HM: Brunei, Sarawak have unforgetable historical ties

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah said he hoped that his visit to Sarawak will renew and strengthen the already close and cordial relationship between the peoples of both countries.

His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan was speaking at the banquet given in honour of his four-day official visit to the neighbouring East Malaysian state of Sarawak last month. HM Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah said the close and warm relations between the two countries have been in existence since former days. This is based on the fraternal relationship between the citizens of both countries, besides the unforgetable historical ties.

Although Sarawak is independent within Malaysia, he added, the existing relationship, which was forged several centuries ago, between the two countries continued to remain good and close.

"I hope my visit to Sarawak will renew as well as further strengthen the close and cordial relationship between the people of Brunei Darussalam and the people of Malaysia in Sarawak", said His Majesty.

Touching on the field of development, His Majesty pointed out that Sarawak has been supplying Brunei Darussalam with manpower, and said he is pleased that Sarawak's citizens



As neighbouring countries that share a common border, His Majesty said, there are bound to be problems and sometimes misunderstanding. But His Majesty is confident that with the close family and historical ties as well as honest leadership, the nationals of both countries have a mutual understanding of their position and will endeavour to cooperate to settle quickly in the interests of all whatever problems that may arise, as the proverb says: "A sincere neighbour is better than a relative who is far away."

Soon after his arrival, President Moi was granted by His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Wadaullah an audience at the Istana Nurul Iman.

The presidential delegation included the Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Energy and Finance Minister, and the Deputy Speaker of Parliament.

The President and his delegation were taken on a boat cruise around Kampong Ayer (Water Village), which is part of the capital, Bandar Seri Begawan.

Royal envoy

A representative of the Crown Prince Office of Bahrain, Sheikh Hamad bin Ibrahim Al-Khalifa, arrived on February 26 for a two-day official visit to Brunei Darussalam.

His Majesty, who arrived to a red carpet welcome at the Kuching International Airport on March 9, was greeted by the Yang Di-Pertua Negeri, Tun Datuk Patinggi Haji Ahmad Zaidi Adruce Mohammad Noor, and hid wife; the Chief Minister, Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri Haji Abdul Taib Mahmud and his wife; State Cabinet Ministers and other dignitaries.

After the introduction, His Majesty inspected a guard of honour mounted by 101 members of the Royal Malaysian Armed Forces

On the second day of their visit His Majesty and HRH Pengiran Isteri toured the Damai beach resort at Sentubong some 20 kilometres distant from Kuching. The royal visitors, accompanied by the Chief Minister and his wife, were entertained to a tea party at the resort.

From the resort, His Majesty and Her Royal Highness left for the Forest Museum at Petra Jaya and were received on arrival by the Land Development Minister, Encik Adenan Haji Satem.


In the afternoon His Majesty took part in a regatta, which was held in the Sarawak river and watched by thousands of people who took advantage of the public holiday declared by the Chief Minister for Kuching to mark the royal visit.

On the third day His Majesty and his entourage left for Bintulu for a six-hour stopover, where His Majesty visited the Asean Bintulu Fertilizer Plant at Tanjung Kidurang. Malaysia is the biggest shareholders of the \$737-million project, which can produce 1500 tonnes of urea and a thousand tonnes of ammonia daily.

HRH Pengiran Isteri Hajjah Mariam had a separate programme, which included a flower arrangement and cake-making demonstration at the sport centre of the Bintulu Development Authority.

From there His Majesty and his entourage left for Miri, Sarawak's fourth division, for the last leg of

The Government will continue to give subsidies to those involved in rice cultivation.


Dr Morni bin Haji Othman, the Director of Agriculture, was speaking at the recent Wasan Padi Project's Open Day.

The announcement was made following a call by the Organisation of Islamic Conference to all Moslem countries to ban the book because it blasphemes Islam.

Third and fourth places went to Zulkifli bin Haji Abdul Rahman and Lim Seh Thai respectively.

Prizes were presented by the Culture, Youth and Sports Minister, Pehin Jawatan Luar Pekerma Raja Dato Seri Paduka Haji Awang Hussain.

More than 20 players took part in the tournament organised by the Brunei Darussalam Billiard and Snooker Association.

Last year three players represented Brunei Darussalam at the World Junior Under-21 Snooker Championship held in Thailand.

National Snooker Senior Championship

Zaini Abdul Rahman won the National Snooker Senior Championship when he beat Harunsani Abu Bakar in the final played at the Hassanal Bolkiah National Stadium last month.

He won the tournament on March 3, with four frames to one: 60-25, 40-8, 29-57, 51-25 and 43-20.

In the first two frames, Zaini outmanoeuvred Harunsani but lost the third by 57-29. He recovered and won the last two frames to clinch the title.

Zaini and Harunsani will represent the Sultanate at the 6th Asian Amateur Snooker Championship to be held in New Delhi, India this July.

The tournament, which attracted over 70 players, was organised by the Brunei Darussalam Billiard and Snooker Association (BDBSA), while the venue was jointly sponsored by the Welfare, Youth and Sports Department and the Goldash Snooker House.

The BDBSA was formed in 1986 and its president, Mr Johny Chong, runs a snooker clinic at the Goldash Snooker House in Bandar Seri Begawan, which to date has more than 200 members.


Asia's shooting GP

Brunei Darussalam was among the fourteen countries that took part in the 1989 Clay Target Shooting Grand Prix of Asia in Singapore last month.

The Sultanate's team consisted of five marksmen and was led by His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Bendahara Seri Maharaja Permaisuara Pengiran Muda Haji Sufri Bolkiah. The 12-day trap and skeet championships, which started on March 3, were divided into team and individual events.

The other participating countries were Thailand, China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Kuwait, North Korea, Philippines, Saudi Arabia, South Korea, Singapore and Malaysia.

His Royal Highness, who competed in the trap events, is the first person who has been made honorary life member of the Asia Clay Pigeon Shooting Association, an honour given during the association's fourth general assembly in Bangkok in 1986.



A local fruit called Sentul

S andoricum koetjape, featured here, is a fruit known locally as Sentul.

It is the size of a peach, slightly round and has quite a thick skin, which is dark green when the fruit is unripe and turns yellowish as it matures. The outer flesh, which is edible, encloses seeds covered with sweet-sour pulpy flesh,

segmented like tangerine's.

Sentul belongs to the Meliaceae plant family, grows up to 20 metres in height, has velvety yellowish-green flowers, and has prominently veined, slightly hairy

The flowers bloom for about three months but few develop into

fruits.

The unripe fruit produces milky liquid, which is said to be efficacious for removing warts.

The Sentul genus of the Meliaceae family consists largely of trees with hard scented wood such as mahogany and other important commercial timber.
