Call for establishment of a higher learning centre

TUNGKU, September 4 – A committee to evaluate the developments and achievements of the nation's tertiary education sector called the Ministerial Tertiary Education Review Committee has been introduced. The committee will simultaneously identify the direction of the nation's tertiary education sector.

The announcement was made by His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in a titah during the 18th Convocation of Universiti Brunei Darussalam (UBD) held at the university's Chancellor Hall.

This committee will shape a comprehensive strategy which hopefully

will place the sector at a more established level. The higher learning institutions must have a reputation which can provide valuable examples as well as quality education by having different types of education that can produce successful students capable of bringing changes.

Touching on the establishment of an Islamic higher learning centre, His Majesty said that it is our aim to establish a pure Islamic higher learning centre that could

become a landmark in the world.

Some 726 graduates from various fields received their degrees ranging from Honorary Doctor of Letters Degree, Doctorate of Philosophy, Masters, Degrees and Bachelor Degrees from His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam.

Among the recipients was His Royal Highness Crown Prince Pengiran Muda

Bilateral talks to enhance cooperation




The highlight of the Teacher's Day celebration was the presentation of Special Teachers Awards. His Majesty consented to present the awards to 11 recipients.



With the theme, "More and Better Jobs Working Jointly to Strengthen the Social Dimension of Globalisation".

the participating ministers discussed opportunities and challenges related to globalisation, the international division of labour and restructuring and prospects and appropriate policy responses to jointly maximise the benefits of globalisation and extend its benefits to all.

ASEM comprises of 25 European Union (EU) member states, the European Commission and the 13 Asian countries including Brunei Darussalam, China, Japan, Indonesia, Cambodia, the Republic of Korea, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

The next ASEM Labour and Employment Ministers' Conference will be held in Indonesia in 2008.

According to His Royal Highness, labour statistics demonstrated that just over half of the workers in the private sector come from neighbouring countries and other regional partners. "The contribution of manpower from ASEAN member countries towards the development of Brunei has been significant and is greatly appreciated," said the Crown

His Royal Highness appreciates the initiatives by the ASEAN Labour Ministers in promoting the development of skilled manpower through the ASEAN Skills Competition which will benefit ASEAN particularly at the grassroots level. His Royal Highness went on to say that Brunei Darussalam will need a skilled workforce of the highest quality if any of the development objectives of the country's private sector are to be realised. In this regard, His Royal Highness said that Brunei Darussalam's Ministry of Education has developed strategies to strengthen the delivery of vocational and technical education programmes.

More than 130 participants from ASEAN countries namely Cambodia, Indonesia,

Democratic People's Republic, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam and Brunei Darussalam as the host country took part in the competition. Twelve areas were competed this year, ranging from Automobile Technology to Ladies Dressmaking.

The objectives of the competition are to promote the development of quality vocational and technical skills and work values among youth and skilled workers, to foster technical cooperation in vocational and technical education, and training between governments.

The three-day competition was held simultaneously at International Convention Centre, Indoor Stadium of the Hassanal Bolkiah National Sports Complex and the Sultan Saiful Rijal Technical College. The next skills competition will be held in Malaysia in 2008.

Deputy Sultan on working visit to Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources

GADONG, September 16 – His Royal Highness Crown Prince Pengiran Muda Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah, the Deputy Sultan was on a working visit to the departments and projects under the Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources.

The first venue on the itinerary was the Brunei Industrial Development Authority (BINA) located in Gadong. BINA has a role to facilitate development of new industry and to assist existing industry to expand and be competitive besides having export capabilities. It also facilitates a dynamic cooperative movement.

Among the function of BINA is to develop and manage industrial sites and complexes to encourage the formation of new industry. The development of the complex had shown satisfactory progress. According to Acting Director of BINA, Pengiran Sharifuddin; Beribi Industrial Complex in Brunei Muara District which comprises of 56 units, almost all are rented. Meanwhile in Tutong District, Serambangun Industrial Complex which comprises of 32 units had rented about 65 per cent and Belait Town Industrial Complex which complex which comprises of 84 units had rented about 92 per cent of its capacity.

The Deputy Sultan then visited Sunlit Advertising Sendirian Berhad at Beribi Industrial Site. Later, he proceeded to visit the Veterinary Laboratory Services Unit of Agriculture Department located at Mukim Kilanas. His Royal Highness concluded his morning session with visits to the Entrepreneurial Development Centre and Accreditation and Standards Centre at Sinaut in Tutong.

The working visit program was continued by visiting the Aquaculture Development Centre in Meragang. The visit concluded at Syarikat Seiwa Corporation Sendirian Berhad and Semaun Seafood Company Sendirian Berhad in Serasa.



His Royal Highness went on to say dates are a suitable staple food especially before doing a day's work and a meal that is 'Sunat' for the breaking of fast.

His Royal Highness said at the distribution of dates, which are a personal gift from His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam to the people.

The distribution of dates, held at the International Convention Centre was in conjunction with the upcoming Ramadan month.

On hand to receive the dates were Commanders and Commandants of Royal Brunei Armed Forces, Commanding Officers of Royal Brunei Police Force as well as penghulus of mukims and village heads throughout the country.

A total of 116.5 metric tonnes of `mabroom' dates from Saudi Arabia were brought in this year, an increase of about 3.5 tonnes from last year. Each Muslims in the country received a pack of 300 gram of dates.






the officers of the council.

100 per cent local fish production in the future


MUARA, September 1 - The fishery sector is one of the sectors contributing to the country's economic diversification with the Fishery Department achieving 70 to 76 per cent self sufficiency in fresh local fish production. This was disclosed by the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources at the launching of the three-day Fisheries Carnival at the Fish Landing Complex in Serasa.

Pehin Dato Seri Setia Doctor Haji Awang Ahmad believes that Brunei Darussalam could attain one hundred per cent self sufficiency in local fish production in the near future. He stressed that his ministry and departments under it, is implementing the state diversification economic policy to counterbalance the country's sole income from the oil and gas resources.

According to the Minister, the

government has approved the proposal by the Fisheries Department to procure consultant services and experts from the Integrated Aquaculture International Company from the United States to develop a high tech prawn industry in the country and the products exported. The consultant service will be on trial for three years with an annual expense of six hundred thousand US dollars. It is scheduled to commence in January next year.

The carnival has been organised annually by the Fisheries Department since 2001 and has successfully attracted the participation of entrepreneurs involved, in the capture industry, seafood processing, aquaculture and other industries that support the progress of the fisheries industry.

15 - Four members from the Aceh Monitoring Mission (AMM) comprising of three officers from the Royal Brunei Armed Forces and one officer from the Royal Brunei Police Force returned home after a year of tour duty.

E-Asean top agenda in 7th TELSOM

JERUDONG, September 14 - The aspiration of implementing e-Asean became top agenda of Asean delegates in the 7th Asean Telecommunications & IT Senior Officials Meeting, TELSOM. The meeting was held at Indera Kayangan Ballroom, The Empire Hotel & Country Club.

At the official opening session, Acting Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Communications, Awang Haji Ibrahim bin Haji Mohd Ali said that the Asean TELSOM Working Groups continue to push for an e-Asean vision, which was dealt by four main drivers namely the Asean Information Infrastructure, ALL; the e-Society and ICT Capacity Building; the e-Commerce and ICT Trade Facilitation and the Universal Access, Digital Divide and e-Government component.

Awang Haji Ibrahim added one of the major challenges posed in implementing any project or initiative is the lack of funding to fully accomplish ICT projects. To overcome the challenge, Asean TELSOM would have to come up with and agree on the establishment of an Asean ICT Fund, as a funding mechanism for the implementation of ICT projects.

The 7^{th} TELSOM meeting was attended by senior telecommunications officials from each Asean member country.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR JULY 2006

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) in July 2006 increased marginally by 0.1 per cent from the previous month with an index of 102.2. It was partly attributed to some prices reverted to its original levels after the Mid Year Sale.

The cost of food and non-alcoholic drink beverages increased by 0.2 per cent due to higher prices of flour, noodle, fresh fish, fresh tropical fruits, canned fruits, coffee, tea, spices, sauces and soup and snacks.

Higher prices of ready-made clothing and accessories, materials for male and female and footwear led to an increase of 4.5 per cent in the cost of clothing and footwear. While the cost of housing, water, electricity and maintenance dropped by 0.1 per cent due to lower price of accommodation.

There was an increase by 0.8 per cent for the cost of household goods, services and due to higher prices of furniture, floor covering, household furnishings, audio, video equipments and musical instrument, crockery and cutlery, and household operation.

The cost of transport, however, declined by 0.4 per cent resulting from lower prices of certain air fares.

Meanwhile, the cost of communications went up by 0.3 per cent due to higher prices

of instruments including accessories.

Lower prices of selected computer and stationery contributed to a 0.1 per cent reduction in the education cost.

The cost of medical and health increased by 0.2 per cent due to higher prices of therapeutical appliances.

While the cost of miscellaneous goods and services dropped by 0.4 per cent as a result of lower prices of personal effects and other personal goods.

The cost of recreation and entertainment remained unchanged.

CPI in July was 0.2 per cent higher than that of the same month in 2005.

Guidelines introduced to promote reading culture

KAMPONG MASIN, September 13 – In the effort to expand a reading culture, a guideline on reading programmes for schools in the country was introduced by the Ministry of Education early this year. The guidelines recommended various activities to increase students' interests in reading according to suitability and needs of respective students.

The Minister of Education, Pehin Dato Seri Setia Haji Abdul Rahman, was speaking at the opening ceremony of a three-day Reading Carnival 2006. According to the Minister, reading materials can be obtained anywhere; at schools, libraries, bookshops and the most popular from the Internet. It is undeniable that the Information Communication Technology or ICT plays a vital role and has a greater influence on students and teachers to get more useful information.

The Reading Carnival was a continuous effort of the Ministry of Education in promoting reading in schools through appropriate and continuous programmes. It aimed to instill awareness in students and the public on the importance and benefits of reading in the era of information and communication technology.

During carnival, the presentation of books was held to several schools to support the carnival. Some books were given by several High Commissions and Embassies in the country and other organisations. The three-day carnival with the theme 'Reading Expands the Minds', was held at the Kampung Masin Secondary School.

Brunei Grand Sale is back!

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, September, 15 - Brunei Grand Sale (BGS) is back for the 12th time. The BGS 2006 was launched by the Permanent Secretary at the Prime Minister's Office, Dato Paduka Kaji Kamis at the Bumiputera Trade and Commercial Centre in the capital.

The Permanent Secretary in his speech stressed all vendors to put the price tags where it is visible and easily seen by customers.

Brunei Darussalam has an Act known as 'Price Control Act' which required the goods for sale must have a price tag.

According to the Permanent Secretary, surveillances would be done continuously by the Department of Economic Planning and Development on participating vendors in ensuring all the BGS terms and orders were followed.

He further added that in developed countries, the trade and retail sector provides job to diploma and degree graduates. But in Brunei, only a small percentage of local diploma and degree graduates are hired in the sector compared to foreigners. However, there are chances for locals to fill the vacancy on the management and professional level in the sector.

"I believe with the increase in numbers of locals holding the management posts, it would more easily for other posts in various level be filled by locals too," said the Permanent Secretary.

Brunei Grand Sale 2006 was kicked start on September 15 and would end on October 29, 2006. The 45-day sale carried a theme 'Bargain prices to boost sales and hence, economic growth'. BGS is an annual project of the Department of Economic Planning and Development.

Among of the objectives of BGS are to encourage the public; in particular Brunei citizens and residents to spend locally and to attract tourists to shop in Brunei. In conjunction with the launching of BGS 2006, a Local Products Fair was also held at launching venue. More than 30 local entrepreneurs participated in the seven-day fair.

Production Sharing Deal for Two Blocks

JERUDONG, August 28 – In its pursuit to secure a sustainable energy future for the nation, PetroleumBRUNEI signed a Production Sharing Contract with consortiums that had been awarded the rights for onshore Blocks L and M. The signing ceremony was held at The Empire Hotel and Country Club.

Loon Energy Inc. and QAF Brunei Sendirian Berhad consortium had been the tender for Onshore Block L, which covers an area of 2,253 square kilometres. The block occupies the whole District of Brunei-Muara, and parts of Tutong and Temburong Districts.

Signing on behalf of Petroleum BRUNEI was its Acting Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Mohd Reduan Haji Mohd Yussof while his counterparts were Mr. Timothy M Elliot, CEO of Loon Energy Inc and

Dato Paduka Chua Pheng Siong, Genreal Manager (Business Development) of QAF Brunei Sdn Bhd.

Meanwhile, the Onshore Block M was awarded to consortium comprising ChinaOil USA (Macao) Company Ltd (ChinaOil), Valiant International Petroleum Ltd and Jana Corporation Sendirian Berhad.

Signing on behalf of PetroleumBRUNEI was its Acting CEO, while his counterparts were Pengiran Anak Haji Ja'afar ibni Al-Marhum Pengiran Pemancha Pengiran Anak Haji Mohd Alam, Chairman of Jana Corporation; Mr. Lam Nam, Chairman and Managing Director of ChinaOIL USA (Macao) Co. Ltd; Mrs Ann King for Valiant International Petroleum.

These onshore blocks were opened for tender in August, 2005 and the winners were announced in February 2006.

Acting CEO of PetroleumBRUNEI in his speech, called the event as another historical milestone in the nation's oil and gas industry.

"For us in PetroleumBRUNEI, what potentially lies underneath those two onshore blocks are more than just prospects of hydrocarbons or returns on investments," he said.

He further added that, both clocks held the prospect of providing greater opportunities for everyone. With the willing of god, both blocks would bring with it's the prospects of adding to the nation's petroleum reserves and for the people greater employment opportunities.

Present as the chief quest was Minister of Energy at the Prime Minister's Office, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Yahya, who also witnessed the historic event.

Físhery industry shows promising development

he Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in its effort to diversify the economy has given a strong prominence on the fishery industry.

The Government is opening opportunities for more investments in this sector especially in pelagic or tuna fishing.

Fishery, as one of the thriving industry, has progressed tremendously, significantly after the announcement of 200 nautical-milie Brunei fishery limits and the Exclusive Economic Zone.

In 2005 alone, the industry collected almost \$100 million. This could be seen as small compared to other members of the Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Centre (SEAFDEC), however, the figure had shown that there are potentials for the development and investment in the mentioned sector.

Brunei Darussalam still imports about 40 per cent of its sea food products. Nevertheless, the fishery industry has the potential to achieve \$400 million by 2023, an increase of 17 per cent per

Meanwhile the aquaculture sector offers vast opportunities and it is very lucrative with an estimated potential to be worth \$71 million per annum based on the existing available sites.

Some of the identified investment opportunities include; 459 hectares allocated for shrimps farming located at Kampong Telisai, Tutong District; the domesticated Litopenaeus Stylirostis has revolutionalised the shrimp culture industry of Brunei Darussalam by the assurance of stability in the fry supply, good culture performance such as fast growth and high survival rate that can withstand higher stocking density and is disease free; potential sites of about 200 hectares for offshore cage culture at Pelong Rocks; and breeding beautiful local species such as Betta Macrostoma.

At the moment the existing aquaculture sites are based at Kaingaran Channel, Tanjong Pelompong, Telisai, and Pengkalan Sibabau. Kaingaran Channel and Tanjong Pelompong are for the floating cages of fish while Telisai and Pengkalan Sibabau host a shrimp culture area with an area of about 92 hectares and the latter, 50 hectares wide.

As a strong sign of the support by the government, an infrastructure for fisheries had been introduced that could assist the development of the industry.

The Meragang Hatchery was introduced to assist the development of the aquaculture industry where it is equipped with an up-to-date hatchery system including duplicate water supply lines to allow regular cleaning and disinfection, mechanical, chemical, biological as well as ozone for water treatments. The design also allows multi-species production which at present includes Peneaus shrimp, Sea bass, Groupers and freshwater

Another agency to assist is the Aquaculture Development Center where it is designed and equipped with closed recirculatory system to produce potential species such as grouper, mangrove snapper, domestication of white shrimp and tiger shrimp, and SPF seabass fry and freshwater prawn. It has supporting facilities such as laboratory, feed room, office and storage facilities. She also has broodstock tanks, larval rearing tansk, algal tans that are equipped with recirculatory system and ensures a production of good quality fry.

Meanwhile, the Broodstock Development Centre based in Serasa complements the Meragang Hatchery. It supplies good quality shrimp broodstock; and serves the research and development aspects of pond culture in verifying and demonstrating the culture

Another centre is the Freshwater Fisheries Centre where it produces aquarium fish such as koi carps; and conducts breeding of local indigenous aquarium fish.

Also provided are the Fish Landing Complexes where it provides jetties and berthing facilities; and sorting areas, stores, net-mending areas, cold and chill stores. The complex also



provides flake-ice machines, weighing machines, potable water and electricity supply.

Recently, a Fisheries Carnival 2006 was organised where it successfully recorded a total of more than \$131-thousand revenue through the sales on fresh fish and prawn including other related products participated by the entrepreneurs.

The three-day Fisheries Carnival was held at the Fish Landing Complex Serasa, Muara. It attracted more than 17,700 visitors who intended to buy fish and prawn on a low price compared to normal business pricings. The visitors also had the opportunity to witness the progress and the development of fisheries sector in the country.

Fisheries Carnival was not only to promote the fisheries industry and showcase the activities of local entrepreneurs in the fisheries sector but it was also an opportunity for entrepreneurs in the fisheries and other related industries to get together to share their experiences and views.

The fisheries carnival, an annual activity of the Fisheries Department, promoted and assisted related industries entrepreneurs to the

market and upgrade their sales and to develop fisheries ecotourism activities to boost the


local tourism industry. The carnival was participated by local entrepreneurs in the capture, seafood processing

aquaculture and related industries. Fifty-one companies from government and non-government agencies joined the carnival.

An exhibition was also held by Fisheries Department, Agriculture Department, Accreditation Centre, Ministry of Industry and Primary Resources and other non-government agencies such as Brunei Shell Petroleum Co. Sdn. Bhd, financial institutions and several schools involved in the Young Scientist Badge Award Scheme Fisheries Project 2006.

RBA increase surcharges

BERAKAS, September 7 - Royal Brunei Airlines (RBA) announced an increase of fuel and insurance surcharges as a result of the continuous rise of jet fuel price. As of September 1, 2006, RBA will impose certain rates to all tickets issued or reissued on or after September 1, 2006. The charges are based on per way of travel and apply for ticket issued and commencing in Brunei to travel to the respective destinations unless stated. Latest update on HFMD

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, September 9 - Latest report for the Hand. Foot, and Mouth Disease saw 142 new cases Brunei Darussalam from September 1 to 18. Most HFMD cases reported were not severe and did not require medical attention. Only 11 per cent of the related cases required medical attention.

The Ministry of Health's statistics showed that the total cases has reached to 1,823 where the number of HFMD cases reported from January 1 until August, 2006 was 1,681. The HFMD pandemic claimed two lives in March and April earlier this year.

The Ministry of Health are actively monitoring for HFMD on a daily basis. The public is advised to continue practicing good personal hygiene, which is said to be the most effective way to control and combat HFMD.

Brunei will participate in 24th SEA Games

BERAKAS, September 9 – Brunei Darussalam will take part in the 24th Southeast Asian Games (SEA games) at Korat, Thailand next year.

The nation stated its willingness to participate in the biennial regional games at the Southeast Asian Sports Federal Council Meeting. The meeting was held from September 6-9 at Pattaya, Thailand and Brunei was presented by His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah, President of Brunei Darussalam National Olympic Council. The meeting also had approved that 441 sports events will be featured at the upcoming 24th SEA Games.


Spend Wisely, Shop Locally
