

Development for the people by the people

The slogan-slinging style of celebrations has arrived in Brunei Darussalam. The one chosen for the just-celebrated second anniversary of national day has a more solid core than ones usually thought up for such celebrations.

'National development - our joint responsibility' the theme of the celebrations exhorts the people of Brunei Darussalam to discard long-resident mental straitjackets for a refreshed look at development. The outdated and murky manipulated attitude was that development was the business of bureaucracy. It was seen as 'something they do for or to us' and all that the rakyat (people) needed to do was to innertly albeit not always gratefully soak it up.

Independence has flushed out this thinking and what better time than when a vibrant, young and educated generation has become noticeable that the people have been invited to decide where, why and how they and this land of their birth is going.

The Fifth National Development Plan already has touches of this pace and style.

The government through its channels met the rakyat at grassroot level through formal and informal dialogues sounding it out on its needs and aspirations. These were then taken into consideration when formulating the plan.

It would be a source of joy and an indicator of concern should more young people come forth at such open meetings to express their legitimate views and thereby lean their weight on the rudder steering Brunei Darussalam's development.

National Day colour

Brunei Darussalam celebrated the second anniversary of its national day on February 23, 1986 with a pageant of colour and a display of loyalty to the Sultan and country.

His Majesty Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan Negara Brunei Darussalam arrived to specially constructed dais in the centre of Bandar Seri Begawan beside the Brunei River. Across the river, stands Kampong Ayer, the famed and much romanticized water village, the cradle of the nation.

His Majesty took the salute at a grand parade of nearly 12,000 of his subjects representing the armed forces, uniformed bodies, civil servants, trade associations, school children and social groups.

Also taking part in the parade were vehicles from various government departments, the most interesting of which were displays of military power on wheels.

Roads leading the centre of the city were sealed off turning Bandar Seri Begawan into a kingsized pedestrian mall which was dressed with ceremonial arches, festoons of coloured lights and other decorations that added to carnival-style atmosphere.

For those who could not get near enough to see the various presentations before the royal dais some 50 television monitors were set up all over the city to carry the proceedings which were also telecast 'live' by Radio Television Brunei. A number of foreign journalists were also covering the event for media in Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore and Finland.

A 1000-strong choir of school children accompanied by the Royal Brunei Armed Forces band under the baton of Captain Manap bin Haji Kamis sang patriotic songs.

Among those who attended the parade were His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Perdana Wazir Sahibul Himmah Wal-Waqar Pengiran Muda Mohamed Bolkiah, the Foreign Affairs Minister, His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Digadong





ject a joint-venture involving His Majesty's government' began.

He described the centre as a symbol of his company's commitment to development. Mr Y. Mimura also thanked the Education Department for their cooperation in the project.

His Excellency Mr Tomoya Kawamura, the Japanese Ambassador said that his country wanted to associate itself with Brunei Darussalam's efforts to strengthen the country's skilled manpower base.

Mr Kawamura thanked the government for 'well thought out guidance and numerous forms of material support' in connection with the setting-up of the centre.

The centre, sited in Kampong Tungku some 14 kilometres out of Bandar Seri Begawan, is fully equiped to train young Bruneians, as well as those already working, in the service and repair of heavy construction equipment like bulldozers, graders, compactors and so on.


Mr N. Matsuda, Mitsubishi Corporation's General Manager in Brunei Darussalam said that his company was for a long time seeking to do something for the country's young people. The centre was decided on, after the discussions with the government.

'The centre', he said, 'could become a source for much needed equipment servicing personnel in the construction industry in this country'.

Japan's International Cooperation Agency (JICA) has sent three experts while two Bruneians have been trained in Japan to run the centre.

The Mitsubishi Corporation is involved in the liquefied natural gas industry in Brunei Darussalam and also runs a highly successful trial beef cattle ranch

H is Majesty Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan Negara Brunei Darussalam has said that the development of Islam will be given special attention in national development plans.

Speaking on February 28, 1986, at the opening of a mosque in Sengkurong, 15 kilometres from Bandar Seri Begawan. His Majesty urged muslims to be cautious against those who claim to bring new teachings or attempt other disruptions to the muslim community.

He later named the mosque, costing about \$3.7 million, after Sultan Sharif Ali, the third sultan of Brunei Darussalam who was believed to have done much for the spread of Islam in the country.

The 1.6 hectare site for the mosque was donated by Pehin Orang Kaya Digadong Seri Diraja Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Mohd Noor bin Pehin Orang Kaya Laksamana Haji Abdul Razak.

Among those who were at the opening ceremony were Kebawah Duli (Yang Maha Mulia) Maulana Paduka Seri Begawan Sultan General Sir Muda Omar Ali Saifuddien Saadul Khairi Waddien, the Defence Minister, His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Perdana Wazir Sahibul Himmah Wal-Waqar Pengiran Muda Mohamed Bolkiah, the Foreign Affairs Minister, His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Bendahara Seri Maharaja Permaisuara Pengiran Muda Haji Sufri Bolkiah, His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Di-Gadong Sahibul Mal Pengiran Muda Jefri Bolkiah, Culture, Youth and Sports cum Deputy Finance Minister, senior government officers and villagers who later joined the royalty for Friday prayers at the newlyopened mosque.

New Mosque named after third Sultan

Sultan Sharif Ali, after whom the mosque in Sengkurong is named, was Brunei Darussalam's third ruler, who in the early 15th century, spread the teachings of Islam in the country while it was still under the strong influence of hinduism.

The initial spread of Islam was limited but the work of Sultan Sharif Ali was instrumental in making the faith widely accepted until it become as the official religion of state.

Historical records show that Sultan Sharif Ali was the first Brunei Darussalam ruler to build mosques in the country He was described as the 'Blessed ruler'.

He married the daughter of the then reigning Sultan Ahmad. His popularity led him to succeed Sultan Ahmad to the throne. H is Majesty Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan Negara Brunei Darussalam last month visited Mukim (district) Seria, the seat of the country's oil and gas industry.

At a meeting with representatives of the 23,000 people in the *mukim*, His Majesty said that he wanted to have a first hand look at the lives of his people and to hear of difficulties which his government could rectify.

Representatives of the people in Seria spoke at the audience with His Majesty. They pledged their loyalty to His Majesty's government while Malay businessmen in the area thanked his Majesty for the government's concern in nuturing the growth of malay businesses.

A representative of the expatriate community which is largely involved in oilfield-related activities said that it was committed to making a positive contribution to the nation through the transfer of skills and technical know-how to Bruneians. He thanked His Majesty for the opportunities given to expatriates to work in Brunei Darussalam and assured the government that foreigners working in Seria would be loyal and committed to the government's objectives.

The 56 year-old graduate of Cairo University has also served his country in Bonn, Copenhagen and Budapest.


On the same day Belgium's ambassador to Singapore, His Excellency Mr Carlos De Wever also presented his credentials at the Nurul Iman palace.

Capital 'phone numbers change


The changes are in conjunction with the installation of NEAX 61 digital equipment at the exchange. This has enlarged its capcaity by 5000 lines.

A Telecoms Department spokesman said that the new numbers would be incorporated in the 1986 edition of the telephone directory which is expected to be issued by the middle of this year.



ASEAN through the 'eye gate'

S culptors from ASEAN countries will have their works put on permanent public display at an ASEAN Square to be opened shortly.

The ASEAN Square is sited some five kilometres out of Bandar Seri Begawan.

Six sculptors, Marsidi bin Akip (Brunei Darussalam), Husna (Indonesia), Latiff Mohiddin (Malaysia), Eduardo Castrillo (Phillipines), Micheal Ong Chu Kheng (Singapore) and Saravuth-Daungjumpa (Thailand) who were selected by their respective countries, spent some 45 days producing works, each in their distinctive style around the theme 'Harmony in Diversity'.

During their time in Brunei Darussalam, the artists also gave public lectures on their subject discussing latest trends in their respective countries.

Brunei Darussalam's is the fourth ASEAN Square to be built, Since 1981 the ASEAN Committee on Culture and Information (COCI) has funded the building of similar public squares decorated with outdoor sculputures in Singapore, Bangkok and Jakarta.

A COCI spokesman said that ASEAN Squares built in each country were to promote a sense of community among ASEAN artists, to give them a chance to have their work displayed outside their own countries and to create visible symbols of ASEAN.

Let us now use the word damit in a sentence:


Brunei Darussalam is a small nation which is peaceful and prosperous.

Squashed they were


Brunei Darussalam took the overall champion's trophy at the first ever Borneo Squash Championships held in Bandar Seri Begawan from February 13-16, 1986.

The ancient tradition which has its roots in the days when agriculture did not demand the kind of technical attention it does now. The gods were thanked for the harvest.

Today the kedayan are muslim, the event has become a one in which the whole village makes an excuse to down tools and have fun. A sosial event that simply reminds the whole village that it is still one big family.

Food for the feast which accompanies the festivities is given by

the villagers. It used to run over three days with the climax on the third day when guests are invited from the next village.

The special item on the menu is the 'kelupis' a kind of rice croquette wrapped in leaves and steamed. The kelupis is eaten without accompaniment or with curries or sambal (chutneys).
