BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, February 22 – The Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in its bid to have a future that is not dependent solely on its oil and gas industry, strongly aspires to diversify its economy. Paddy planting in the Wasan Agricultural Development Farm is carried out twice annually and is expected to increase further with the use of the modern and systematic planting method.

The ceremony was held at Cheradi Laila Kenchana, Istana Nurul Iman.





It is for these reasons said His Majesty, that schools, training and higher education centres were established, without neglecting the provision of scholarships to more deserving students as the main investment towards developing human capital.

His Majesty also touched on civil service where it is a machinery and facilitator for the government to map out progress. Even at this point in time, the scope and needs of the public continue to increase, thus, requiring the civil service to provide a broader space, including the provision of policies, and quick and effective implementation. The civil service must identify any weaknesses that may exist and provide a mechanism to overcome the weaknesses. His Majesty further said that delay or failure in implementing government programmes should not occur because it carries high risks that can weakened our competition in attracting foreign investment.



National Pap Smear Registry: Enhance prevention programmes

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, February 5 – A number of measures have been taken by the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam to ensure that the citizen's welfare are well taken care of. One of the latest measures is by introducing National Pap Smear Registry.

The setting up of the National Pap Smear Registry is to enhance prevention and control programmes towards cervical cancer as it is the second most common type of cancer affecting women in Brunei Darussalam. This will be the data base for the Ministry of Health for a more proper record system pap smear tests and related test to women of this country including targeted groups for cervical cancer screening. It will also further improve the effectiveness of the prevention and control measures in an effort to reduce the number of cases and death rate due to cervical cancer. Through the

National Pap Smear Registry, women will be given reminder every three years to undergo tests besides ensuring that cervix cancer cases that have been identified at the early stage would be fully treated and ensure that the individuals would follow advices and undergo treatments.

The matters were disclosed by the Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Adanan at the National Pap Smear Registry opening ceremony in conjunction with World Cancer Day 2011.

The event took place at the Health Promotion Centre.

The minister also said that to further enhance the prevention and control measures, the Ministry of Health is currently preparing and planning to provide vaccine Human Papilloma Virus Vaccine to female students in Year 7 nationwide beginning 2012.

\$11 million for Doppler Weather Surveillance Radar system

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, February 7 - The Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) is currently replacing its Doppler Weather Surveillance Radar (DWSR), a system that detects and monitors the movement of rain and thunderstorm. This high resolution system has the ability to carry out 'Numerical Weather Prediction' which will increase the accuracy of weather forecast and warning issued by Weather Forecast Centre.

The implementation of the new system with a cost of about \$11 million is one of the projects under the National Development Plan 2007-2012.

It is also hoped that the system can be benefited in supporting the effort in facing and handling disasters. This system is expected to be operational in August 2011.

The matters were highlighted during a work visit by the Minister of Communications, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Abdullah to DCA's Meteorological Service Division.

The division also works closely with National Disaster Management Centre (NDMC) and other government agencies in handling rainy season which is currently experienced in Brunei Darussalam.

Deputy Permanent Secretary at Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources, Dayang Hajah Normah Suria Hayati stated the matter in her remarks at the Official Opening of the 8th ASEAN Experts Group on the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (AEG-CITES) Meeting.

The trans-boundary management with our neighbouring countries has given special emphasis under the Brunei HoB project implementation framework to secure our national resources from informal and illegal utilisation.

The Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, she said, has continuously supported the environment and natural resources conservation initiatives.

She added that, under the HoB initiative, Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia and Malaysia have presented to the world communities, commitment to conserve and protect one of the most diverse natural ecosystem on earth and

the largest contiguous tropical rainforest in Southeast Asia.

Brunei Darussalam has affirmed the importance of joint conservation initiatives to ensure the sustainable management of the 220,000 kilometres area of natural ecosystem with the HoB, she said.

We believed the involvement of CITES and this initiatives would benefit our technical capabilities in implementing our ongoing sub-regional collaboration like the HoB initiative and our trans-boundary cooperation with regards to the protection of our natural forests, she said.

The three-day meeting is chaired by Brunei Darussalam and co-organised by the Forestry Department and the Department of Agriculture and Agrifood.

Among the agenda is the latest progression and development on CITES committee meeting tasks that is Standing, Planting and Animal Committee Meeting.

The 8th AEG-CITES is participated by ASEAN membercountries, ASEAN Secretariat, ASEAN Wildlife Enforcement Network Program Coordination Unit (ASEAN WEN PCU) and various intergovernmental organisations and public.

The meeting were also attended by officers from government departments namely; Attorney General's Office, Museum Department, Fishery Department, Royal Brunei Police and Royal Customs and Excise.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX OCTOBER 2010

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) in October 2010 increased marginally compared to September 2010.

Compared with October 2009, the CPI decreased marginally in October 2010.

For the period January - October 2010, the CPI was 0.3 per cent higher with the same period in 2009.

The food and non-alcoholic beverages Index increased marginally over September 2010. On a year-on-year basis, the food and non-alcoholic beverages Index was 1.3 per cent higher in October 2010. On a period-to-period basis, the index increased by 0.8 per cent.

The increase in cost of food and non-alcoholic beverages mainly attributed to the higher costs of fish and seafood (0.3 per cent); oil and fats less (than 0.05 per cent); vegetables (2.1 per cent); sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery (0.4 per cent); and other food products (less than 0.05 per cent).

On the other hand, the non-food index increased marginally over September 2010. Compared with the same month last year, the non-food index was 0.4 per cent lower in October 2010. On a period-toperiod basis, the index increased by 0.1 per cent.

Meanwhile, the increase in the cost of non-food were recorded in clothing and footwear (0.6 per cent) as a result of higher prices of men's, women's and children's shoes; recreation and culture (0.3 per cent) as a result of higher prices of computers and computer accessories, games, toys and hobbies as well as articles for pets; and miscellaneous goods and services (0.3 per cent) due to higher prices of articles for personal hygiene, beauty products, other products for personal care, jewellery and watches.

Based on the contribution to change, clothing and footwear (88.9 per cent) and recreation and culture (66.4 per cent) were the main contributors to the increase in the overall index.

for year-on-year changes showed that CPI in October 2010 decreased marginally.

The cost of food and non-alcoholic beverages rose by 1.3 per cent compared to the same month last year. This was attributed to the increased process of fish and seafood (0.1 per cent); milk, dairy products and egg (1.9 per cent); fruits (5.9 per cent); vegetables (10.9 per cent) sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery (0.5 per cent); other food products (2.7 per cent); and coffee, tea and cocoa (3.8 per cent).

The non-food cost went down by 0.4 per cent compared to the same month last year. Decreases were recorded in clothing and footwear (0.1 per cent); milk, dairy products and eggs (1.9 per cent); fruits (5.9 per cent); vegetables (10.9 per cent); sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery (0.5 per cent); other food products (2.7 per cent); and coffee, tea and cocoa (3.8 per cent).


The non-food cost fell by 0.4 per cent compared to the same month last year. Decreases were recorded in clothing and footwear (0.1 per cent) due to lower prices of women's shoes; furnishing, household equipment and routine household maintenance (0.6 per cent) on account of lower prices of bedroom and other furniture, carpets and other floor coverings, major and small electric household appliances, cleaning and maintenance products, other non-durable household goods and household services; transport (1.2 per cent) due to cheaper costs of spare parts and accessories of vehicles, maintenance and repair of vehicles as well as passenger transport by air; and recreation and culture (3.1 per cent) due to decreased prices of audio-visual and sound equipment, unrecorded and pre-recorded recording media, games, toys, hobbies, balls, sporting equipment and sports footwear, equipment for camping and open-air recreation, articles for pets and sports footwear, television and radio broadcasting, magazines and periodicals, stationery and drawing materials as well as package holidays.

Based on contribution to change, transport (848.0 per cent); and recreation and culture (698.8 per cent) were the main contributors to overall decrease.

Meanwhile, the period-on-period changes (January - October 2010 compared with January - October 2009) the CPI for January - October 2010 rose by 0.3 per cent compared with the same period of previous year. Increases were recorded in food and non-alcoholic beverages (0.8 per cent); tobacco (0.1 per cent); housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (0.1 per cent); health (1.8 per cent); transport (0.4 per cent); education (0.2 per cent); restaurants and hotels (0.8 per cent); and miscellaneous goods and services (0.5 per cent).

Brunei Cambridge Exam results show improvement

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, February 5 -The Brunei Cambridge GCE October/ November 2010 results for the Ordinary and Advanced Level showed an improvement compare to those in 2009.

The results for Brunei Cambridge GCE 'A' Level showed an increase of 1.28 per cent where 2,951 candidates sat for the October/ November 2010 examination and 2,402 or 81.40 per cent passed with at least 1'A' Level. Overall percentage of candidates getting at least 2'A' Level are 63.57 per cent. The result also showed 77 candidates or 2.61 per cent obtained 4'A' Level and this achievement increased by 0.40 per cent compared to 2009.

Meanwhile, the results for Brunei Cambridge GCE 'AS' Level also showed an improvement compare to the results in 2009. From 1,507 candidates, 1,226 or 81.35 per cent obtained at least 1'AS' Level; this showed an increase of 2.44 per cent compared to last year. Overall results showed 95 candidates or 6.30 per cent have grade A in at least two subjects; this achievement improvement by 0.92 per cent compared to 2009.

The results for the Brunei Cambridge GCE 'O' Level October/ November 2010 showed that from 7,781 candidates, 4,078 (52.41 per cent) obtained at least 3'0' Level. For this year, 988 candidates or 12.70 per cent obtained eight to 11'0' Level. Based on the 3'0' Level achievement, six schools had obtained results more than 90 per cent pass and these included two schools which achieved 100 per cent pass.

>> HOW TO GET TO BRUNEI DARUSSALAM?

There are a number of ways to reach Brunei.

- By air Brunei's national carrier, Royal Brunei Airlines travels to more than 20 destinations around the world. The airline also has worldwide office for you to book a return flight to Brunei (to know the nearest RBA's office at your place, please log to: www.brunelair.com)
- International airlines such as Singapore Airlines, Malaysia Airlines and Thai Airways also fly frequently to Brunei. Beginning July 2006, Air Asia, one of Malaysia's lowest airfare carrier has direct flight from Kuala Lumpur to Brunei.
- Arrival by plane would land you to Brunei International Airport (BWN), the sole airport in the nation.
- For those who enjoy journey by sea, you can reach Brunei by boat or ferry. The main ferry terminal in Brunei is the Serasa Ferry Terminal at Muara. You can catch a ferry from Labuan, Sabah or Lawas and Sundar, both in Sarawak, a state of the neighbouring country, Malaysia. Another option is via a boat from Limbang, Sarawak which will arrive at the jetty around Jalan Residency area in the Capital.
- You would have two options of entry point to Brunei by land transport. You can enter through the Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait District or the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post in Brunei Muara District. The Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait is the entry point for those from Miri, Sarawak. While the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post is the entrance for those coming from Limbang, Sarawak; Kota Kinabalu; and Kalimantan.
