Brunei Darussalam – Vietnam relations strong, said their leaders

His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and the President of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, His Excellency Mr Tran Duc Luong both have expressed their satisfaction at the good and friendly relations between the two countries.

The two leaders made the statement following their bilateral meeting on November 12, at Istana Nurul Iman in Bandar Seri Begawan, at the start of a three-day state visit by the Vietnamese head of state to the Sultanate.

During the meeting, His Majesty and His Excellency Mr Tran Duc Luong discussed issues of mutual interest, and exchanged views on regional and international matters. The Vietnamese leader also took the opportunity to extend an invitation for the Brunei monarch to visit Vietnam.

Earlier in the day, His Excellency President Tran Duc Luong was accorded a red-carpet welcome at a ceremony in front of Istana Nurul Iman, where he inspected a guard of honour

His Majesty's surprise visit to schools

His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam recently made a series of surprise visits to various educational institutions in the capital and in Tutong district.

On November 10, His Majesty first visited Duli Pengiran Muda Al-Muhtadee Billah College located at Jalan Pasar Gadong.

The Minister of Education Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abdul Aziz and the Principal of the college Awang Jamal bin Haji Kahar accompanied his Majesty as His Majesty toured the college.

His Majesty visited the classrooms, teachers' and staff room, library, Information Communication Technology Dept, the Principal's and Deputy Principal's offices and the general office of the college.

During the visit, the caring monarch spoke freely with the students and their teachers. He also asked students about the studies at the college, their dress code and discipline in general.

Later His Majesty drove down to

another part of the capital to Chung Hwa School, the only privately run Chinese school in the Brunei-Muara District.

On arrival at the Chung Hwa School His Majesty was greeted by the Chairman of the school Mr Ang Swee Chuan and Principal Madam Kho Guik Lan.

From Chung Hwa School, His Majesty then proceeded to the Kampong Danau in Tutong District. His Majesty arrived there by helicopter and landed at Tanjong Danau. There His Majesty made his first stop at a prawn hatchery -ITQAN Sdn Bhd, a local firm.

His Majesty continued his visit to the Danau and Tumpuan Telisai primary schools. The Danau primary school has 13 teachers while the Tumpuan Telisai primary school has 29 teachers and more than 280 students. His Majesty also visited the Ketua Kampong Hj Abdullah Rashid's residence. Kampong Danau has about 800 residents.



The audiences took place at Istana Nurul Iman in Jalan Tutong on 21 November and at Istana Nurul Izzah in Jerudong on 14 November, respectively.





by men of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces and took the salute. At the Brunei international airport, the President who was accompanied by a 56-member delegation, was met by His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Speaking at a state dinner at Istana Nurul Iman on November 13 in honour of the Vietnamese leader, His Majesty spoke of the special relations between Brunei Darussalam and Vietnam recalling that it was in Brunei Darussalam that Vietnam was admitted as the seventh member of ASEAN (Association of South East Asian Nations) in 1995. Since then, said the ruler, both countries have benefited from exchanges of visit by their respective ministers, senior government officers and members of the business sec-

These have given insights into practical opportunities which can be explored and developed together either on a bilateral basis or by ASEAN as a whole, His Majesty fur-

This possibility is further reaffirmed with the establishment of the Brunei Darussalam-Vietnam Joint Commission of June last year, the ruler added.

In the wake of this commission, His Majesty said he would now like to see developments in the areas of education, tourism, trade and investment between the two ASEAN neighbours.

His Majesty also welcomed the signing of a maritime agreement and a memoran-

dum of understanding and cooperation on tourism, which were signed the previous day between the two countries.

His Majesty urged Vietnam to work together towards reviving the regional economy in the wake of the global recession, while acknowledging that the Vietnamese government, under His Excellency's leadership, possesses the will and determination to overcome such challenges.

The Brunei monarch praised the Vietnamese government for the progress it has made towards

developing the country's economy, which have shown strong signs towards revival following the recent economic crisis hitting the region.

"As was emphasised at last week's ASEAN Summit, ASEAN must overcome many challenges, both domestic and global, if it were to continue to be relevant to the lives of its people", His Majesty asserted. (ASEAN leaders held their seventh summit in Bandar Seri Begawan for two days, on 5 and 6 November).

In the dinner address, the Brunei ruler also underscored the importance of solidarity and commitment among the 10 member countries of ASEAN if the grouping were to meet its goals for its 500 million people.

"For her part, Vietnam has shown its willingness to play its role", said His Majesty.

"As chair of the ASEAN Standing Committee, Brunei Darussalam values such attribute", His Majesty went on to say, while further expressing gratitude for Vietnam's support during the Sultanate's tenure of the ASEAN chair.

For his part, the Vietnamese President also spoke on, among other things, the great potentials that exist for wide-ranging economic cooperation between Brunei Darussalam and Vietnam.

He hoped the existing cooperative and friendly relations would be further strengthened for the mutual benefit of their peoples.



Call to look into and develop business opportunities

Brunei – Japan Friendship Associa tion (BJFA) was urged to look into and develop business opportunities by, among others, seeking relevant partnership in business and forum.

BJFA was also hoped to assist in providing programmes for technology transfer, capable of developing the growth of small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in the country based on the Japanese experience.

Making the call at the official launch of BJFC and of its first art exhibition at a leading hotel in Jerudong on 8 November, the Minister of Culture, Youth and Sports, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Hussain believed that the association would strive to further develop its credibility to meet educational requirements and to extend cultural exchange programmes between Brunei Darussalam and Japan.

He also believed that the association, which among others, aims to promote and upgrade cooperation in cultural, economic, educational, recreational and technical fields between both countries would attract membership of local community and corporate entity.

On the art exhibition participated by both countries, the minister was confident that this would enable both parties to exchange views based on their respective professional experience.

Such interaction, he said, would further upgrade their knowledge and skills in fine arts. The exhibition could also help provide opportunities for cooperation, create awareness and understanding on culture, traditions, belief and values, develop Asian culture and enhance the spirit of mutual respect, cooperation and prosperity among citizens.

The President of BJFC, Dato Awang Haji Hamdillah, meanwhile, reiterated the words of Japanese Premier His Excellency Junichiro Koizumi, who said that Japan wishes to upgrade its long-established bilateral relations with Brunei Darussalam besides its traditional trade of oil and gas.

Beginning with cultural initiative, the association would step further to cover cooperation in fields such as economy, technical and education, he said.

The Brunei-Japan Art Exhibition would become an annual activity of BJFA. A total of 100 art items by Brunei Art Association and Japan's International Arts Academy were displayed.

BJFA was formed in 1998 with full support from the Japanese embassy in Brunei Darussalam and Brunei Liquefied Natural Gas (BLNG) company. Its membership is opened to citizens and residents of the country or foreign community, local corporate, registered international firms and the founder of association with financial contribution to the establishment of BJFA.

Foreign envoys in audience

His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Brunei Darussalam's Minister of Foreign Affairs has granted separate audiences to two foreign envoys, at Balai Penghadapan Bukit Kayangan on 31 October.



His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam attended on November 22 the funeral of the Yang DiPertuan Agong (paramount ruler) of Malaysia, His Majesty Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Al-Haj.

With His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was his eldest brother, His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah.

His Majesty Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Al-Haj of the Malaysian State of Selangor Darul Ehsan and the eleventh to be elected paramount ruler or king under a rotational system among Malaysia's traditional rulers, passed away on November 21, at the age of 75 years.

Prior to the funeral, His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah joined other leaders and people of Malaysia in paying their last respects and offering prayers as the late King lay in state at Istana Negara. He was laid to rest at the royal mausoleum in Klang in his home state.
