### HIS MAJESTY URGES CIVIL SERVANTS TO STRENGTHEN LEADERSHIP SKILLS

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, November 24 – His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam said that as the government's backbone, civil servants play a major role in streamlining the country's administration.

In a *titah* (royal speech) delivered in conjunction with the 22<sup>nd</sup> Civil Service Day at the International Convention Centre, His Majesty called for strengthened leadership in the civil service, which is a key factor in fulfilling their roles.

Leadership is vital apart from having skills, His Majesty stated.

A quality leader does not only need to have a clear vision and direction, but also the diligence and earnestness in making improvements or necessary reforms, His Majesty said

Such leader is willing to monitor issues that need to be handled and improved, which is an attribute of a good leader or officer.

The success of leaders or officers can be measured by the way they handle tasks and guide their subordinates. This is important, to ensure that all planning goals are effectively achieved, His Majesty said.

Touching upon economic activity, His Majesty stressed that civil servants must better understand the needs of the public, especially those of entrepreneurs and investors, as they expect the best service and fast leadership.

If they fail to deliver, this means a failure on the government's part, His Majesty added.

His Majesty also said that civil servants must possess a culture that embraces change, which is the key to becoming a pro-business country.

If such culture is not adopted, government agencies will not be able to streamline their respective duties effectively.

The world today is in the midst of an economic turmoil. This is the time for all civil servants to adopt prudent measures, in addition to enhancing their commitment and efforts towards developing the country for the present and future generations, His Majesty said.

Touching upon the aspect of policy implementation, His Majesty emphasised that government ministries need to be more proactive by enhancing their coordination through

a whole-of-nation approach at every level.

Intensive monitoring is also required to establish complete and accurate information, data and statistics. All agencies must therefore enhance their capacities in collecting and analysing the information, His Majesty added.

His Majesty also touched upon the importance of performance and productivity in the civil service, which are measured by an appraisal system based on work achievements.

In this regard, His Majesty welcomed the efforts by the Prime Minister's Office and Public Service Department in implementing a new appraisal system.

The new system is hoped to help change the government employees' mindset to become more competitive, thus improving their productivity.

His Majesty then expressed hope that the new system would be implemented as soon as possible.

Earlier, His Majesty cited the recent World Bank's Report on the Ease of Doing Business in Brunei Darussalam. His Majesty highlighted the country's ranking improved to 84 from 105 in the previous year and congratulated the concerned parties that worked hard to improve its position.

### REPUBLIC OF INDIA ACTIVELY CONTRIBUTES TO AND SUPPORTS ASEAN

**MALAYSIA**, November 21 – The Republic of India is a natural partner of ASEAN, with a history of cultural and trade links that dated back more than a millennium.

Trade relations between ASEAN and the Republic of India continues to flourish, with the Republic of India playing an active role in providing valuable contributions in support of ASEAN.

His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam stated this in a *titah* (royal speech) at the 13<sup>th</sup> ASEAN-India Summit at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre.

His Majesty said economic relations of ASEAN and the Republic of India had achieved another milestone with the entry into force of the ASEAN-India Trade in Services and Investment Agreements.

Both sides should therefore maintain the current momentum with the early review of the Trade in Goods Agreement to ensure its continued relevance to businesses, His Majesty added.

His Majesty further stated that the agreements would further strengthen and facilitate trade and investment between ASEAN and the Republic of India and would help to achieve their trade target of USD100 billion.

The agreements would also give them further momentum to expedite their work on the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP), His Majesty added.

In the *titah*, His Majesty said the recently adopted Plan of Action took into account the importance of connectivity in the present globalised world.

In this regard, ASEAN appreciated the Republic of India's support through its contribution on the Republic of India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway Project.

His Majesty expressed hope that the geographical proximity between ASEAN and Republic of India would be further developed, particularly through maritime and air linkages.

ASEAN and the Republic of India, His Majesty stated, also have greater potential for cooperation, especially in the areas of disaster management and climate change, as both of their regions are prone to natural disasters.

Leaders should therefore work closely on improving the capability and preparedness on disaster management, His Majesty added.

His Majesty also expressed appreciation on the Republic of India's support for the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for

Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management (AHA Centre), and encouraged more sharing of knowledge and experience to ensure the well-being and safety of the people of ASEAN and the Republic of India.

# ASEAN-REPUBLIC OF KOREA FREE TRADE AGREEMENT TO CREATE MORE BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES

**MALAYSIA**, November 22 – The increase in economic cooperation between ASEAN and the Republic of Korea to achieve a bilateral trade target of USD200 billion by 2020 is one of the matters highlighted by His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in a *titah* (royal speech) at the 17th ASEAN-Republic of Korea Summit held at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre.

In this regard, His Majesty welcomed the progress in enhancing and utilising the ASEAN-Republic of Korea Free Trade Agreement to create more business opportunities.

His Majesty also looks forward to the continued

commitment by the Republic of Korea in increasing the involvement between business communities through the ASEAN-Korea Centre.

In the *titah*, His Majesty highlighted that increased cooperation in areas such as the performing arts and cultural heritage has helped to develop partnerships in the creative industries, education and tourism.

The Republic of Korea's contribution towards the increasing number of cultural and people-to-people exchanges is commended and His Majesty expressed confidence that it would give the opportunity to develop deeper understanding.

# APEC NEEDS TO IMPROVE GLOBAL ECONOMIC RESILIENCE, SAYS HIS MAJESTY

MANILA, November 19 – His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam attended the First Retreat Session of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Economic Leaders' Meeting (AELM) 2015 at the Philippines International Convention Centre in Manila.

In a *titah* (royal speech) delivered at the session, His Majesty stated that as the global economy continues to recover at an uneven pace, APEC needs to strengthen cooperation to enhance the resilience of the world economy.

Strong economic progress broadens opportunities for people, improves living standards and leads to inclusive growth, His Majesty said.

His Majesty was pleased to support the APEC Strategy for Strengthening Quality Growth that will serve as a strategic guide for APEC to strengthen quality growth individually and collectively.

His Majesty then called for a structural reform that will help improve the way government works and increase the competitiveness of economies. In this regard, His Majesty welcomed the exchange of best practices and targeted capacity building.

His Majesty also welcomed the outcomes of the APEC Finance Ministers' Meeting that will further contribute to the region's growth. The growth will help reduce inequalities among people, create employment and provide better prospects to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), His Majesty said.

The 'Boracay Action Agenda to Globalise MSMEs' and the 'APEC Services Cooperation Framework' are practical means in helping small companies to have access to finance, contribute to the global value chains and benefit from the Regional Trading Agreements (RTAs) and Free Trade Agreements (FTAs), His Majesty added.

His Majesty believes that the regional arrangements in the region including the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership and the Pacific Alliance, will be good pathways towards realising the Free Trade Area of the Asia-Pacific.

It is vital that the Free Trade Area of the Asia-Pacific is of high quality, fully utilised and takes into account of how the global value chains operates, His Majesty said. His Majesty is also looking forward to the final report next year.

His Majesty also lauded APEC's support in promoting regional growth, especially the APEC 2012 List of Environmental Goods in which Brunei Darussalam has fully implemented.

His Majesty further expressed support for the 'Standalone Statement on World Trade Organisation (WTO)' and reaffirmed the pledge against all forms of protectionism until the end of 2018.



His Majesty then commended APEC for providing leadership in the ongoing work of the WTO and to contribute towards the achievement and meaningful outcomes of the 10th Ministerial Conference in Nairobi.

Following the first retreat session, His Majesty attended a luncheon at the Summit Hall, Philippines International Convention Centre together with other APEC Economic Leaders.

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, November 24 - Improving maternal, neonatal and child health should be one of the highest priorities on the ASEAN development agenda.

Director-General of Health Services, Pengiran Dr Haji Mohd Khalifah bin Pengiran Haji Ismail said this in a speech at the opening ceremony of the fourth meeting of the ASEAN Task Force on Maternal and Child Health (ATFMCH) at the Kiulap Plaza Hotel.

He further stated that significant achievements of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) targets have been made worldwide.

Under the MDG 5 (improving maternal health), South and East Asia have made the most progress in reducing mortality at 64 per cent and 57 per cent.

Similarly, for MDG 4 (reducing child mortality), there has been a decrease of more than 50 per cent globally and 62 per cent in the Southeast Asia.

The approach on maternal and child health, he said, is

a significant initiative in supporting the ASEAN Strategic Framework on Health Development 2010-2015.

The ASEAN Task Force on Maternal and Child Health was therefore established in 2011 to achieve the MDG 4 and 5.

The three-day meeting will focus on the maternal and child health, especially for getting treatment as well as adequate and affordable health services in promoting healthy lifestyles for all ASEAN citizens.

It will also discuss the pending matters from the previous ATFMCH meeting and to submit and review the strategies in the Policy Paper of Post-2015 Maternal Neonatal Child Health ASEAN Advocacy Tools.

The meeting will be attended by representatives from ASEAN member states, ASEAN Secretariat, World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), United Nations Fund for Population Activities and other relevant agencies.

### RISE IN EMPLOYMENT RATES OF IBTE GRADUATES

November 26 - The Minister of Education The Honourable Pehin Orang Kaya Indera Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Suyoi bin Haji Osman stated that there is an increase in the number of Institute of Brunei Technical Education (IBTE) graduates securing employment within six months of completing their courses.

Speaking during the 23rd IBTE convocation, the minister announced that 71.6 per cent of the graduates were able to find employment within six months. Out of the figure, 75 per cent were able to find work relevant to their field of study.

Meanwhile, in 2012, only 63.8 per cent of the graduates secured employment after six months of completing their courses. Out of that percentage, only 65 per cent found work that is relevant to their studies.

According to an Employers' Satisfaction Survey released by IBTE in July this year, 91 per cent of employers were satisfied with the quality of work provided by IBTE graduates, he said.

The minister also urged IBTE to continue and organise the ongoing efforts and initiatives to produce

more graduates who are educated, skilled, creative, innovative and who have a progressive attitude with an entrepreneurial mind. This is to enhance the marketability of graduates who can meet the demands of employers.

In our efforts to remain relevant and greatly responsible in developing the country, technical education needs to collaborate with industry sectors to offer work attachment programmes that would help close the skills gap \*To page 20

# POLITEKNIK BRUNEI WINS OGFEST '15 TROPHY

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, November 24 – A team of students from Politeknik Brunei that competed in the Oil and Gas Festival 2015 (OGFEST '15) in Johor Bahru, Malaysia returned home with an award.

The event, which took place on November 16 and 17, was organised by the Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) Society of Petroleum Engineers Student Chapter at UTM.

The representatives of Politeknik Brunei comprised four students - Awang Mohammad Wafiuddin bin Ya'akub, Dayang Nadiah binti Haji Hassan, Dayang Nurol Azfizah binti Mohammad Roszaimey and Dayang Nurul Haziqah binti Azhar - and three lecturers - Haji Abdul Muiz bin Haji Matali, Haji Awang Morni bin Haji Madali, and Chai Soon Fu from the Oil Well Engineering programme - secured second place in the Oil Rig Design.

Politeknik Brunei was the first and only polytechnic team to ever enter the international competition that is usually contested by teams from universities.

Among the other participating institutions were Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, the Frigerg University of Mining and Technology, the Southwest Petroleum University, China University of Petroleum (Beijing), Institut Teknologi Bandung, Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember, Trisakti University, UPN 'Veteran' Yogyakarta and the Society of Petroleum Engineers (SPE) UI.

During the competition, the team had to compete in a series of tests such as building an oilrig within four hours, load testing, buoyancy testing and doing a fiveminute presentation to explain their oilrig design to a panel of experts.

They named their oilrig model 'Zafr', which means 'success' in Arabic.

In an interview, Dayang Nurol Azfizah said, "Never underestimate yourself and be confident in what you are doing. Competing with students from other universities was very difficult, but it motivated us to try and achieve our objective of winning the competition."

With their participation in OGFEST'15, the students have gained a broader and deeper understanding of the latest developments and technology in the oil and gas industry.

Additionally, the competition has brought students and experts together by providing them with a platform to share ideas and build ties.
