





## More than \$5.23 billion approved for 2012/2013

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 17 - An amount of \$5,230,785,000.00 has been approved by the State Legislative Council for the 2012/2013 fiscal year budget. The approved budget would take into effect on April 1, 2012.

According to the Minister of Finance II, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abdul Rahman, the budget approved was for the 12 ministries and the 'Kemajuan' (Development).

## Living Allowance to be released in July

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 12 - By command of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, the Prime Minister's Office announced that the outstanding balance of Living Allowance (Elaun Sara Hidup) and its returns will be released and paid to all concerned officers and staff from July 2012.

The payment method of the allowance and its returns are detailed in the circular released by the Prime Minister's Office.

The balance will be updated on the returns on top of the amount of allowance accumulated every year, and not solely on the allowance.

The allowance will be paid on the government pay day in July 2012 for officers and staff in monthly paid service, while daily paid staff will be on 30 July 2012.

For local staff in the diplomatic mission offices of Brunei Darussalam, the allowance will be paid on 30 July 2012 and handled by their respective offices.

## Demerit Point System to be introduced in April

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 15 - In the effort to increase the alertness of road users and to reduce road accidents, the Ministry of Communications, through Department of Land Transport (LTD), in collaboration with Royal Brunei Police Force (RBPF) will introduce Demerit Point System (DPS) by mid-April in three phases.

The Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Communications, Dato Haji Awang Alaihuddin stated the first phase will run for six months.

The enforcement officers will be

equipped with Personal Digital Assistant (PDA) for recording the demerit points according to the eight categories of traffic offences.

The second phase will commence in October or November 2012. This includes the installation of hardware such as fixed speed cameras and traffic lights cameras at specific locations.

Both LTD and RBPF will verify the system and data are in place before the full deployment or third phase is implemented in mid of 2013.

The main objective of DPS is to ensure all road users to be more disciplined, cautious and abide the existing traffic rules and regulations. It also allows authorities to identify high risk motorists who have bad driving attitude and cause danger to other road users. Frequent traffic offenders will accumulate demerit points which eventually lead to the suspension or revocation of driving license.

No drivers will be exempted from the system including those who hold a foreign driving license.

## Brunei plans to establish kidney transplant service

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 18 - Renal patients in Brunei rose from 524 people in 2010 to 579 people in February 2012. From this figure, 34 patients underwent kidney transplant treatment while 484 patients had haemodialysis and 61 patients had peritoneal dialysis.

This rise in statistics has caught the attention of Renal Services Department, Health Promotion Centre, Cardiology Unit, Endocrinology Unit and Diabetic Clinic to increase the public awareness on renal diseases and other risk factors such as diabetes, hypertension, cardiac diseases and obesity.

This was disclosed by the Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Adanan at the World Kidney Day 2012 Celebration with the theme 'Donate a Kidney for Life'.

He underlined the significance of kidney transplant to kidney failure individuals in order to improve their life quality and prolong the life expectancy. However, kidney transplant cases are performed abroad which cost in between \$60,000 to \$120,000 depending on the complication. In view of this, the Ministry of Health is striving to provide such service in Brunei.

The minister later launched the first guide book on 'Nephrology Clinical Guideline Flowcharts' for doctors and nurses as well as Allied Health Professional in the Renal Services Department. The ceremony was held at The Rizgun International Hotel in Gadong.

## \$300,000 allocated for enhancing reading culture

## Health Minister attends World Conference on Tobacco

**SINGAPORE, March 24 -** Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Adanan attended the launching campaign towards a Smoke-Free ASEAN on March 20 and the 15<sup>th</sup> World Conference on Tobacco or Health on March 20 to 21.

While in Singapore, the minister made a working visit to several hospitals and medical and health centres to observe the facilities and exchange information and experiences on the latest services of health care apart from exploring more opportunities for health professional attachment at the institutions.

On March 24, the minister held a courtesy call to the Minister of Health of Singapore, The Honourable Gan Kim Yong.

Among matters discussed were the strengthening of cooperation in the field of health between Brunei Darussalam and Singapore including in strengthening

more effective and efficient health care system, professional health capacity development, increasing the cooperation in public health protection also in embattling the communicable diseases epidemic.

In 2007, Brunei Darussalam and Singapore signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for closer cooperation in the health sector.

#### **Tuberculosis fatalities reduce**

**BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March**23 - Due to concerted efforts from all stakeholders, Brunei Darussalam has successfully achieved the World Health Organisation's West Pacific goal in reducing fatalities due to tuberculosis (TB) by 50 per cent, from six deaths per 100,000 people in 2000 to only three

deaths per 100,000 people in 2011.

It was further reported that out of 237 new cases of TB reported in 2010 in Brunei Darussalam, 172 were locals. While in 2011, this number dropped to 155 local cases out of 230 reported cases.

The matters were highlighted by the Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang

Haji Adanan in conjunction with World Tuberculosis Day 2012.

The minister said that the Ministry of Health will continue to increase its efforts and give better treatment service and enhance preventative measures. This includes the National TB Control Guidelines which is to give health care

professionals a more comprehensive approach in the prevention and control of TB, health care education, community involvement, inter-agency cooperation,

epidemiological investigation and better laboratory testing.

World Tuberculosis Day is aimed at increasing awareness on the effects of the global epidemic of TB, and the various efforts that have been undertaken to eradicate the disease. This year's theme is 'Towards A TB Free World', to encourage the public to play a role in the eradication of TB worldwide.

World TB Day is held on March 24 every year.

## Wetland forests vital in reducing effects of climate change

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 22 - Brunei Darussalam's forest covers 75 per cent of its total land area where it has seven types of forests including three types of forest swamps. Some of the forests have been developed into recreational parks including Luagan Lalak Recreational Park newly launched during World Forestry Day 2012, and Tasek Merimbun, one of ASEAN's National Heritage Parks.

The matters were said by the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources at the official opening of the International Conference on Wetland Forests 2012.

The minister added that wetland forests are an important carbon store because the carbon is produced from organic materials that have accumulated over the years. The wetland forests are important in reducing the effects of climate changes and biodiversity in addition to helping the hydrological cycle.

Touching on the conference, the minister said that it is an important platform to spur Brunei Darussalam's development in the green economy as an important pillar of economic diversification.

This is an important part of the country's national initiatives to further its capacities not only in the conservation of this important ecosystem but also its sustainable development for the country's future generation.

## World Meteorology Day celebrated

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, March 25 Brunei Darussalam is protected from major natural disasters such as typhoons, earthquakes, tsunamis and floods such as those occurring in the neighbouring countries. However, the country is not exempted from experiencing several extreme weather occurrences such as long droughts, trans-border haze and forest fires in 1997 and 1998, strong winds in the Brunei-Muara District on 23rd July 2007 as well as flash floods and landslides involving several areas in the country on the  $20^{th}$  and  $21^{st}$  of January 2009.

The Minister of Communications, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Abdullah stated this at the World Meteorology Day celebration 2012 held at Mahligai Hall, Airport Mall.

According to Pehin Dato Awang Haji Abdullah such occurrences can be examples that the country needs to enhance the capacity of the extreme weather monitoring and early warning

The minister expressed appreciation for the efforts made by the Civil Aviation Department in improving the infrastructure through projects directed towards the enhancement of the extreme weather monitoring and early warning system under the National Development Plan 2007-2012 such as the provision of new systems namely Doppler Surveillance Weather Radar, System Wind Profiling and Echo Registering and Low Level Wind Shear Alert System.

The implementation of the three systems cost \$19.5 million overall. It is hoped the three new systems can further enhance the capabilities of the meteorological services, Civil Aviation Department in monitoring occurrences of dangerous weather such as heavy rains, strong winds, thunderstorms as well as issuing early warnings on extreme weather occurrences for the safety of the aviation operations, the public and property.

The function ran concurrently with the launch of the Meteorological Message Switching System - Global Telecommunication System.

system provides facilities to the aviation community in accessing weather information as well as flight documents online, in line with the country's efforts towards the full implementation of the e-government project in which official letters and memos are made electronically. Cooperation in the establishment of a new international framework on climate services sponsored by the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) will be launched this year, providing a multitude of benefits National Meteorological Services worldwide, either in developed countries or developing ones especially in the aspect of information dissemination and weather forecast based on science and according to customers' needs.

This year theme was 'Powering Our Future with Weather, Climate and Water' and celebrated to promote general public awareness and understanding on meteorology, build a relation with enduser groups and foster the interest amona students on meteorological science.

#### >> HOW TO GET TO BRUNEI DARUSSALAM?

## There are a number of ways to reach Brunei.

- By air Brunei's national carrier, Royal Brunei Airlines travels to more than 20 destinations around the world. The airline also has worldwide office for you to book a return flight to Brunei (to know the nearest RBA's office at your place, please log to: www.bruneiair.com)
- International airlines such as Singapore Airlines, Malaysia Airlines and Thai Airways also fly frequently to Brunei. Beginning July 2006, Air Asia, one of Malaysia's lowest airfare carrier has direct flight from Kuala Lumpur to Brunei.
- Arrival by plane would land you to Brunei International Airport (BWN), the sole airport in the nation.
- For those who enjoy journey by sea, you can reach Brunei by boat or ferry. The main ferry terminal in Brunei is the Serasa Ferry Terminal at Muara. You can catch a ferry from Labuan, Sabah or Lawas and Sundar, both in Sarawak, a state of the neighbouring country, Malaysia. Another option is via a boat from Limbang, Sarawak which will arrive at the jetty around Jalan Residency area in the Capital.
- You would have two options of entry point to Brunei by land transport. You can enter through the Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait District or the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post in Brunei Muara District. The Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait is the entry point for those from Miri, Sarawak and Kalimantan. While the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post is the entrance for those coming from Limbang, Sarawak and Kota Kinabalu, Sabah.
