

### Healthy lifestyle: Foundation for a brighter future

**BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, 7th April –** On every 7th April, the world, including Brunei Darussalam, celebrates World Health Day. This year's theme, 'Healthy Beginnings, Hopeful Futures', highlighting the importance of maternal and newborn health as a foundation for better future. The focus is on reducing preventable deaths and improving long-term outcomes for women and children.

Yang Berhormat Dato Seri Setia Dr. Awang Haji Mohammad Isham bin Haji Jaafar, Minister of Health emphasised Brunei Darussalam's achievements in maternal health, with a maternal mortality ratio of 15.9 per 100,000 births in 2023, meeting global targets under Sustainable Development Goal 3.1.

Despite progress, rising chronic diseases among young women pose challenges. To address this, Brunei provides comprehensive and free maternal and child healthcare, including vaccinations, nutrition, postnatal care, and home visits. In 2024, the Pertussis vaccine was introduced during pregnancy to protect newborns.

Child health services also remain strong, with over 95 per cent immunisation coverage for children under five, supported by the National Immunisation Expansion Programme, which added the Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine in 2025. The Minister reaffirmed the nation's commitment to evidence-based, accessible healthcare for all.

#### BECS: Towards a safer, better-prepared nation

The visit also includes engagement with stakeholders from the



### **BSI** indicates steady business conditions

**BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, 17<sup>th</sup> April –** The Brunei Darussalam Central Bank's (BSI) for February shows mixed business sentiment, with the Current Business Conditions sub-index at 50, indicating neutral outlook overall. While some businesses benefited from festive sales and new projects, others cited negative factors like a shorter working month, project delays, and post-holiday slowdowns.

The one-month ahead index rose slightly to 50.3, reflecting optimism from expected demand during Ramadan and Hari Raya. Despite some anticipating a slowdown, promotional efforts and new projects are expected to support business performance.

Investment sentiment remained neutral at 50 for February but rose slightly to 50.1 for one and three months ahead, driven by plans for new projects and festive inventory restocking.

Employment sub-index stood at 50.6, reflecting active hiring, especially in medium and large companies across various

sectors. It dipped slightly to 50.3 for March, but hiring is expected to continue.

Cost sub-index remained at 49.8, with lower costs attributed to reduced activity and cost-cutting. A further decrease is anticipated due to reduced operating hours in Ramadan.

By sector - only wholesale and retail trade showed optimism (50.1) due to festive sales. Five sectors, including agriculture, construction, health and education, transport, and other private services, reported pessimism due to weather, low demand, and seasonal effects. The remaining sectors remained neutral.

By business size - micro, medium, and large businesses maintained stable sentiment. Small businesses were more pessimistic, citing fewer working days, weather disruptions, and reduced post-Chinese New Year demand.

#### CPI records 0.5% y-o-y decrease in March 2025

#### BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, 23rd April

- The Consumer Price Index (CPI) in March recorded a decrease of 0.5 per cent compared to March 2024, driven by declines of 0.6 per cent in the food and non-alcoholic beverages index; and 0.5 per cent in the non-food index.


The decrease in the food and non-alcoholic beverages index was mainly contributed by lower meat prices (4.1 per cent), particularly chicken meat, following the implementation of the seasonal maximum price setting.

Additionally, the decrease in fish and seafood prices (3.0 per cent) was caused by a fall in fresh fish prices from supplying countries.

As for the non-food index, the decrease was driven by a decline in transport prices, particularly motor cars and airfares; and recreation and culture, mainly contributed by lower prices of package holidays.

On a month-on-month basis, the CPI in March decreased by 0.5 per cent compared to February. This was driven by a 0.6 per cent decline in the non-food index, while the food and non-alcoholic beverages index recorded an increase of 0.2 per cent.

The decrease in the non-food index was primarily driven by lower prices of clothing and footwear (8.4 per cent); and transport (0.4 per cent). Meanwhile, the increase in the food and non-alcoholic beverages index was mainly contributed by higher prices of vegetables (3.8 per cent); and fruits (1.3 per cent).





#### Total trade for February: \$1,794.2 million

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, 26th April - The total trade for February amounted to \$1,794.2 million, comprising exports valued at \$1,130.0 million and imports at \$664.2 million.

The major contributors to the export value were mineral fuels, accounting for 68.6 per cent; followed by chemicals at 26.0 per cent; and machinery and transport equipment at 3.4 per

The main export markets were the People's Republic of China, accounting for 24.8 per cent; followed by Japan at 22.8 per cent; and Australia at 22.7 per cent, respectively. The largest export commodities to these countries were mineral fuels and

Meanwhile, imports were valued at \$664.2 million. The three main import commodities were mineral fuels, accounting for 70.7 per cent; followed by machinery and transport equipment at 8.8 per cent; and food at 7.7 per cent. The largest import partners were Malaysia, accounting for 39.1 per cent; followed by the United Arab Emirates at 17.1 per cent; and the Independent State of Papua New Guinea at 10.9 per cent. The main import commodities from these trading partners were mineral fuels, food as well as chemicals.

Compared to January, the trade balance in February fell by 9.9 per cent. This was driven by a fall in both exports and imports by 8.1 per cent and 6.8 per cent, respectively.

The imports by end-use category were mainly used as intermediate goods processing, accounting for 62.0 per cent; followed by capital goods for business operations at 34.7 per cent; and consumption goods for household use at 3.3 per cent.
