National Youth Day: Youth leaders cautioned on exploitations

BERAKAS, August 1 — Youth leaders are cautioned on exploitations by certain parties on youths, particularly for their own interests. Exploitations in a form of using youth to sell various entertainment products and costumes that is contradictory to the nation's culture.

This was highlighted by His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam at the inaugural National Youth Day.

According to the sovereign, youths are usually the target due to their attractive characteristics, and the physiological factor that make them easily influenced by trends that are hot and new.

This weakness is often exploited by certain parties without caring for what is good or bad. This exploitation, according to the ruler, should not be ignored. It should be handled seriously, especially by the youth leaders themselves.

Hence, before this social issue becomes more chronic, programmes promoting awareness should be organised including the parents and community.

His Majesty also said that he understood that the impact of products in the form of entertainment and costumes for youth is minimal, however, he believed that whatever that is nurtured, that would be the end results.

Therefore, we should take caution and

carry out a self evaluation for the excellence of the youth and everyone.

His Majesty also said that the youth are always seen as the pride of the nation and described them as a group that could shape the future and carry the nation's aspiration. The youths usually have their own programmes and agendas and they act and think with their own way. They are young and active, thus more activities could be carried out by them

However, His Majesty said that a society that is aware should not neglect its youth but look after them accordingly. We should not bow to the influence of money but take into account what would happen to our

Brunei ready to provide assistance

PUTRAJAYA, August 3 – Brunei Darussalam is ready to provide any assistance to stop the conflict in Lebanon.

This was stated by His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam at the Meeting of the Friends of the Chair of the 10th Islamic Summit Conference at the Marriot Hotel in Putrajaya, Malaysia.

With that in mind, His Majesty urged the Organisation of Islamic Conference to take immediate measures so that the conflict would end in Lebanon.

At this emergency meeting, His Majesty also expressed that the people of Brunei

Darussalam were shocked with the latest incident. He said that what happened to Lebanon is dreadful and has shown that the international community has failed to unite

The sovereign also reiterated that although he was uncertain of the actions to be taken by the United Nations, His Majesty assured OIC that Brunei Darussalam would join other OIC member countries in any ways possible, and would consider the request for humanitarian aid and peacekeeping activities.

Among the agendas discussed at the meeting were humanitarian aid and the

redevelopment of Lebanon; and to find solutions for immediate ceasefire on the conflict.

The meeting was chaired by The Right Honourable Datuk Seri Abdullah Haji Ahmad Badawi, the Prime Minister of Malaysia who was also the Chairman of the 10th Islamic Summit Conference. It was attended by 19 leaders from Islamic countries including the Secretary General of OIC, His Excellency Professor Ekmeledin Ihsanoglu.

Two declarations namely; Putrajaya Declaration on the situation in Lebanon; and Putrajaya Declaration on the situation in the occupied Palestinian territories were issued at the end of the meeting.

According to the sovereign, he has every confidence and belief that Brunei Darussalam, as an Islamic nation, is well equipped and has the comparative advantage to position itself to become one of the leading players in the global halal market.

"We are all aware of the vast opportunities in the US\$560 billion annual market for the whole Halal industry. The Halal food sector alone is estimated to be worth US\$150 billion annually. It is clear that there is plenty of room for everyone to work together and benefit from this huge potential,

The International Halal Product Expo (IHPE) 2006 was held from August 7 to 11, in conjunction with His Majesty's 60th birthday celebration. Among the objectives of IHPE were to create awareness among the public on the commitment of the government regarding the production and certification of Halal food products; to promote the Brunei Premium Halal Brand; and to provide opportunities for foreign companies

to invest in Brunei Darussalam.

A total of 100 booths were allocated to exhibit and sell Halal products by various companies from Australia; host country, Brunei; China; Indonesia; Malaysia, Philippines; Singapore; and Thailand. Their exhibits were classified to Halal Food Sector, Halal Certified Premises Sector, Non Food Category, Related Associations and Bodies and also Islamic Finance, Insurance and Investment Services.

A two-day seminar was also held as part of the IHPE. A total of five local speakers and 15 international speakers delivered five core topics on Brunei Halal Market Overview; Market Potential and Investment Opportunities for Halal Product; Halal Certification and Processes, Halal Science and Logistics and Islamic Baking and Finance. The IHPE seminar carried a theme 'Going Global with Halal Products.'

The IHPE also provides facilities and opportunities for entrepreneurs from Brunei and other countries to expand their business network on the production and trading of Halal certified food products.

They must be authoritative, dedicated, caring and committed to their tasks and responsibilities. If we have skilled and quality teachers, then we can hope to produce quality students." added His

Majesty.

During the celebration, His Majesty consented to present souvenirs to 14 former principals, directors and deans, assistant principals, assistant director, and assistant dean who held the posts between 1976 and 2000.

More houses and land lots for citizens

MUARA, August 15 — One hundred and twenty one people received their land grants and key to their new homes held at the Kapok Primary School.

Present to grace the ceremony was His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam.

From the total recipients; 16 received land grants under Indigenous Landless Scheme based at Kampong Lambak Kiri; 24 received keys to 'Class E' house under the Indigenous Landless Scheme at Kampong Tungku (Katok 'A'); 15 received keys to 'Class E' house under the Indigenous Landless Scheme at Kampong Mata-Mata (Katok 'B'); and one received a key to 'Class C' house under the Indigenous Landless Scheme at Kampong Rimba.

Twenty-seven received their keys to semi-detached house based at Kampong Rimba, Gadong; while four received keys to houses built by developers under the Indigenous Landless Scheme based at Kampong Tungku (Katok 'A'), Kampong Rimba, and Kampong Madang; and 34 received land grants under the housing grants on the Temporary On Lease (TOL) Land based at the Brunei Muara District.

The Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has always put the welfare of her citizens a priority, hence, these housing schemes handled by the Department of Housing Development, has a mission to provide safe, quality and affordable housing to Brunei citizens.

There are three types of housing schemes namely; National Housing Scheme

Resettlement Scheme; and the Landless Indigenous Citizens Housing Scheme.

In the earlier phase of its introduction, there were five types of housings namely; Type 'A' with a 167 sq. m wide at a cost of \$95,000; Type 'B' with 144 sq. m at a cost of \$82,000. These two types of houses are no longer offered for applicants since 1985. While Type 'C', 'D' and 'E' with each measuring 115, 100 and 90 sq. m, costing at \$71,000, \$62,000 and \$52,000 respectively. Each model is a one-storey house.

Meanwhile four new models were also

introduced with the 'Deluxe', 'Standard', 'Basic' and 'Terrace' models designed as a two-storey house. The 'Deluxe' is 170 sq. m, the 'Standard' is 155 sq. m, the 'Basic' is 140 sq. m while the 'Terrace' is 90 sq m, with the price ranging from \$43,000 to \$71,000.

While a Temporary on Lease (TOL) Land Scheme was introduced in 1985.

Utmost prominence for teachings from Israk Mikraj

TUTONG, August 21 - The teachings from Israk Mikraj should be given an utmost prominence and embraced in this era which is full with challenges and declining charitable

The highlight of the event was the presentation of awards to the winners of Takmir Mosque Awards for the year 1427 Hijrah (Islamic calendar) in various categories by His Majesty.

The Takmir Mosque Awards for Imarah (activity to glorify mosque) category went to Kampung Sinaut Mosque in Tutong Districts; and the Idarah (proper and efficient management of mosque facilities) category won by Kampung Pintu Malim Mosque, Brunei Muara District.

Meanwhile Paduka Seri Begawan Sultan Omar Ali Saifuddien Mosque of Kampung Katimahar, Brunei Muara District won the Ri'ayah (maintaining the cleanliness of building in mosques and surroundings) category. The Youth Category was won by Kampung Tamoi Mosque, also from Brunei Muara District; the category is penalised by the formation of belia masjid (a group of youth) which arranges youth activities (religious, charitable and beneficial) efficiently and accordingly.

Also present were Her Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Anak Isteri Pengiran Anak Sarah, Her Royal Highness Pengiran Anak Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Zariah and other members of royal family. The auspicious event was attended by over 6000 guests.

Royal visit to a school, government and private agencies

MUARA, August 13 - Following the presentation of house keys to new homes and land lots, His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei visited a school, homes of recipients and various agencies.

Kapok Primary School, the venue for the event was the first place on the list. The school was built on 3.24 hectares of land on October 3, 1997 and completed by May, 1999. Currently, there are 300 students with 23 educators. The school is equipped with classrooms, science room, computer room, library and surau (praying area).

His Majesty's also visited Meragang Aquaculture Development Centre of Fishery Department, Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources; and Hatchery Centre of Seiwa Corporation Sdn Bhd under the Semaun Holdings. The Aquaculture Development Centre was built under the 8th Development Plan by Fishery Department; with the aims to enhance the development of Brunei's aquaculture industry. The centre functions to carry out researches and new verifications production technology; and breeding the species, which has potential for development of aquaculture industry. Among the facilities available at the \$3.7 million centre are hatchery block, fish breeding block and administration block.

Next, His Majesty visited the Youth Development Centre, Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports. The centre offers various skilled programs such as cakes and pastrymaking, catering, and administrative works. His Majesty then proceeded to TIBA Cooperative Filling Station. The station is on a 0.75 hectare of land with a cost of almost \$500,000; commenced operation on July 22, 1999.

Also visited were several homes of recipients including home of village heads of Kampong Kapok and Kampong Sungai Hanching/Salambigar. The sovereign also went to Interline (B) Sdn Bhd and Setia Motors Sdn Bhd which is located in Beribi

Industrial Complex II in Gadong.

The Interline (B) Sdn Bhd was formerly known as Interline Roofing Co. Sdn. Bhd. established in 1990. The company is the first local company in Brunei Darussalam to manufacture quality metal roofing material. The main products are trapezoidal roofing profiles, roofing accessories including gutters, fascia, capping and flashing, as well as portable cabins. On July 14, 1992, the company became the first company to achieve the ISO 9000 quality accreditation in Brunei Darussalam (ISO 9002). In the mid second quarter of 2000, The Interline Roofing Co. Sdn. Bhd. was renamed Interline (B) Sdn Bhd, a move to go into regional and international market with more diversified products and services apart from just roofing material. Meanwhile, Setia Motors Sdn Bhd is a dealer of Hyundai cars.

and please carry copies of the prescriptions or certifications.

Other advices include; wearing light, comfortable shoes that can be easily removed for security checks. Be patient and cooperate with instructions from security staff and do not joke about the contents of your baggage. Buy duty free alcohol or perfumes on arrival not prior to departure, or in flight, to countries where cabin baggage restrictions now apply.

Brunei Darussalam GDP for 2005 estimates at \$15.9 billion

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, August 14 - The Department of Economic Planning and Development (JPKE) has implemented the "Action Plan to Improve National Account Statistics in Brunei Darussalam" by revising the national account series, particularly the estimates of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

This was announced by the Acting Director General of the Department of Economic Planning and Development, Haji Awang bin Haji Mat Daud at the media conference on the Annual National Accounts for year 2000 to 2005.

The revision of any statistical series is a common procedure undertaken by countries in order to maintain a consistent time series. Based on the new series, GDP for Brunei Darussalam at current prices for year 2005 was

estimated at \$15.9 billion, compared to \$9.8 billion based on the previous series, said the Acting Director General.

He further added that the series for year 2000 to 2005 would be released in the Annual National Accounts publications which present the annual GDP estimated with 2000 as base year. Gross Domestic Product estimates are prepared in current and constant prices by economic activity, that is using the 'production approach' and by final expenditure components known as the 'expenditure approach'. This is the

first time that the expenditure approach had been used in the GDP compilation for Brunei.

There were major findings from the GDP series for year 2000 to 2005. In year 2000, GDP for Brunei was estimated \$10.3 billion at current prices and it increased to \$15.9 billion in year 2005. From the total GDP, about 57 per cent was contributed by oil sector, while remaining 43 per cent was from non-oil sector comprised the government sector (15 per cent) and the private sector (28 per cent). Meanwhile

GDP by expenditure approach showed that exports of goods and services contributed 68 per cent to the total GDP.

It was also found that from year 2000 to 2005, the economy expanded in real terms at an average annual growth of two per cent. The oil sector grew by 0.8 per cent per annum, while the non-oil sector grew by 3.6 per cent per annum. The GDP per capita at current prices also showed an increased that is from \$31,800 in year 2000 to \$42,900 in year 2005.

Second Phase of Aceh Project

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, August 5 - The second phase of the humanitarian aid project in Aceh is expected to meet the completion deadline of September 10. The matter was revealed by Dato Paduka Haji Ali Hashim, the Managing Director of Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation (YSHHB).

About 70 families who survived the devastating tsunami that hit Aceh, Indonesia on December 26, 2004 will be moved to a brand new village under the foundation's humanitarian aid project. The project that consists 70 housing units, a mosque, medical clinic, orphanage, school complete with hostels, library, classrooms and canteen will be completed before the fasting

According to the Managing Director, the funding of the second phase mainly came from donations from members of the public to two charity funds, namely YSHHB Initiative Humanitarian Fund for Tsunami Victims in Aceh and the Tsunami Victim Humanitarian Fund, under the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports.

Consumer Price Index June 2006

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for June 2006 fell by 0.7 per cent over May 2006 with an index of 102.1. The fall was partly attributed to the Mid Year Sale which started from May 28 to June 30, 2006 (Table 1).

The cost of food and non-alcoholic beverages dropped by 0.3 per cent due to lower prices of noodle, milk, eggs, cooking oils, vegetables, fruits, coffee, tea, sauces and soup and snacks.

Lower price of ready-made clothing and accessories, materials for male and female and footwear led to the decreased of 8.4 per cent in the cost of clothing and footwear.

The cost of housing, water, electricity and maintenance fell by 0.2 per cent due to lower prices of accommodation.

The cost of household goods, services and operation declined by 2.6 per cent due to lower prices of furniture; floor covering; household furnishings; audio; video equipments and musical instrument, kitchen appliances and utensils, crockery and cutlery and household operation.

Lower price of certain computer accessories and magazines contributed to a 0.1 per cent reduction in education cost.

The cost of medical and health went down by 0.7 per cent due to lower prices of proprietary medicine and supplies and therapeutical appliances.

Higher prices of holiday packages led to a 0.1 per cent increase in the cost of recreation and entertainment.

The cost of miscellaneous goods and services rose by 1.2 per cent as a result of dearer prices of personnel effects and other personnel goods.

The cost of transport and communication remaines the

World Breastfeeding Week 2006: Breastfeeding rooms open at shopping complex

GADONG, August 5 – The importance of breastfeeding was further emphasised with the launching of Breastfeeding Room at two major shopping complex in the country – The Mall and Hua Ho Mall.

The launching of the room coincided with the World Breastfeeding Week 2006 officially launched by the Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Suyoi, at The Mall.

In his speech, the minister said that the opening of the room at commercial areas is a good step towards supporting and

motivating the mother's effort to breastfeed. He further hoped that more rooms would be set up at shopping complexes, public buildings, government and private offices. The Ministry itself would provide the room at their ministry for breastfeeding.

The Minister also touched on the benefits of breastfeeding to the babies and mothers where colostrums (from breast milk) received by a baby, two to three days after birth would help to protect the child from diseases like asthma, allergy, and child cancer. If breastfeeding continues, it would

assist for faster development of sight, speech and intelligence. Meanwhile for mothers who do not breastfeed their baby, they would face higher risks of suffering from breast cancer, obesity, diabetes, heart attach and osteoporosis.

The Breastfeeding Room at Hua Ho Mall was launched in the afternoon by the Deputy Health Minister, Pehin Dato Paduka Haji Awang Hazair and the Chairman of Hua Ho Departmental Store, Pehin Dato Paduka Awang Lau Ah Kok.

Healthy Heart Month kicks off

JERUDONG, August 20 - Cardiovascular diseases are a leading medical problem in Brunei Darussalam. Amongst the heart diseases, coronary artery disease that leads to a heart attack is the most common. Heart disease accounts for 21. 1 per cent of the total deaths in this country.

Therefore, members of the public are urged to pay more attention to their hearts.

These were highlighted by the Minister

of Health, Pehin Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Suyoi at the official launching of the World Heart Month 2006 at Gleaneagles Jerudong Park Medical Centre (JPMC) in Jerudong.

According to the Minister, a healthy heart is vital for living life to the fullest, regardless of age and gender. Controlling major cardiovascular risk factors by choosing a healthy diet, being physically active and not smoking can prevent heart attacks and stroke and may help one to age more slowly.

Pehin Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Suyoi said that regular physical exercise can reduce the risk of stroke by over 25 per cent and the risk of coronary heart disease by over 40 per cent. The hearts of veteran athletes age 50 to 70 have been found to be strong and healthy as those of an inactive 20-year-old. The Minister pointed out that atherosclerosis complications are currently

the most deadly and disabling disease in affluent countries, and in the near future will be so in the entire world. Yet many individuals even those with severe atherosclerosis are unaware of the risk because they have no symptoms.

The Minister said in 30 to 50 per cent of patients, the first indicator of atherosclerosis is an acute heart attack which is often fatal. Every year about 15 million healthy looking people worldwide suddenly experience an unpredicted heart attack without prior symptoms leaving their families in shock. Cardiovascular disease, he said, is the single largest cause of death published.

Various activities were lined up to raise the awareness of heart diseases and preventive lifestyles to minimise heart disease. A public demonstration of Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) would be demonstrated at three schools as well as a mass exercise and aerobic session at the Taman Haji Sir Muda Omar 'Ali Saifuddien in the capital in September.

Gleaneagles JPMC Sdn Bhd was invited by the Ministry of Health to co-organised with the campaign.



Meanwhile team Majlis Sukan ABDB 'A' (Sport Council of Royal Brunei Armed Forces 'A') grabbed the Men's Team Title and Women's Team Title went to team Newcomers. Both teams received \$1,500 prize money. Prizes were presented by Minister of Culture, Youth and Sports, Pehin Major General (R) Dato Seri Pahlawan Awang Haji Mohammad.

Non-Governmental Youth Associations in Brunei Darussalam

Brunei Darussalam has a population of an estimated 357,800 people comprising of 186,200 male and 171,600 female of which 60 per cent of it is youth. Due to this significant percentage, the development of the youth particularly as the next generation to lead the country is given an ultimate concern by the government.



As such, the government, through the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports had established one department namely Youth and Sports Department with the mission to create and develop Brunei community towards excellence with youth and sports programmes. Besides that, Brunei also has its National Youth Policy with an objective to create an excellent Brunei Youth.

The declaration of every August 1 as the National Youth Day was positively received by youth in the country especially those in non-governmental youth associations. This serves as a platform of recognition for the contributions delivered by the youth in developing this country. It is further hoped that this celebration would inject fresh motivation in encouraging the youth towards an active involvement in their associations.

Currently, there are about 94 youth associations throughout the country; where 24 associations are based in Brunei Muara, 18 associations based in Tutong, 20 associations based in Belait and 11 associations based in Temburong. While out of this associations, there are nine national level non-governmental youth associations namely; the Brunei Youth Council; Council of Women of Brunei Darussalam (CWBD); The Ship for Southeast Asian Youth Programme (SSEAYP) Alumni Association of Brunei Darussalam (BERSATU); Alumni Society 21st Century (PERTAB 21); Brunei Darussalam Scouts Association (Persatuan Pengakap Negara Brunei Darussalam); Brunei Darussalam Girl Guides Association (Persatuan Pandu Puteri Negara Brunei Darussalam); Brunei Darussalam Red Crescent Society; Brunei Darussalam Anti Drug Association (BASMIDA); and AIDS/HIV Council.

Brunei Youth Council is established in 1959; it is the umbrella for youth associations in Brunei. The declaration of the National Youth Day is hoped to open up Brunei youths to the world and neighbouring countries, and will widen relations between Brunei Youth Council and the World Youth Council, the ASEAN Youth Council and others.

The Council of Women of Brunei Darussalam (CWBD) is the umbrella for women association in Brunei. The formation of CWBD was initiated by PERTIWI and Women's Institute (WI) on November 7, 1985. This association strives to

improve the economic, cultural and social status of women. Besides social activities, CWBD is also actively involved in national level events such as National Day, His Majesty and Her Majesty Birthday celebration and national religious event.

One of the active women associations is the Women Graduates Association that was formed in October 1988 but only officially registered on February 5, 1990. The association comprise of women graduates from various kinds of specialisation and expertise. In year 2000, the association had launched a flagship project namely 'Save Our Children'. The project had four programmes that were Home for Underprivileged Children; Annual Education Assistant; Sponsor a Child and Child Assistance Centre.

The Ship for Southeast Asian Youth Programme (SSEAYP) Alumni Association of Brunei Darussalam (BERSATU) was set up by the ex-member of SSEAYP in June 28, 1987. The SSEAYP is an annual programme sponsored by the Japan government and supported by the member-countries of ASEAN. Brunei joined the program in 1985. Through SSEAYP, Brunei youths share and exchanges experiences with others participants besides becoming Brunei's small ambassador in promoting the country and culture to other participating countries. Recently, on April, 29, 2006; BERSATU hosted the 18th SSEAYP International General Assembly 2006 (SIGA 2006) in Brunei Darussalam. This was the third time Brunei Darussalam to host such event.

Meanwhile, Alumni Society 21st Century (PERTAB) is an association that is continuously promoting youth exchange and further fostering friendly relations between Japan and Brunei Darussalam.

The famous associations in the nation particularly among the youngsters are the Brunei Darussalam Scouts Association (*Persatuan Pengakap Negara Brunei Darussalam*) and Brunei Darussalam Girl Guides Association (*Persatuan Pandu Puteri Negara Brunei Darussalam*). Both associations provide its members with opportunities for self training in the development of personal character and becoming responsible citizens.

Brunei Darussalam Scouts Association is the national scouting organisation of Brunei. It was founded in 1933, and became a member of the World Organisation of the Scout Movement in 1981. The association only had 12 members during its early year and about 2,000 members as of year 2004. On July 3, 2005, His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, the Honorary Patron of the World Organisation of Scouts Movement and Royal Patron of Brunei Darussalam Scouts Association officially opened the Scouts Headquarter at Jalan Beribi. The twenty-two million building among others consists of conference rooms, library, amateur radio club, prayer hall, multi-purpose hall, offices and shop lots. With the motto, 'Always be Prepared' (Selalu Bersedia), the association is actively involve in any national and international activities like collecting funds for flood and fire victims.

Founded in 1951, the Brunei Darussalam Girl Guides Association became a full member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGS) in 1987. The patron for the girlsonly organisation is Her Majesty The Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha. Likes the Scouts Association, Girl Guides is also actively involved in many events such as community works, social and charitable events.

Another popular association among youngster in Brunei is Brunei Darussalam Red Crescent Society. The association provides services to the community and responsible citizenship and also actively involve in any volunteer works within Brunei and worldwide.

The other two associations; BASMIDA and AIDS/HIV Council are set up to promote awareness on the dangers of drug abuse and rise of AIDS and HIV cases. Public and private sectors are welcomed to support the activities organises by these associations.

For the convenience of the youth associations to conduct activities, Youth Centre was built on each district. The Youth Centre in Bandar Seri Begawan opened on March 23, 1969 is one of the oldest building in the country.

In the effort to expose Brunei's youths to regional and international environment; the



government through Youth and Sports Department and supported by various government and private agencies had organised and took part in various events. The Football Championship, Hassanal Bolkiah Trophy for ASEAN Youth Under-21 and Southeast Asian Youth Quran Reading Competition are among the activities organised by Brunei Darussalam. On the participation, Brunei's youths among others had taken part in SSEAYP, ASEAN Youth Day, ASEAN Youth Award, and Commonwealth Youth Program.

The government through the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports with cooperation from various government and private agencies acknowledged the important role of youth. Hence, a number of programmes had been organised particularly to promote solidarity among the youth, positive and quality skills, self confidence, leadership, creativity and one that could cope with changes in social economy and technology.

200 Brunei Troops For Lebanon

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, August 11 - Brunei Darussalam is ready to send troops to Lebanon as part of a UN-mandated peacekeeping force. Commander of Royal Brunei Armed Forces, Pehin Datu Lailaraja Major General Dato Seri Haji Awang Halbi said that in a meeting with Malaysian and Indonesian military chiefs in Jakarta.

The heads of the armed forces from Brunei, Malaysia and Jakarta met to discuss coordination for a possible deployment of troops in the Middle East. In the meeting, Brunei Darussalam said, she is ready to contribute 200 troops.

The forces from the three Islamic nations would be prepared while awaiting approval

by the United Nations Security Council to be included under any peacekeeping contingent. The message that three Islamic nations want to convey is that the UN must know how serious the three countries are in preparing this mission.

At least 16 nations are considering sending troops to Lebanon. Aside from Malaysia, Indonesia and Brunei, they are Australia, Brazil, Chile, France, Ghana, Italy, Lithuania, Nigeria, Norway, Portugal, Romania, Spain and Turkey.



The arts of weaving




This fine art of weaving started in Brunei Darussalam a long time ago by housewives as a hobby to pass away the time while their husbands, who were either farmers or fishermen, went about their works. It was sold for sideline income as there was a big demand for such products for daily usage. What began as a pastime hobby became a sideline income earner for the diligent housewives.




The famous items were *tudung dulang* (dish cover), *nyiru* (tray-shaped and used for drying foodstuffs and winnowing paddy, *tikar mengkuang* (mat made of leaves) and *takiding* (a kind of basket carry which you could carry at the back to keep fruits, vegetables and harvested paddy).

However, as the time passed-by, the demands for these handicrafts have shifted. It is now seen as a souvenir or gift.

Items weaved have progressed to a much larger segment as you could now find handbags, tissue boxes, pencil case, handphone covers weaved in a variety of colours and multi sizes.





Most of the souvenir shops in Brunei Darussalam sell these items. However, for more extensive varieties, you could take a closer look and purchase the items at the Arts and Handicrafts Centre at Jalan Residency in Bandar Seri Begawan.
