Brunei-Qatar ties strengthen through state visit

DOHA, April 16 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was on a two-day state visit to the State of Qatar. The highlight of His Majesty's visit was the bilateral meeting with His Highness Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, Emir of the State of Qatar. The meeting was held at the Emiri Hall.

His Majesty and His Highness discussed on the ways and means of enhancing cooperation between both countries. His Majesty also expressed his desire to further develop and strengthen these relations especially in the field of trade, economy, culture, communication, education, health, tourism and sports.

His Majesty and His Highness also expressed satisfaction with the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding on the establishment of the bilateral consultations between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Brunei Darussalam and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the State of Qatar.

The two leaders also encouraged the public and private sectors to further explore opportunities in respective countries, particularly in the areas of investment and oil and gas activities. Both leaders also welcomed the discussions on the Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreement and Bilateral Investment Treaties to be held in the near future.

The sovereign also invited the State of Qatar to open its mission in Bandar Seri Begawan. Currently, Qatar has a nonresident ambassador to Brunei residing in

During the state visit, His Majesty visited the Ras Laffan Industrial City located at the centre of the Arabian Gulf on Qatar's North Gas Field. The Industrial City is a centre for the production and supply of natural gas for the State of Qatar. It accommodates a large number of gas-based industries including liquefaction, processing and export, petrochemicals, refining of condensate and also Ras Laftan Port, the largest Liquefied Natural Gas exporting facility in the World.

Also visited was the Aspire Academy, a sports education institute developing young athletes into Olympic champions using high-tech methods and equipment. Its campus hosts the largest sports dome in the world, the venue for the coming Asian Games.

His Majesty also attended a presentation by the Ashghal Company and the Qatar Diar Real Estate Investment Company on the development projects of the State of Qatar held at the Al Mirqab Ballroom, Four Seasons Hotel.

The Ashgal, also known as Qatar's Public Works Authority, is an autonomous body set up to oversee all projects related to infrastructure and public amenities.

The Qatar Diar is a real estate investment company owned by the State of Qatar's High Supreme Council for Economic Affairs and Investment and founded to foster property development and

investment opportunities in Qatar.

This is the first state visit of His Majesty to the State of Qatar since the establishment of diplomatic relations on October 2, 1991. In June 2005, His Majesty was in Qatar to attend the Second South Summit of the G77 and China.

His Majesty visits UAE

DUBAI, April 19 - His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was in the United Arab Emirates for a three-day state visit. During the visit, His Majesty went to Abu Dhabi and Dubai.

The highlight of the State Visit was the private meeting between His Majesty and His Highness Sheikh Mohammad bin Rashid Al Maktoum, the Vice President and Prime Minister of the United Arab Emirates and Ruler of Abu Dhabi in the search for closer political, economic and social

cooperation between both countries. The meeting took place at Za'abeel Palace on April 18.

Prior to meeting, His Majesty visited the Emirates Office Towers, where he received a briefing on the on-going mega projects in information technology, media, entertainment, healthcare, real estate and construction undertaken by the Dubai Government. Also visited was the Dubai Police Academy located in the Al Towar area established on June 1, 1956. Unlike other police departments in the Emirates,

the Dubai Police Academy is under the control and management of the Dubai Government. It trains local and foreign students especially from the Gulf Cooperation Council and other Muslim countries.

On April 17, His Majesty was in Abu Dhabi where he attended a State Luncheon hosted by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi, Deputy Supreme Commander of Armed Forces and Executive Chairman of Diwan in honour of His Majesty's state visit to the United Arab Emirates. The State Luncheon was held at the Armed Forces Officers Club.

His Majesty then left for Dubai. On the way to Dubai, His Majesty stopped over at the Royal Mausoleum to pay respect to His Highness Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the late President of the United Arab Emirates.

Brunei Darussalam and the United Arab Emirates established diplomatic relations on May 28, 1992. This is His Majesty's first state visit since the relations were established. His Majesty made a working visit to Abu Dhabi and Dubai in April 2000.





Nursing College 12th Convocation:

Nurses hold big responsibility for safety of people

BERAKAS, April 8 - History had shown that threats like bird flu could cause a million fatality worldwide; and this showed that nurses have to endure a big responsibility for the safety and importance of the people.

Therefore, nursing graduates are called to equip themselves in fulfilling their responsibility particularly as a nurse, and community member in general in facing the new challenges such as bird flu.

Her Royal Highness Princess Hajah Rashidah Sa'adatul Bolkiah made the call at the 12th Convocation of Pengiran Anak Puteri Rashidah Sa'adatul Bolkiah (PAPRSB) College of Nursing at the International Convention Centre.

At the ceremony, His Royal Highness presented diplomas to 215 recipients.

The PAPRSB College of Nursing was established in 1986 to provide professional education for nurses in Brunei Darussalam in response to the increasing demand of manpower in the expanding health sector. It is also to accommodate the social and cultural changes that are taking place in relation to the changes in the disease patterns and life styles of the population.

Since its establishment 20 years ago, the college had produced more than 1000 nurses. Upon completion of the Diploma in Nursing; most of the nurses are working with the government hospitals and medical centres. Besides the general nursing programme, the College also provides a postgraduate Diploma in advanced nursing.

Courses that are organised and conducted by the college are accredited internationally through external moderation and linkages with institutions abroad. The college also offers its students many opportunities to study for degrees and

advanced courses abroad.

In order to enhance the quality of nursing and performance and also to provide effective and high quality of health service for the people, the college encourage school leavers to choose nursing as their career. To accommodate the increase in numbers of student and courses offered, the government under the Eighth National Development Plan had

renovated the old campus of University of Brunei Darussalam to become the permanent campus for the PAPRSB College of Nursing.

The PAPRSB College of Nursing not only receive local students but also offers courses for overseas students. Since 1995, Commonwealth Scholarships have also been offered to students from Commonwealth countries to study at the college to pursue the Diploma in Nursing programme.





Secondary school building for SHHB Foundation

JALAN KEBANGSAAN, April 6 - The Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation has stepped further as it will soon have its own building for its secondary school.

A foundation laying ceremony led by His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Malik was held to mark the beginning of the construction work for the Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah (SHHB) Foundation Secondary School Building at Jalan Kebangsaan.

The construction cost \$9,833,330 and expected to be complete by early January 2007. It will accommodate 42 classrooms, 12 science labs, three computer labs, language lab, lecture room and library.

According to the Chairman of the SHHB Foundation's School Administrative Board, Dato Haji Awang Abu Bakar; on realising the importance of education, the Foundation has been involved with offering private educational services as one of their contributions to the development of education and human resources to this country.

The SHHB Foundation started their private school services with the establishment of a nursery in 1998, followed by primary school in 2000 and secondary school in 2005. At present, there are 53 students studying in Secondary One and Two; using one of the primary school building blocks.

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, April 11 - His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam called for the residents and people of the nation to regard cleanliness as a priority. His Majesty made the call in a royal speech marking the birthday of Prophet Muhammad Sallallahu Alaihi Wassalam, 1427 Hiirah/2006.

"There might be parties that consider this as an unimportant matter and should not be exaggerated. However, in my opinion, it is not unimportant but it is basic, and one of the pressuring criterias of social revolution," said His Majesty.

The sovereign further stated that Islam not only labels cleanliness for health and safety, but also as part of the faith.

Normally, cleanliness said His Majesty, is strongly emphasised at public domains like markets, pedestrian areas, roads, shopping centres including restaurants and dining outlets. He also expressed his satisfaction with the relevant authorities over their stern actions in ensuring the cleanliness of restaurants and dining outlets.

He also urged the relevant authorities to scrutinise the cleanliness according to svaria such as identifying restaurants that are suitable for Muslims. This, according to His Majesty should be handled properly.

His Majesty further added that it is closely linked to the welfare of ummah as clean eateries outlets also contribute to health and safety. Particularly, cleanliness from syara also ascertains the effectiveness of Muslim's religious obligations and also the development of the blessed, physical health.

BALI, April 20 - His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade, together with fellow ASEAN Foreign Ministers and the ASEAN Secretary General held discussions at the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Retreat at the Presidential Villa, Maya Ubud Resort and Spa.

The ASEAN Ministers exchanged views on a wide range of concerns to ASEAN and assessed current progress in ASEAN's major cooperation

ICT & telecommunication industry expands

BERAKAS, April 1-The infocommunication technology (ICT) and telecommunication sector in Brunei Darussalam as a whole has expanded as it has exceeded to more than \$300 million, an increase by 10 per cent in annual average.

This was outlined by the Minister of Communications, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abu Bakar at the launching ceremony for the corporatisation the Jabatan Telekom Brunei (JTB) to Telekom Brunei Berhad (TelBru).

"The revenue from the telecom sector, solely for the past two years, had achieved about \$100 million per annum. The corporatisation of JTB is hoped to encourage the growth of ICT and industry of telecommunication and attract foreign investors to participate in enhance the economy of the nation-state," said the Minister.

Corporatisation of JTB is aligned with the development of the telecom industry in this region and also in most of the member-countries of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU).

"Usually, corporatisation was implemented so to give private sector more roles in developing the country's economy. In the context of Brunei Darussalam, His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam had stressed on the importance of the private sector in developing the nation's economy. Therefore, the corporatisation of JTB is aligned with the intention of the government to strengthen the role of the private sector," said the Minister.

He further added that in the period of the Eighth National Development Plan, the ICT and telecommunication sector had recorded a visible

development particularly in the number of subscribers. The growth rate for fixed line was 99 per cent while mobile phone was 55 per cent.

With the establishment of TelBru, all the regulation, development and licensing services for all ICT and telecommunication services in Brunei would be full administered by the Authority for Info-Communication Technology Industry of Brunei Darussalam (AiTi). TelBru would become the provider for info-communication services.

TelBru was established and registered on May 2002 under the Companies Act owned by the Prime Minister Corporation' (golden share owner) with Brooketwon Sendirian Berhad.

New framework by AiTi

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, April 12 - The Authority for Info-communications Technology Industry of Brunei Darussalam (AiTi) hosted a one-day workshop to introduce its licensing and regulatory framework to the industry and affected parties of the telecommunications and info-communications technology sector.

More than 140 participants attended the first AiTi workshop since the new licensing and regulatory function for the telecommunications industry came into effect on April 1.

From April 1 this year, Enforcement of the Telecommunication Successor Company Order 2001 and Telecommunications Order 2001 came into force.

The enforcement of the Telecommunication Successor Company Order signalled the corporatisation of the Telecommunication Department and all of JTB's assets and employees transferred to Telekom Brunei Berhad (TelBru).

By May 2006, AiTi plans to conduct seminars targeted at individual organisations to build on knowledge disseminated at the workshop and to give them the opportunity to put forward queries specific to their requirements.

AiTi, established in January 2003 by the AiTi Order, is mainly responsible to regulate, license and promote the local ICT industry as well as to manage the national radio frequency spectrum.

The workshop was conducted by Mr Rajesh Sreenivasan,-Partner, Intellectual Property, Technology, Entertainment & Communications (iTec) Oractice Group of Rajah & Tann.

The appointed consultant, Rajah & Tann is involved in the crafting of AiTi's Licensing & Regulatory Framework.

Fishery industry worth \$100 million

GADONG, April 18 - The fishery industry of Brunei Darussalam had progressed tremendously, significantly after the announcement of 200 nautical-mile Brunei fishery limits and the Exclusive Economic Zone.

In 2005 alone, the fishery industry collected almost \$100 million. Although this could be considered as small compared to other members of the Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Centre (SEAFDEC), the figure had shown that there are potentials for development and investment in the mentioned sector.

These were disclosed by the Acting Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, Dato Paduka Haji Hamdilah at the official opening of the 38th SEAFDEC Consultative Meeting.

The Acting Minister further stated that at present, Brunei still imports 40 per cent of its sea food products. He also said that the fishery industry has the potential to achieve \$400 million by 2023, an increase of 17 per cent per annum.

He further stated that Brunei Darussalam wish to see SEAFDEC to continuously assist and implement various fishery development programmes for the safety of food in the ASEAN region.

Brunei Darussalam joined SEAFDEC since 1995. SEAFDEC was established since 1967 with the objectives to promote fisheries development in Southeast Asia.

Brunei marks World Health Day

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN April 17-A declining health workforce will have an enormous impact on health services provided in many countries especially in developing countries.

Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Suyoi, said this in his message in conjunction with the World Health Day.

This year's World Health Day focuses on the health workforce with the slogan "Working Together for Health".

According to the World Health Organisation (WHO) international communities and governments around the world should place an utmost importance on the problems of diminishing health workforce.

Such problems will also increase the burden of governments in facing health challenges like the threat of pandemic influenza and the controlling and monitoring of major disease outbreaks, he said.

According to the Ministry of Health,

Brunei Darussalam accounts more than 5,600 health workforce which includes 360 professionals.

From that statistic, at least 473 are specialists and doctors, 1,800 nurses, 800 allied health professionals and 2,527 in support services where a majority of the recorded health professionals are locals.

However, Brunei's healthcare services which are as good as any other country in the region is not excluded from the lacking of health workforce like doctors, specialists and nurses in various specialised fields.

The Ministry of Health has also taken in a number of specialists to work with the ministry in order to provide more comprehensive and effective services for the public.

With an increase in health workforce and better skills and expertise, the Ministry of Health could provide the necessary services towards achieving a high standard of health.

Various steps taken to prevent HIV/AIDS

GADONG, April 19- Various measures are taken by the Ministry of Health to prevent and control the spread of HIV/AIDS.

Among measures taken are; carrying out surveys and tests known as 'serosurveillance' on blood that were donated by the public and imported blood. This is to ensure that these blood are free from HIV/AIDS virus.

Another step taken is by carrying out screening every two years on foreign workers and employees before renewing their work permit by the Ministry of Health.

These were stated by the Deputy Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Paduka Haji Awang Hazair at the official handing-over ceremony of the new premise for Brunei Darussalam AIDS Council at Wisma Haji Taha's building.

Brunei Darussalam recorded 675 cases of HIV/AIDS from the year 1986 to 2005 which is relatively low compared to over 40 million people globally, according to a World Health Organisation (WHO) statistic.

Twenty-eight out of the total number of 675 HIV/AIDS cases recorded in the country, comprised locals while 17 out of the 23 dead from HIV/AIDS are locals between the ages of 20-49 years old, he added.

The Deputy Minister of Health said that support and cooperation are needed from the general public, non-governmental bodies as well as the private sector in raising awareness of a healthy lifestyle preventing the spread of deadly contagious diseases such as HIV/AIDS, SARS, bird flu and dengue fever.

were also touched by the Minister which is an effective front-line defense in preventing the spread of contagious diseases as well as chronic diseases among the population.

He added that the regulation is in line with His Majesty's *titah* recently to mark the Maulidur Rasul Nabi Muhammad SAW celebration this year to enhance self-hygiene and environmental cleanliness in order to prevent any disease outbreak.

With the new centre, the Brunei Darussalam AIDS Council will be able to carry out its objectives more effectively and efficiently particularly in educating the general public on the importance of social and moral support for those infected with HIV/AIDS and their family members.

MANILA, April 27 - Brunei has become the 65th member of Asian Development Bank (ADB).

The official ceremony of Brunei's admission to the ADB was attended by Finance Minister II, Pehin Dato Paduka Haji Awang Abdul Rahman. At the ceremony, the Finance Minister II submitted the document 'Instrument of Acceptance' to President Haruhiko Kuroda, President of ADB and received Brunei Darussalam Membership Certificate.

The Finance Minister II also holds the post as ADB Governor for Brunei and joined by Permanent Secretary of Ministry of Finance, Dato Paduka Awang Haji Ali who holds the post as Alternate Governor.

The Asian Development Bank is a multi-lateral finance development institution which was established in 1966 with 31 member-countries. The main objective of ADB is to abolish poverty and to improve the living quality in Asia Pacific region. Currently, ADB's headquarters is located in Manila.

Australian Organisation to study Brunei's soil

BERAKAS, April 12 - The government of His Majesty through the Department of Agriculture has taken the initiative to develop Agricultural Department Areas (ADA) and Rural Agricultural Development Areas (RADA), setting aside an area of 700 hectares for cultivation of paddy, vegetables and fruit crops with the emphasis on indigenous fruits.

This was informed in a signing ceremony between the Department of Agriculture, Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources and the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO), Australia.

Signing on behalf of the Department of Agriculture was Pengiran Hajah Mariana, Director of Agriculture, while representing CSIRO was Dr Christopher Smith, Theme Leader, Agriculture, Water and Environment, CSIRO Land & Water.

The Department of Agriculture of Brunei appointed CSIRO, Australia, for a consultancy project entitled "Soil Fertility Evaluation/ Advisory Service in Brunei Darussalam".

The agreement also aimed to upgrade the production of local agricultural commodities and to increase the percentage of contribution from the agricultural sector towards Brunei's Gross Domestic Products (GDP) as well as to achieve self sufficiency in food production.

The project will also cover a detailed soil fertility evaluation to enhance soil advisory services, upgrade and document the scientific information on soil's fertility and suitability as well as recommendation on fertiliser for crops being cultivated in project areas.

The project will be carried out within a two-year period and will involve two phases including activities such as soil survey and mapping, soil properties and soil identification key, documenting soil fertility information, identification of soil properties limiting cultivation, crop suitability

assessment and management as well as fertiliser and nutrient management.

The project will facilitate the department in developing existing ADA lands towards high yield agriculture production on a sustainable basis.

Consultation services provided to local farmers on allocation of suitable land for different crops, improvement on soil fertility management and fertiliser recommendation to increase the contribution of the agriculture sector towards national GDP will also be provided by the department.

ROYAL REGALIA BUILDING- A SHOWCASE OF ROYAL HERITAGE

ince the beginning of the Brunei Sultanate, royal insignias were placed in the safe keep of the Istana (palace)

It was only by October 1992 that members of the common public had the first glimpse of the priceless and unique ceremonial artefacts which reflects the glory of the rich customs of the royal figures.

The building that houses such regalia is called the Royal Regalia Building and stands in the heart of the capital of Bandar Seri Begawan, a spot where the Churchill Memorial Complex once stood.

Construction works began in the early 1992 for the major construction project, completed in a period of

The completion of the project was well in time for the Silver Jubilee celebration to mark the ascension of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam to the throne.

Various characteristics or symbols have been incorporated into the rich Islamic architectural designs of the Royal Regalia Building.

The building that features a white dome, signifies the strength of the Malay Islamic Monarchy in the Islamic architecture.

The dome's dimension is a strong feature of the main exhibit area that provides a magnificent perspective inside as well as outside the building that creates a huge prime exhibition at least two stories high.

The exterior of the dome design is covered in gold designs of the 'Bunga Putar' or spinning flowers.

These floral designs were replicated from the fabric design worn by His Majesty during the sovereign's coronation in early August 1968.

Meanwhile, the base of the dome is surrounded by the 'Rawai Lidah' which resembles red tongue like

This design was also inspired from a decorative royal fabric.

The white colour of the dome and building is chosen in particular of the white coloured cloth normally used in ceremonies.

This colour has also been chosen for the 'Dewan Pamanjangan' where court musicians presented their performances in ceremonial halls at the palace.

The main area of the building directly underneath the white dome showcases the 'Usongan Diraja' or Royal Carriage during His Majesty's coronation in 1968.

This huge exhibition hall is surrounded with custom made woven carpet which shows the traditional Brunei designs- 'Ayer Mulih' besides a green background and 'Pucuk Rabong' design with dark background.

All items exhibited in the building are mostly handed down from generations of royalties to the other.

These artefacts include those dated from the ruling of the third monarch and first Brunei Islamic ruler, Sultan Muhammad Shah during his reign from 1363 to 1402.

Items from the days of Sultan Sharif Ali who is also the direct descendant of Prophet Muhammad during his reign from 1425 to 1432 is also exhibited in the exhibition halls.

These items are found in four exhibition areas in the building including Gallery A, A1, A2 and D. The Royal Chariot which is kept in Gallery A along with shields, spears and royal musical instruments in a vehicle used by His Majesty in a traditional procession that was pulled by 40 members of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces along the capital.

Swords and spears, flagged spears, giant ceremonial candles and colourful umbrellas which accompany the royal chariot in the ceremonious procession is kept in Gallery A1.

Meanwhile Gallery A2 houses colourful chequered umbrellas, brass spears and shields, silver spears and shields, government spear and shield, and government sword and shield.

Various significant artefacts are found in Gallery D including the Kucing Mas, a solid gold lion sculpture regalia presented by Emperor Yung Lo to Sultan Abdul Majid who visited China in 1408.

This area also displays the crown of His Majesty that was worn during His Majesty's coronation alongside the crown of Her Majesty The Raja Isteri. Keris Si Naga which is a royal keris (dagger) that has been handed down from Sultan to Sultan to formalise

the handing over of power is also kept in this gallery. The two 'Kucing Mas' which is in the form of solid gold lions found in the gallery is

believed to be originally from China and were part of national emblems of the Ming Emperors. Replicas of the Pantarama or the throne used by His Majesty during coronation and other

major events at the Lapau or Royal ceremonial hall is also found in this area.

The Singgahsana, a throne chamber used by the monarch during the obeisance and reverence ceremony and the podium of the Omar Ali Saifuddien Mosque is also exhibited in Gallery D

Royal attires worn by Their Majesties during the coronation are kept in a glass showcase

beside the uniforms of His Majesty during His Majesty's days at the Sandhurst Royal Military Academy in England.

A number of royal insignias are kept under tight security at the exhibition halls where visitors have the opportunity to understand and for themselves significance of the royal customs and traditions which are influenced by the strong Islamic teachings and traditional customs.

Over 30 local entrepreneurs participated in the event showcased their products ranging from processed agri-food to frozen and chilled food items.

RBA reduces flight to Darwin

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, April 3 - Royal Brunei Airlines (RBA) has announced that flight frequencies to Darwin in Australia will be reduced from three to two times weekly.

The temporary suspension on the Sunday flights from Brunei will take effect from June 4, 2006 until further notice.

Flights in April and May including BI177, leaving Bandar Seri Begawan on Sundays April 23 and 30 and May 7, 21 and 28 this year will also be cancelled.

This will also affect all the returning flights on the next day as well.

However, RBA will advise on the re-instatement of the flight when it comes into force.

'This suspension is only a temporary measure as Australia is a significant contributor in the network', informs RBA's Acting Head of Corporate Communications, Hj Rozman Junaidi.

Asean Delegates Attend 2nd Task Force Meeting On Tsunami Early Warning Systems

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, April 4 - Representatives from Asean member countries including Brunei Darussalam as the host country, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Singapore

and Thailand attended the "Second Task Force Meeting On The Establishment Of Monitoring Networks of Tsunami Early Warning Systems in Asean".

The two day event was held at the International Convention Centre in Berakas from April 4 to 5.

The two-day meeting was also attended by representatives from the Asean Secretariat and the World Meteorological Organisation as well as delegates from the fields of meteorology, seismology and sea-level monitoring.

The Technical Task Force for the Establishment of Monitoring Networks of the Tsunami Early Warning System in Asean is responsible to look into the issues of tsunami data and information exchange arrangements, including means of communications, data format and testing arrangements.

Among the issues discussed in the meeting included means of data exchange such as Short Messaging System (SMS), Global Telecommunications, e-mail, fax, internet and telephone.

Other issues on training and capacity building needs on disaster management, tsunami modelling, seismological training, data exchange software, on-the-job training and risk management were also discussed.

JPMC introduces new MRI System

JERUDONG, April 7-The Jerudong Park Medical Centre (JPMC) introduces the new 1.5 tesla "Avanto" MRI System as an addition to the range of its medical facilities. The new MRI system which costs \$3 million was officially launched by Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Health, Dato Paduka Awang Serbini.

Magnetic Resonance Image (MRI) is an advanced diagnostic imaging procedure which is radiation-free that creates detailed images of internal body structures and assists physicians in detecting and diagnosing diseases and other abnormalities in their early stages.

Two Traditional Medicines Banned

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, April 26 - The Ministry of Health of Brunei Darussalam has banned two traditional medicines namely 'Trebest Plus Capsules' and Han Palace Capsules'. Both medicines were supplied by Unifier Sendirian Berhad from Malaysia. The announcement was made based on the exchange of information by Drug Control Authorities of ASEAN Countries.

Both medicines were found to contain 'Acetildenafil' and 'Sildenafil analog', a drug used in treatment of impotency that could be harmful. This drug can interact with other medicines resulting in serious adverse effects such as the lowering of blood pressure if used together with some antihypertension drugs.

SPORTS COMPLEXES IN BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

A ligned with the National Sports Policy – to develop excellent quality of sports and sports for all, the Youth and Sports Department of the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports continues to upgrade and construct more sports complexes and fields for the national athletes and for public utilisation.

Currently, there are 17 sports complexes throughout the nation administered by the Youth and Sports Department. Most of the sports complexes are located in Brunei Muara District, the most populated district. For the convenience of residents in other districts, two sports complexes in Belait, one in Turtong and one in Temburong are available. More sports complexes will be available under the ongoing eighth national development plan.

The largest sports complex in Brunei is the Hassanal Bolkiah National Stadium located in Berakas. The complex among others consists of football field, track, lecture theatre and a grand stand with a capacity of more than 15,000 seats.

Also available is the Sports Medicine and Research Centre. This centre provides professional medical assistance particularly for national athletes which is equipped with latest Sports Complex, Tutong medical technology.

The Stadium is also the venue for Bruneihosted regional sporting events like when the 20th Southeast Asian (SEA) Games and the Hassanal Bolkiah Trophy for ASEAN Youth Under-21 Football tournament were held.

The Hassanal Bokiah National Stadium was also used for national events like National Day celebration and the four districts sporting event, Pesta Sukan Kebangsaan. This upcoming July will witness the Hassanal Bolkiah National Stadium to be the host for the Brunei International Tattoo 2006 held in conjunction with His Majesty's 60th birthday celebration.

Apart from the track and field, the stadium also host a gymnasium where members of the public are allowed to use the facilities provided such as treadmills and weight-liftings.

Also located within the Berakas area is the Hassanal Bolkiah National Sports Complex. Under the Hassanal Bolkiah National Sports Complex, there are several complexes offered to the public to use such as the Indoor Stadium, Sports Village, Swimming Pools, Tennis Courts, Track and Field, Multi-purposes Hall, Hockey Stadium, Squash Centre, and Lawn Ball Centre. All of these

complexes are available for the use of nationa athletes and the public. But some complexes will require the public to pay at minimum charges.

These sports complexes are also popular venues for regional and international sporting events and shows. For example, the indoor Stadium is not only used for sports events but it also functions as venues for musical concerts and exhibitions.

For the water sports lover, a water sports complex is also available in Serasa, namely the Serasa Water Sports Complex. Besides becoming the centre for yacht enthusiasts in the country, the Serasa Water Sports Complex also becomes a regular venue for regatta competition.

Other sports complexes in the Brunei Muara District are the Berakas Sports Complex, Menglait Sports Complex, Anggerek Desa Swimming Pool, and Menjalin, Sungai Kebun Recreational Sports Complex.

Besides government-owned sports complexes, there are also several sports complexes under the management of certain government departments and private organisations.
