His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam said in his *titah* (royal speech) at the official opening of the First Meeting of the Sixth Session of the State Legislative Council at Jalan Kebangsaan.

His Majesty also said that statements or views must be supported and reviewed with facts so that the discussions are focused and not diverted from its purpose.

The meeting will become a channel to convey and debate their views and seen as a way to induce development and progress. This is where the voices will be heard and reached out to the authorities in the government. Everything will be assessed and scrutinised if it is suitable to become the basis for national plans.





NDP 2007 – 2012: \$1.2 billion for housing development

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 17 – An amount of about \$1.2 billion has been allocated under the National Development Plan (NDP) 2007-2012 for developing 10,000 units of houses and land lots at all districts.

The Director of Housing Development, Awang Marzuke bin Haji Mohsin stated the matters in his welcoming remarks at the 'Seminar and Workshop On the Modular Design and Construction for Housing Projects in Negara Brunei Darussalam' at Ministry of Development.

The Landless Indigenous Citizens Housing Scheme (STKRJ) and National Housing Scheme (RPN) are schemes that became government's main focus for providing houses in the country, said Awang Marzuke.

He also touched on several issues related to the development such as delays in completing the project, unsatisfactory quality and increased in costs.

Other than issues on production, other challenges in providing housing are affordability and acceptability hat is developing a house that affordable and suits housing

participants.

Housing Development Department, he said had undertaken several initiatives to overcome the challenges like enhancing the system efficiency and process related to planning and implementation of the project with the usage of suitable method and new technology.

Meanwhile, the Minister of Development, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Abdullah as the guest of honour said that more than 17,550 applicants are in the waiting list; and it is expected to increase to 30,000 in 2012 and 36,000 in 2017; while waiting period is about 17-20 years whereas annual house production are only about 400 houses annually.

The minister also touched on the development costs that incurred about \$150,000 per house excluding land price and these houses are sold at \$40,000 each (terrace house) and \$90,000 (detached house).

He further added there are main issues that have to be faced and overcome which are housing productivity, construction productivity and cost and methodology.

The private sector will gain benefits through the reduction of income tax, besides through Withholding Tax rates which are limited for companies from both countries.

To date, Brunei Darussalam have signed 13 Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreements with United Kingdom, Indonesia, China, Singapore, Vietnam, Oman, Bahrain, Japan, Pakistan, Laos, Kuwait, Malaysia and Hong Kong SAR People's Republic of China.

TB is an airborne disease in which if when one patient with active TB is not treated, it can effect 10 to 15 people annually.

AMCA+3 agree to set up ASEAN+3 Fund

PHILIPPINES, March 27 – The 4th ASEAN Minister Responsible for Culture and Arts (AMCA) Meeting agreed to enhance ASEAN cooperation in areas of culture and arts focusing on human resource development; the protection, preservation and promotion of ASEAN cultural heritage; and, the development of small and medium-sized cultural enterprises.

At the meeting, Brunei Darussalam was represented by Minister of Culture, Youth and Sports, Pehin Dato Dr. Awang Haji Ahmad.

The meeting also endorsed SOMCA Working Group Work Plan which was agreed at the 6th SOMCA Meeting.

Meanwhile, the 4th AMCA+3 Meeting with China, Japan and Korea also agreed to enhance cooperation between ASEAN and three dialogue partners in establishing ASEAN+3 Working Plan and to set up ASEAN Plus Three Fund.

The host country, Philippines also held the 4th ASEAN Festival of Arts in conjunction with the AMCA. At the festival, every countries including Brunei Darussalam performed local art and cultural performances.

The next AMCA and AMCA+3 Meetings are scheduled to be held in 2012 in Singapore.

4th Joint Working Group Meeting between Ministry of Education Brunei Darussalam and Singapore

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 29 – A delegation of nine officers from Singapore's Ministry of Education are in the country to attend the 4th Joint Working Group Meeting between the Ministry of Education of Brunei Darussalam and Singapore from March 29 to 30.

Brunei Darussalam's delegation is led by the Permanent Secretary (Core Education), Datin Paduka Dayang Apsah binti Haji Abdul Majid; while her counterpart is Permanent Secretary of Singapore's Ministry of Education, Madam Tan Ching Yee.

The meeting will discuss current development in educational field besides sharing on preschool education and 21 century challenges. The meeting also aims to further enhance exchanges in educational areas besides strengthening educational exchange and cooperation between both countries.

This year's meeting marked the beginning of exchange programme for technical education students between both nation-states.

Brunei-Thailand strengthen cooperation in health sector

JERUDONG, March 29 – Brunei Darussalam and Thailand bilateral relations particularly in the field of health cooperation has been further strengthened with the signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Brunei's Ministry of Health and Public Health Ministry of Thailand.

Signing on behalf of the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Suyoi while his counterpart was Minister of Public Health's Thailand, His Excellency Jurin Laksanawisit.

Under this MoU, both countries would be able to strengthen cooperation in areas such as human and animal related disease (zoonosis), including infectious disease via food and vector, surveillance, control and prevention of disease, health promotion, basic health care, oral health care and psychiatric and mental health.

Also given attention are health development and management like

services, accreditation and hospital management, drugs/medicines control, medical apparatus and cosmetic items, traditional and contemporary medicines.

It also includes health and medical research including on herbal medicines, capacity development of manpower, patient referral, exchange of health information and also promoting trade and investment opportunity in health care sectors.

The signing ceremony was held at The Empire Hotel & Country Club.

Issues on food security discussed

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 29 – Issues on food security was the main focus of discussion during the bilateral meeting between the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Yahya and Thailand's Minister of Agriculture and Commerce, His Excellency Theera Wongsamut.

The minister, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Yahya was on a five-day working visit to the Kingdom of Thailand which commenced from March 21 to 26.

During the working visit, Thailand as one of the biggest producers of rice in the world, agreed to continue its supply of rice to Brunei Darussalam. Brunei Darussalam has just signed a renewal contract for a three-year and eight months supply of rice from Thailand.

Thailand has also agreed to give assistance to Brunei Darussalam in the area of production, field management and post-harvesting handling. This cooperation is very imperative in ensuring food security through supply and production especially to support Brunei Darussalam's effort for its rice production to reach the target of 20 per cent by 2010 and 60 per cent by the year 2015.

On future economic cooperation, both parties agreed to explore further on how both countries could develop a niche, high quality halal export industry, as this would combine Thailand's high quality food products with Brunei's stringent Halal Certification Standard.

During the working visit, the minister was accompanied by the Permanent

Secretary of MIPR, Hajah Suriyah binti Haji Umar, and senior officers from the ministry.

The minister and entourage visited Charaeon Pokphand Food (CP), one of the biggest food corporations in Thailand. Other places visited were Marketing Organisation for Farmers, Royal Chitralada Project, Community Rice Center, Supatra Land and Nongnooch Garden and Resort in Pattaya.

The group also visited and held discussions with Brusiam Food Alliance Company Limited, joint venture company between Brunei Darussalam and Thailand dealing with the supply of rice to Brunei Darussalam.

Road upgrade ease road congestions

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 30 – An upgrading project involving the widening of roads from Sungai Lampai to nearby areas of Bubungan Dua Belas (House of Twelve Roofs) and Residency Bridge will ease road congestions faced by public travelling via Jalan Residency particularly those commuting from Bandar Seri Begawan to Kota Batu and its nearby areas.

The Upgrading Project of Jalan Residency Phase 1 begun last October, 2009 where it is expected to be completed by end of 2011. The project was under the National Development Plan 2009-2010 and under the planning of Roads Department of Public Works Department (PWD) and costs about \$24.4 million.

Among the scopes of the project are the building of river wall protection, two additional lanes, an organised parking bay, installation of street lights along Jalan Residency, providing safe and comfortable jetty for Kampung Ayer residents and areas for pedestrians.

Earth Hour Campaign reduces power usage

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 31 – The Earth Hour Campaign held on March 27 saw a reduction of power usage to as much as 38.5 megawatt electrical power in Brunei Darussalam.

The matter was revealed by Acting Director of Electrical Services Department, Awang Haji Umar bin Tahir at a media conference on Earth Hour at the department's headquarters in Berakas.

According to the acting director, the amount saved could be compared to electrical power consumption for 34,650 houses used in one hour; or a sum of 1.7 million pieces of energy saving bulbs or five times the highest power usage in Temburong District.

The amount of power usage reduction is a big and unexpected achievement, said Awang Haji Umar. He also urged the public to make energy saving as a habit or culture.

Brunel Darussalam took part in 'Earth Hour' Campaign where the main focus was the Kampung Ayer Cultural and Tourism Gallery. The lights were switched off by 8.30pm on the evening of March 27 for 60 minutes. The campaign also saw participation by other public and private sectors including individuals as a symbol of their commitment towards promoting awareness on climate change issues.

Senior consultant from Australia, Dr. Stanley Fleetwood stated that the workshop aims to assist every individuals and organisations in the country involved with the counting of statistics and research related to areas of tourism.

The workshop is also for making comparison on the new international current data standards which is Accounts.

The workshop is hoped to make practical and successful Tourism Satellite Account working programme and schedule.

Improving the life of disabled people
