seriously, as it impacts

service quality, trust and the transparency of human resources.

The Monarch then touched on the selection process for contractors to upkeep and renovate the university's premises. Looking at the schedule of rates used by ministries and departments

as reference for comparison, His Majesty questioned the use of the same companies repeatedly despite their higher charges.

This raises speculations, which should be investigated by the university's management. His Majesty thus further questioned the integrity of the officers and staff members involved, highlighting that personnel responsible for financial matters and tendering process must be well-versed with the regulations.

His Majesty also raised the issue of companies being asked to offer services or products as charity or *wakaf* (endowments), which can be seen as extortion with elements of corruption. The Monarch called for an end to the practice as it harms the image of the institution as well as the Government of His Majesty

the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, and warned that action would be taken if it persists.

His Majesty further questioned the purchasing, storage and safekeeping procedures of properties. His Majesty urged for basic rules to be met — even those concerning small matters, such as purchasing office supplies, require the need to ensure their relevancy and usefulness. The Monarch stated that purchases or loans of office supplies should also be recorded for easier tracking, as there have been reports of purchased items being untraceable.

The Monarch then highlighted issues surrounding scholarship guidelines, including the exemption of tuition fees for international students. These guidelines should have gotten the approval of the KUPU SB Council beforehand, in case there are suggestions for improvements.

There have been reports of discussions conducted without the council, and such disorganisation has led to outstanding tuition fees of about over half a million dollars.

His Majesty further inquired about the progress of KUPU SB's plan for a centralised system to manage student affairs, as well as rumours of students suffering from heavy workloads and reports of student allowances in arrears for several months.

Before ending the *titah*, His Majesty emphasised that the level of integrity, ethics and morality of the management and all members of KUPU SB should not be taken lightly as they are important in ensuring honesty, responsibility, dedication and professionalism without allowing room for heinous acts such as theft, corruption, misappropriation and misuse of power.

Accompanying His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was the Monarch's son: His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Mateen.

Prior to the get-together ceremony, His Majesty attended a reception with student representatives and signed a commemorative parchment. At the ceremony, His Majesty delivered a *titah* (royal speech) stating that students abroad are exposed to various challenges, and whoever can face them, shows that they have resilience. With this, the Monarch called for the opportunities to be utilised for self-development, as well as building mind-set and leadership quality. Hence, the students should not be complacent in gaining knowledge to address the challenges of globalisation.

Science and technology greatly influences life, where digital platforms, such as social media, are increasingly becoming decisive sources of knowledge, inspiration, ideas, collaboration and communication. The integration of technology and Artificial Intelligence makes the conveyance and dissemination of information more open, fast and easy. Therefore, His Majesty urged for the responsible use of these platforms, so as to not get caught in digital security issues, such as academic malpractice, spreading of false information and becoming a victim of cybercrime.

Touching on the recent 40th National Day Celebration, His Majesty said that the celebration was a reminder that independence must be filled with responsibility, hard work, undivided loyalty and commitment to defending it, so that independence carries more meaning.

In addition, students are called to embrace the independence by studying hard and cultivating the spirit of patriotism. They should also engage in beneficial activities as a symbol of 'Pemuda Harapan Bangsa dan Pemudi Tiang Negara (Youth are

solidify the partnership with a joint plan of action. His Majesty urged for the relations to continue and noted Brunei's interest to cooperate with Australia on energy transition and health.

His Majesty and the Prime Minister of Australia also exchanged views on a wide range of topics, including bilateral, regional and international issues as well as the situation in Palestine.

A joint statement was issued at the end of the meeting.

Prioritising maritime cooperation, nurturing close friendship

MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA, 6 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam attended the Retreat Session of the ASEAN-Australia Special Summit at the Government House Victoria.

At the session, His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam delivered a titah (royal speech) expressing concern over the intensifying global geo-political uncertainties and evolving challenges affecting the region. The prolonged supply chain disruptions have led to higher food and energy prices. The creation of various Indo-Pacific strategies and minilaterals could further add to existing uncertainties and challenges. In

this regard, His Majesty said that ASEAN has developed the ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific (AOIP) to promote peace and cooperation, based on the principles of openness, inclusivity, and transparency.

His Majesty underscored that the region's continued prosperity is dependent on peace and stability in the surrounding seas and oceans. This is why maritime cooperation is a priority area in the AOIP.

To this end, the Monarch welcomed working together with Australia to enhance maritime domain awareness for the sustainable management of marine resources, conserving biodiversity and ensuring safe and secure sea lanes.

His Majesty further underlined the importance of cooperating with Australia on addressing global climate change to mitigate its impact on people's lives and fulfil the commitments made at the 28th Conference of the Parties, especially towards energy transition.

The Monarch ended the titah by extending appreciation for Australia's continued support through the Climate Change Action Strategy, as well as their commitment to provide assistance to operationalise the ASEAN Centre for Climate Change in Brunei Darussalam, which will facilitate regional coordination and develop strategies to address climate change.

His Majesty also attended the Plenary Session of the ASEAN-Australia Special Summit at the Melbourne Convention, held to celebrate 50 years since Australia became ASEAN's first Dialogue Partner in 1974 with the aim of enhancing ASEAN-Australia cooperation.

The session, which took place at the Melbourne Convention Exhibition Centre, saw welcoming addresses delivered by The Honourable Anthony Albanese, Prime

Minister of Australia; and His Excellency Sonexay Siphandone, Prime Minister of the Lao People's Democratic Republic as the Chair of ASEAN.

His Majesty delivered another titah at the session, highlighting that Brunei and Australia have nurtured a close friendship based on mutual trust and respect since 1974, eventually leading to the establishment of the ASEAN-Australia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership in 2021.

Touching on people-to-people initiatives, His Majesty emphasised that the programmes are fundamental to the close ASEAN-Australia relations and are crucial investments to maintain strong partnership through building lasting linkages and understanding between the people of ASEAN and Australia.

His Majesty expressed appreciation for the scholarships provided to Brunei, as well as Australia's announcement of additional scholarships to commence in 2025.

The Monarch also underscored the importance of economic cooperation to the ASEAN-Australia relationship. ASEAN-Australia-New where the Zealand Free Trade Agreement (FTA) continues to be the most comprehensive, high-quality and modern FTA in the region and has also served as a reference in negotiating the Regional Comprehensive

Economic Partnership to further expand trade and investment in the wider region.

His Majesty then joined other leaders for a luncheon hosted by Her Excellency Professor the Honourable Margaret Gardner AC, the Governor of Victoria at the State Drawing Room, Government House Victoria.







Mitigating, adapting to climate change

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 23 -

This year's World Meteorological Day is celebrated with the theme, 'At the Frontline of Climate Action'. The theme emphasises the World Meteorological Organization members' crucial role in leading efforts to address climate change, by providing the tools and knowledge to support mitigation and adaptation measures for climate change.

Yang Berhormat Pengiran Dato Seri Setia Shamhary bin Pengiran Dato Paduka Haji Mustapha, Minister of Transport and Infocommunications stated the matter in his message for World Meteorological Day 2024.

The Ministry of Transport and Infocommunications (MTIC), through the Brunei Darussalam Meteorological Department (BDMD), has been actively conducting climate science research for Brunei Darussalam.

The studies have shown that our country has experienced an increasing trend in air temperature at a rate of 0.23 degrees Celsius every 10 years, amounting to an average increase of about 1.15 degrees Celsius over the past 50 years. The research also indicates that the trend in rainfall amounts has increased at a rate of 110 millimetres every 10 years. The increasing trends demonstrate that our country is no exception to the effects of

climate change.

In this regard, to contribute to the provision of climate science information for our country, BDMD is a key member of the Adaptation and Resilience Working Group under the Brunei Climate Change Secretariat.

Expressing his support for BDMD's continuous efforts in addressing climate change, Minister of Transport and Infocommunications noted BDMD's long-range climate projections, spanning nearly a century based on international climate models, to support the efforts of the Government of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in planning and formulating policies, as well as managing the risks and opportunities arising from climate change.

Considering the effects of climate change that have altered both the global and local weather patterns, the Minister explained that weather observation and monitoring operations in our country are paramount, and the implementation of BDMD projects under the National Development Plan is aligned with MTIC's goal to ensure weather observation and monitoring to keep abreast with current technological advancements. This will enhance the accuracy of weather forecast, advisories and warnings for the well-being and safety of the people.

The paddy planting involved a study using three rice varieties: AWD101, AWD102 and AWD 103.

Currently, research is actively carried out in both irrigated and non-irrigated sites. The Agriculture and Agrifood Department is teaming up with the Hunan Hybrid Rice Research Centre in China for the study, which normally takes three years before moving on to the next stage.
