HM: Health & economic issues main concern

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, January 1 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam singled out three main issues of national concern at his New Year royal titah.

First, he touched on a concern which is now a global issue that is avian influenza. His Majesty expressed his concern of this latest infectious disease thus, he urged relevant authorities to be well-prepared for a possible outbreak in this country.

This led to his consent in creating the National Committee handling the influenza and chaired by His Royal Highness Crown Prince Pengiran Muda Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah.

Secondly, His Majesty stated that the Government is continuously diversifying the economy and boost the financial resource of the private sector. The economic activities in the private sector, according to the sovereign, not only will strengthened the sector but it can provide more job opportunities for locals.

Thirdly, His Majesty touched on unemployment. According to the sovereign, the Government will not stop in finding the ways to beat unemployment. This includes increasing the role of the private sector in supplying more new job opportunities. With these opportunities, this will reduce the dependence on seeking job at the public sector.

\$250 million for human resources development

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, January 12 - An amount of \$250 million has been allocated to establish a special fund to implement various programmes that will strengthen the development of human resources in the country.

Among the objectives of the programmes are; to upgrade the human resources' capacity in line with developed countries; to fulfil the country's needs in the economic, political and social development; to fulfil the need for specialist and professional manpower in all strategic areas; to enhance the skill and advancement of manpower in all sectors; to inculcate the culture of continous learning; to achieve full employment and low unemployment; and to reduce the dependence on foreign manpower.

The programmes to be implemented are:

- 1. Special Programme for Specialists and Professionals Manpower Development
- 2. Scholarship Programme
- 3. Special Programme for Unemployed Graduates
- 4. Special Programme for School Leavers
- 5. Programme for Skill and Knowledge Development
- 6. Programme for Entrepreneurial Development

Feasibility studies will also be conducted on the following schemes:

- i. Overseas Employment Inducement Scheme
- ii. National Service Scheme

This was announced by the Prime Minister's Office on January 12.





Bird Flu: \$15.7 million to compensate poultry farmers

BERAKAS, January 9 – An amount of \$15.7 million has been allocated as a compensation package for poultry farmers in case the country is effected with the infectious avian influenza.

This was announced at the second National Pandemic Influenza Committee meeting chaired by His Royal Highness Crown Prince Pengiran Muda Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah, the Senior Minister at Prime Minister's Office.

The meeting discussed the status of preparedness of the Ministries in preventing and controlling a bird flu outbreak from occurring in this country. The meeting also discussed the status of the Plan of Action against the pandemic.

As of January 6, 144 persons worldwide have been effected with 76 reported deaths. Continuous surveillance are currently carried out globally with the Asian region badly effected.

KIARONG, January 30- Religious education received special attention by His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam at the new Islamic Year 1427 celebration.

In his royal titah, His Majesty emphasised the significant role played by the religious education in shaping our way of life.

New X-Ray Scanner and New Branch for Postal Service Department

BERAKAS, **January 25** - Postal services in Brunei Darussalam has been upgraded with the newly purchased X-Ray Scanner. The X-Ray Scanner which is internationally recognised is hoped to facilitate the department in organising postal items. It will also assist in checking dangerous and prohibited items sent via postal services. The cost of the scanner is about B\$145,000.

CIGS Enterprise has agreed to supply the X-Ray Scanner to Postal Services Department. The Acting Post-Master General, Haji Abdul Kadir was present on behalf of the Department at the contract signing ceremony with the Chief Executive Officer of CIGS Enterprise, Peter Yee on January 7. The new X-Ray Scanner has met the international safety regulation.

On January 25, a new post office branch was opened at Unit 3, Ground Floor, Block A, Urairah Complex in Kiulap. With the new branch, it is hope that the products and services provided by the department will meet customers' expectations and needs. The new post office branch will provide stamps, bulk posting and IRC (International Reply Coupon), air/sea parcel service, air/sea" mail, express mail, Speed Post and registered mail. Other services also available are renewals of road taxes and driving licences.

Brunei Fire Services' first female firefighters

BERAKAS, January 1 - For the first time in history, Brunei Darussalam's Fire Services Department recently officiated the country's first team of female firefighters.

The ceremony to mark the first batch of female firefighters in the country was attended by the Acting Director of Fire Services, Haji Awang Johari bin Jaludin on January 1, 2006.

According to Haji Awang Johari, the historical occasion for the Fire Services Department is significant towards the department's goal to move forward.

Responsibilities and tasks carried out by the female firefighters include operating as the second responder in carrying out duties of handling cases involving women and assist in operational services including forward command posts, canteen vans and others, he added.

The ceremony that took place at the Central Fire Services station at Jalan Airport Lama in Berakas also saw the inspection of the female firefighters' guard of honour by Haji Awang Johari followed by the presentation of letters of appointment to Stir Supt. Awang bin Haji Tengah who then handed over to the Commanding officer of the Female Firefighters, Dk Hajah Hamidah binti Pg Hj Damit and another four female firefighting officers.

The team of 37 female Bruneian firefighters is expected to be in action alongside their male counterparts early this year.

ASEAN Youth Camp

January 21 - About 50 youth from ASEAN member countries gathered in Brunei Darussalam for the ASEAN Youth Camp which was held from January 10 to 22.

The Sixth ASEAN Youth Camp was launched on January 11 by Pengiran Dato Dr. Haji Mohammad, Deputy Minister of Education at the Orchid Garden Hotel in Berakas.

The theme for this year's camp was "Adhesion: Water and the Arts. The theme was chosen to reflect the important role of water in shaping the civilisations and cultures of the ASEAN member countries. All presentations and activities during the camp were related to the theme.

Participants were divided into five different activities, namely: visual arts, photography, dance, creative writing/journalism and music. With workshops and visits, the camp was focused on creative interaction, artistic process as well as group and individual expression.

During the 12-day camp,

participants also had the opportunity to meet and join with Bruneians to learn the local culture and ways of life. The participants also visited places of interest likes water village.

As part of the camp, a gala performance was held on January 21 at the International Convention Centre (ICC) in Berakas. The gala showcased fun and colourful performances from the camp's participants.

The ASEAN Youth Camp is a key project of the ASEAN Committee on Culture and Information (ASEAN COCI). It began as the ASEAN Youth Friend Programme, held in the Philippines in 1998 and Thailand in 1999.


The aim was to build a stronger regional identity by raising awareness of Southeast Asia's history and heritage through arts. Over the years, the aims of the Camp have also expanded to give participants a better understanding of ASEAN in general.

Previously, the ASEAN Youth Camp was held in Thailand (2000), Malaysia (2001), Myanmar (2002), Lao People's Democratic Republic (2004) and Cambodia (2005).

CPI November 2005 increased by 1.4%

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of November 2005 went up by 1.4 per cent from the previous month with an index of 103.0. This was partly due to some prices reverting to their original prices after the end of the Brunei Grand Sale and higher prices of airfares.

The cost of food & non-alcoholic beverages increased by 0.3 per cen resulted mainly from higher prices of fresh fish and prawn, milk and other dairy products, cooking oils,

Corruption Prevention absorbed in school's curriculum

TUNGKU, January 9 – The embedding of Corruption Prevention Education in school curriculum will be carried out in phases from 2006 to 2011. In year 2006, primary one, secondary one and secondary four students will be introduced to the new curriculum.

These were stated by the Director of Anti Corruption Bureau, Datin Paduka Hajah Intan at a ceremony to mark the handing over of the curriculum to school principals, teachers and private schools. The ceremony took place at the Civil Service Institute in Tungku.

According to Datin Paduka Hajah Intan, the curriculum is not limited to theories only but it includes practical learning session. Trainings and workshops will be held at all four districts where it is hoped such effort will provide a more detailed picture on the curriculum

vegetables, fruits, honey and snacks.

Higher cost of clothing and footwear by 5.2 per cent was due to dearer prices of ready-made clothing and accessories, materials for male and female, and footwear.

The cost of housing, water, electricity and maintenance was up by 0.1 per cent due to higher prices of housing maintenance equipments.

The increase in prices of furniture; floor covering; household

furnishings; crockery and cutlery; and household operations caused the cost of household goods, services and operation to climb up by 1.3 per cent.

Transportation cost went up by 0.6 per cent due to higher prices of airfares.

Lower cost of education by 0.1 per cent was due to cheaper prices of computer accessories.

The cost of medical and health fell by 0.1 per cent resulted from lower prices of therapeutical appliances.

The cost of recreation and entertainment increased by 8.7 per cent due to higher prices of toys, and package tours.


Higher prices of personal care products led to higher cost of miscellaneous goods and services by 0.1 per cent.

The cost of communication remained uncharged from the previous month.

The CPI in November 2005 was 1.3 per cent higher than that of the same month in 2004.

TUNGKU, January 15 - Brunei Shell recently revealed that its existing fields in Champion are currently producing over 16,700 barrels of oil per day totaling over US\$1 million per day.

This was officially unveiled by the Deputy Minister of Development, Dato Paduka Dr Haji Mat Suny bin Haji Mohd Hussein at the launching of the 3rd Annual International Conference on Deltas (Borneo Venue) on January 15.

The event which brings together over 50 participants from 10 countries including 16 from Asia was held at the Chancellor's Hall of University of Brunei Darussalam (UBD).

The conference, which has brought together over 50 participants from 20 countries including 16 from Asia, hopes

to advance the understanding of petroleum reservoirs in deltas.

The conference is particularly important for Brunei Darussalam, which draws nearly all of its petroleum from deltaic deposits.

According to Dato Paduka Dr Haji Mat Suny, offshore discoveries have been recently discovered in shallow waters off the Seria surf zone below 80 meters in the South China Sea.

The rise in current oil prices have encouraged countries to step up exploration especially in deltas and deeper waters.

Deltas have always been an important source for human habitats, mainly for agriculture and water resources.

Due to this, Brunei's waters need

to be protected from industrial waste, household material and other pollutants such as used oil from workshops. Although water is not a limited resource, countries around the globe have taken major steps to clean up rivers and waterways and this is a challenge for all, he said.

UBD's Department of Petroleum Geoscience, which was first mooted over 15 years ago by Brunei Shell Petroleum Company, has progressed under the professional guidance of Professor Joe Lambiase.

The event which ended on January 18 was organised by the Department of Petroleum Geoscience of UBD in conjunction with its 20th Anniversary celebration.

Curriculum evaluation Vital in VTET

GADONG, January 16 - Reviewing the curriculum's content and objectives and its evaluation processes are one of the points of knowing whether a particular curriculum system is sustainable.

This was informed by Director of SEAMEO VOCTECH Regional Centre, Noorhaizamdin bin Haji Mosbi during the launching of the F.R.E.S.H and Quality Curriculum Evaluation in VTET (Vocational & Technical Education Training).

The ceremony took place at SEAMEO VOCTECH and attended by participants from Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

Curriculum evaluation is vital in improving the education system and to identify problem areas while evolving new approaches in VTET institutions to improve the administration system for necessary changes.

Institutions need to adapt to the curriculum developed at the national level so that they can address the needs of local industries and other stakeholders at the regional level.

Evaluating the current curriculum system is relevant to a country's socio economic setting where it is a fundamental area that needs to be planned, developed and implemented.

New Network Infrastructure for eHealth

BERAKAS, January 16 - A landmark contract signing ceremony was made to marking the latest developments in communications technology in the medical and health services. This is one of the Ministry's effort to improve the distribution and provision of quality healthcare of the country.

The signing ceremony for the Ministry of Health's Information Technology Network Infrastructure was held at the Ministry. Present on behalf of the Ministry was Dr Haji Sablee Bin Haji Aspar, the Director of Healthcare Technology.

The first phase of the eHealth project will involve the supply, delivery, testing as well as commissioning of category six in 52 locations in the four districts of the country including health centres, health clinics and other buildings belonging to the ministry.

Access to the health information system that will be carried out in a later phase will connect all treatment rooms, doctors' rooms and other relevant areas in affected buildings.

First phase of the project has been granted to four contractors including Commverge Solutions Holding (Asia) Inc., Brunei branch, while the work at Site Group Two will be done by Semara Sdn Bhd.

Perniagaan Dinamik Giat and Elite Computer System Sdn Bhd will undertake the network infrastructure at Site Group 3 and 4 respectively.

The project costing \$700,000 is scheduled for completion in six months.

Workshop on dangerous goods launched

RIMBA, January 18 - It is important to implement proper handling of dangerous goods for the interest of the environment, public health, safety as well as national security.

This was said by Captain Hans-Jurgen Roos, a representative from Gauss GmbH of Germany during the launch of the eight-day Asean/APA/GTZ Training Workshop, on 'Handling of Dangerous Goods in Selected Asean Ports'.

The event organised by the Ports Department was officially launched by Dato Paduka Haji Md. Yussof bin Haji Hassan, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Communications at the Civil Services Institute in Rimba, Gadong.

With the launch of the project, Brunei Darussalam through its Ports Department will

develop an integrated Port Safety, Health and Environmental Protection Management System in line with one of the Asean Transport Action Plan 2005-2010 goals for the Maritime Transport sector - 'Achieving Globally Acceptable Standards in Maritime Safety and Security and Protection of Marine Environment', informs Captain Roos.

The workshop which took place at a strategic time will enable appropriate authorities to assist in

the implementation of Protocol 9 - Dangerous Goods, which is one of the implementing protocols under the Asean Framework Agreement on the Facilitation of Goods in Transit signed on September 22, 2002.

Protocol 9 delivers the simplification of procedures and requirements for the transit transport of dangerous goods in Asean, using internationally accepted standards and guidelines.

With the implementation of the project, prevention of unnecessary delays and restriction for every relevant agency and private company in the supply chain network in Brunei Darussalam will be achieved.

Ports have to be managed and run efficiently at competitive prices in order to maintain its status amongst rapidly increasing competition and to ensure such competitiveness, existing services need to be upgraded and enhanced through the application of information and communication technology, Captain Roos said.

The Brunei Ports Department through its e-Government projects is currently evaluating tenders for the design, supply, delivery, installation and commissioning of an e-Port together with other e-Government projects, which would enable various electronic transactions including payment of port services to be carried out, he added.

The vision to develop Muara Port as the hub port for the BIMP-EAGA region will open up new markets through AFTA and will require full commitment and support from both public and private sector in the shipping industry.

Cooperation and assistance from the Ministry of Communications will also continue with the new services established at Muara Port including the setting up of Regional Distribution and Logistics Centre.

Nine schools ready in 2008

BERAKAS, January 13 – More schools are in the pipeline with nine schools expected to be ready in 2008. The nine schools will include; five secondary schools; three sixth form schools; and a sports school.

This was stated by the the Minister of Education, Pehin Orang Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Abdul Rahman at a prize presentation ceremony for students that excelled in their PSR exams

According to the Minister, the building of new schools is hoped to cope with the number of students increasing each year. The Ministry of Education has projected an increase in students attending high schools and sixth forms every year and hoped the students will find schools as a place for conducive in learning.

The Minister also said that 2005 saw an increase of passes in students taking the PSR exams. Statistics showed that there is an increase from 70.67 per cent to 85.73 per cent.

UBD hosts international seminar

KIARONG, January 18 - Islamic banking system and Islamic finance has been widely recognised and well-received among non-Muslims in which most banks and conventional finance institutions in the country offering such products have realised its advantages.

The banking system that practices the law taught by Imam Syafi'e has enabled Muslim funds to be activated through the 'Bai Al Inah' concept.

This was stated by Minister of Religious Affairs, Pehin Dato Seri Utama Dr. Ustaz Haji Awg Md Zain Haji Serudin during the official opening of the International religious seminar on 'Consolidation and Understanding of Mazhab Syafi'e Legal Thought in the Globalisation Era'.

The two-day International Seminar on Al-Syafi'e Legal Thought was hosted by Universiti Brunei Darussalam (UBD) with the cooperation of the Mazhab Syafi'e Research Department of the Sultan Haji Omar Ali Saifuddien Islamic Studies Institute.

The seminar also aimed to expand the legal principles of the Mazhab Syafi'e in the region, Brunei Darussalam in particular, and to bring forward several theories and law in the Mazhab Syafi'e Law that had not been analysed based on the two main sources in Islam the Al-Quran and Al-Sunnah.

Topics on strengthening the position of the Sunnah Wal Jamaah law theory in the forming and receiving of the 'ljmak' concept as the source of Islamic law was also discussed.

The two day seminar participated by over 150 individuals including international academic members, government and private firm officers, teachers and students.

Muftis from various Islamic nations, local and foreign "Fiqah and Usul Fiqah" experts and judges were also invited to facilitate the event.

Over 11 working papers on "Igto" or the handing over of land without an owner, land which is 'not for public use' or deserted land owned by a non-Muslim, given by the government or authorised party to individuals who had applied for a share to develop the land were also presented and discussed.

Halal Order enforced soon

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, January 24 – Brunei Darussalam will soon enforce a Halal Certificate and Halal Label Order 2005 through the Islamic Religious Council. Its aim is to provide information and better understanding of the Order of related parties directly connected with the implementation and enforcement of the Order.

The issuance of Halal Certificate and Halal Label Order 2005 will be enforced on processed food, separation of food storage and commercial place. This will help to boost consumers' confidence towards local products.

This was revealed at a talk organised by the Department of Islamic Religious Council on Halal Certificate and Halal Label Order 2005 at the Institute Tahfiz Al Quran Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah.

ICT with the theme "Enhancing Education through Evolving
Technology". The conference were jointly organised by
Ministry of Education and University of Brunei Darussalam.

Through this conference, it provided awareness and understanding of education on the deployment and evolvement of computer technology in education, emphasise the role of ICT in providing quality education and addresses the misconception of "changing e-education by simply adding IT in education".

Seven plenary sessions were held; Information Technology in Learning, Beyond IT in Education in Transformation; Regional Best Practices in E-Education; Issues in E-Education; Contents and Intellectual Property; Creativity & Innovation; Pedagogies and Psychology; and Communication & Collaboration.

Teachers, researchers and practitioners were invited to present their work based on the seven plenary. Participants had the chance to listen to the vision, practices and experience of some renowned educationalists and practioners in using innovative ICT solution in education as well as some leading technocrats in shaping the technology for education of today.

Seminar highlights anti-doping in sports

GADONG, January 27- The launch of Brunei Darussalam's first anti-doping seminar is a key platform to raise the awareness for those related in the sporting arena on the topics of doping in sports and its fatal risks.

This was stated by the Minister of Culture, Youth and Sports, Pehin Major General (Rtd) Dato Awang Haji Mohammad Bin Haji Daud during the 1st Brunei Anti Doping Seminar in the country.

Over 200 individuals in various areas of sporting activities and medicine attended the two-day seminar, which covered topics on history of anti-doping, world anti-doping code, and self-medication, supplement and doping.

The seminar hosted by Brunei Darussalam plays a key role in the World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA) Play True campaign which aims to educate athletes, coaches, trainers, sports physiotherapists, pharmacists and sports administrators on the latest advancement in Anti-Doping policies through a care scientific programme.

Doping in sports is fatal to the health of the athletes as well as to the reputation of the countries they represent informs the Minister.

He hoped that through this seminar, participants will be able to maximise the opportunity to learn on how to achieve excellence in sports through legal and proper means without resorting to dangerous drugs.

A panel of internationally acclaimed reputable expert speakers on doping in sports facilitated the seminar.

The seminar also highlighted the publishing of a booklet on the list of prohibited substances for 2000 in sports published by Brunei Darussalam Anti Doping Committee.

Relief package to reconstruct Aceh

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, January 22 – A 'relief package' worth about \$2 million will assist in the reconstruction of Aceh such as 70 units of houses, educational centre and a mosque. This is one of the contributions of the Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation and the citizens of Brunei Darussalam.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Brunei's Deputy Minister of Religious Affairs, who is also the Chairman of the Board of Directors of Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Badaruddin and Governor of Aceh Province, Dr.Ir.Mustafa Abu Bakar, was signed which symbolises an agreement towards the reconstruction of Aceh.

The reconstruction will include 70 units of houses where each house will have two bedrooms, a kitchen, a bathroom and a lounge area. The units will accommodate about 500 occupants. The building of the houses will cost B\$600,000 and expected to be complete in July 2006.

An educational centre (Pasentren) will also be built next to the housing area that includes hostel facilities. It will accommodate 80 male and 80 female students. The centre will be equipped with a multipurpose hall, a dining hall, four classrooms, restrooms, administration block as well as recreational facilities. The cost for building the Centre is estimated around B\$744,000.

A similar mosque like the Kampong Tamoi Mosque will be build at the centre of the reconstructed village that cost B\$368,000 and expected to be complete in September. It will accommodate 1000 Muslims during prayer times.

There will also be a health centre and an orphanage in Leupeng. It will be able to accommodate 60 orphans

The whole project is built on four hectares of land at Desa Daerah Memplan Kabupaten Leupung about 15 km away from Banda Aceh. Upon with the Governor of Aceh Province's gratitude, he would like to invite His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan Of Brunei Darussalam to officially open the village once it is completed and to name the mosque.

World Mental Health Day

BERAKAS, January 28 - More programmes will be organised to create awareness among public that mental illness is treatable and the treatment is available in Brunei.

The programmes including road show and workshop will be held as part of World Mental Health Day celebration which falls on every October 10.

The matter was revealed by Dr. Hajah Kalsom binti Abdul Latif, Director of Health Services and Prof. Ramli Hassan, Specialist Psychiatrist, Chief Administrator of Psychiatrist Department during the press conference held at the Ministry of Health. The theme for the Day

is "Mental Health and Physical Health throughout the Life Span".

The Ministry of Heath through the Psychiatrist Department had planned various programmes in order to promote not only mental health but also physical health among the people and residents of the country.

According to Proffesor Ramli Hasan, mental and physical should be healthy as both are connected. For example, there are about 20 to 40 per cent chances for cancer patients to suffer depression, 25 per cent for diabetic patients and 40 per cent for stroke. Meanwhile, a depressed person also has high chances of detting heart attack.

Therefore, few programme and activities had been run to promote both mental and physical health since December, 2005. A psychiatry emergency workshop for nurses was held on December 20, 2005 in order to enhance expertise on handling psychiatry cases.

In aligning the mental health and physical health, a walkathon was also held on January 15 in Kiarong. On the same day, they also had an open day at the Psychiatrist Day Care Centre in Kiarong. Among the upcoming programme are talks on mental health to villages and mental health promotion through electronic media.

The programme conducted will also focus on children and teenagers. According to Specialist Psychiatrist, Children and Adolescent Psychiatrist; Professor Abang Bennett Abang Taha; children and teenagers can also suffer depression. For instance high expectation from parents for their child to achieve best grades in examination may led to stress and social or attitude problem to the children.

In order to create the awareness, a workshop for teachers and parents (particularly those with problematic students and children) will be conducted. A mental health promotion to schools which started in 2002 will also be continued.

Mental health is also given a focus in the country. A department of Psychiatrist had been set up to provide various services such as in-patients, out-patients, daily patients and community psychiatrist service. Children and adolescent Psychiatrist Unit was also established.

The Psychiatrist Day Care Centre was also opened in April 2005, and provided psychosocial rehabilitation; that is to develop the patient capability in social interaction and daily activities.



JON TAMPOI'S HOME - A JOURNEY BACK IN TIME

visit to Jon Tampoi's home in Kampong Tamoi is like a journey through time where one can see for themselves the ways of lives of the local people even long before the coming of Islam.

Jon Tampoi, an avid writer and culturist has welcomed hundreds of tourists from all over Europe and Asia to his home in Kampong Tamoi, located in the water village.

Kampong Ayer which retains much of the historical features of the 16th century when Ferdinand Magellan's chronicler first discovered was the main hub for various cottage industries for the fishermen, river traders and artisans making and selling traditional handicrafts such as silverware, brassware, woodcarving and cloth weaving.

The priceless 125-year-old home brought down to him by his grandfather houses various artifacts from the early 1400 including traditional music instruments, Chinese crockery and old photographs.

Visitors can almost immediately feel the strong and rich colourful culture of the Bruneian people in the olden days as Jon welcomes his visitors in his traditional gear into his home.

The attire, which consists of a sarong, features an authentic 'Tenunan Brunei' or weaved fabric that is embossed with gold leafed designs over 100 years ago.

According to him, local weaving were designed using gold leafing decorations rather than using gold threads, which is widely used nowadays.

The entrance of his home, which is decorated with a gold leaf embossed teak wood door décor, aligned on each side and above his door entrance was made by local Peranakan craftsman over 200 years ago.

The Peranakan is a sub ethnic group created between an intermarriage between Chinese and local Malays in the ancient times.

According to him, such décor were normally placed in front of kitchen entrances of homes in those days.

So one can just understand how the rich cultural life play such an important role in the lives of the people from the way they dress to the things they own.

Ceilings which have been remodeled and replaced with colourful cloth to form a canopy was also replicated from the ancient Malay homes where constructed canopies can prevent dust from falling while providing heat insulation for homes.

Ceiling chandeliers, which are called 'Dian Lampung', is fixated on a 'Ranyah' where the 'Ranyah' prevents smoke from spoiling the canopies.

Meanwhile walls inside the home are covered in 'Daun Pucuk Nipah', which were used to construct roof tops of village homes in the ancient days.

The house which has been preserved and remodeled to replicate water village homes in the olden days features 4 rooms including a British Room, National Anthem Room, Gata Room and 'Bilik Pengangunan'.



The 'Gata Room' and 'Bilik Pengangunan' features two rooms, were used during the consummation of marriage between couples which were held over 40 days during that time.

Bilik Pengangunan is where the groom would stay in the bride's home during the period of consummation while the 'Gata room' meant for the bride will also be used by the couple after the consummation of the marriage in that home.

The British room which contains furnishings from the British colonial days in Brunei Darussalam is also preserved and displayed in that room.

What is unique about the National Anthem room is that all items in that room once belonged to the late Haji Besar Sagap, the renowned composer for Brunei Darussalam's National Anthem 'Allah Selamatkan Sultan'.

Among items that are displayed inside the room include a Gramophone that is still in mint condition.

Haji Besar Sagap is also Jon's grandfather from his father's side, an avid traveler during his early days where he enjoyed trading goods amongst Indian merchants in China and other regions.

A variety or artifacts including a collection of hundreds of year old

weaponry once used by the Malay community is also displayed inside a room including spears and traditional Malay daggers.

A collection of 'Keris'- a traditional Malay dagger is also displayed with a particular piece standing out which according to Jon was made from substances from the meteorite.

According to a legend, black magic was used to mould the hot meteorite material into the tough, narrow and sharp dagger called Keris Picit.

Fingerprints of the maker is still visible on the weapon and one cut from the weapon is known to be fatal.

The piece that is called 'Keris Picit' features a slit in the center of the dagger to place poison and kill enemies in any attack.

According to Jon, the slit also plays a role to extract human organs and kill instantly where an attacker will use three motions on his opponent which are to stab, twist and pull the 'Keris Picit'.

In the old days, the Ibans and Muruts are known to keep deceased families inside a special vase that is kept inside their homes.

The vases containing the human remains are also said to protect the house and the people from harm.

Vases that are said to contain the ancient human remains are also displayed inside a room.

A collection of crockery and other Chinese porcelain which dates back from the year 1400 to 1500 from the Tsung Dynasty tells a story of the glory days when merchants sailed into the country to trade goods.

Traditional musical instruments which decorates the music room is made over a hundred years ago.

The coming of Islam into Brunei in the 13th century has changed the ways of lives and culture of the local people.

This is evident in the disappearing art of animal sculpture that once adorned various ancient artifacts including musical instruments, boats and various house décor

Back in those days the presence of detailed animal sculptures of birds, dogs as well as dragons on personal possessions are said to protect and bring good luck to the owner.

Jon's 125 year old home, which is also been a place of interest for scientists and researchers from Europe have brought in some income which generated to hold seminars and lectures on Malay civilization and culture in Brunei, Asia as well as Europe.

Jon continues his endeavor as a culturist and writer to preserve and share the dying culture of the lives of the village people that once was with tourists around the world.

According to him, Kampong Ayer is a national heritage and efforts are being made to preserve this lifestyle so that the legacy of the 'water' people of Brunei will be retained, not only as a tourist attraction, but also for the future generation of Brunei.


Back to school 2006
