Nigeria is keen on Brunei's oil and gas industry



APEC - SOM 1

Better and more effective outreach programme needed

The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Senior Officials Meeting (SOM 1 Retreat) held from 12 – 20 February in Kuala Belalong in the Temburong district, had stressed the need for better and more effective outreach programme explaining the benefits of trade and investment liberalization.

Speaking at the Press Conference held at the International Convention Centre on 13 February, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Orang Kaya Pekerma Dewa Dato Seri Paduka Awang Lim Jock Seng, who also chaired the meeting said, the Re-

treat had an exchange of views on the outcome of the World Trade Organisation (WTO) meeting in Seattle, and reaffirmed its commitment to the WTO and explored ways by which APEC can contribute to progress the work in Geneva.

The Retreat noted that the Trade Ministers meeting in Darwin in June and the APEC Leaders meeting in November are vital dates for APEC and that these two meetings will provide the opportunities for APEC to give political impetus to the work of the WTO.

The Co-Chairs of the APEC Finance Deputies from New Zealand and Brunei Darussalam were also present to brief the Retreat on activities in the Finance Ministers' process. There was also a very effective exchange during the Retreat with co-chairs of the APEC Finance Deputies process in response to the call by leaders to integrate all the processes of APEC.

In the evening, the Retreat had a general discussion on the future course of APEC and in looking to the future, senior officials saw the need to be well grounded and build upon the cumulative wisdom of the past.

Senior officials from member economies as well as the APEC Secretariat, Chairs of the Committee on Trade and Investment, SOM Sub-Committee on Ecnomic Technical Cooperation (ESC), and Budget and Management Committee (BMC) attended the meeting.

On 12 February, the 21 members of APEC Economies attended the SOM Informal Meeting in Bangar, Temburong. The officials also visited the Amo Longhouse, Brunei Darussalam Logistic Outward Bound at Batang Duri and the Ulu Temburong National Park.

Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Conference (APEC 2000) to be hosted in Brunei Darussalam this year bears the theme 'Delivering to the Community'. The theme will be the foundation to series of meetings in effort to achieve prosperity in the Asia-Pacific region.

Speaking at the Press Conference

at the International Convention Centre on 10 February, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Orang Kaya Pekerma Dewa Dato Seri Paduka Awang Lim Jock Seng said, attention will also be given to all cooperative efforts by member countries in establishing a strong basis for economic re-

covery.

He said, this year long, APEC would seek several new possibilities as well as broaden existing cooperation to strengthen the economy of APEC member countries.

Medical practitioners urged to be continually self-renewing

Medical practitioners in the coun try need to be continually selfrenewing, to be aware of and perhaps be able to apply the latest that medical research has to offer to enrich their practice, said the Acting Minister of Health.

"As saying goes, 'No one knows everything and you don't know what you don't know'. Thus, it would be sheer arrogance for anyone, including the best medical practitioner, to presume that he or she has nothing more to learn from others. Moreover, such an attitude could ultimately jeopardise the health and well-being of their patients," he reminded.

Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Wijaya Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Abdul Aziz, who is also the Temporary Acting Minister of Health made the reminder before he launched the Diploma in Primary Health Care held at Universiti Brunei Darussalam (UBD) on 9 February.

The initiative was the first postgraduate programme of its kind for medical practitioners, which represented a significant milestone in the development of medical and health services in the country, and provides doctors the unique opportunity to continue with their professional development after obtaining their first medical degree.

The Minister also advised doctors to attend medical conventions and courses, in addition to the local Continuing Medical Education (CME) Programme currently undergoing in the hospitals, and cultivate the habit of reading current medical journals and medical research literature, and discussing with their colleagues the relevance and practicality of these findings to Brunei Darussalam in order to keep up to date with the latest in medical breakthrough.

He said, a good doctor should undergo continuous self-renewal through the process of self-audit by asking who she is and how does she go forward to improve herself.

His Majesty's Government through the Health Ministry is currently in the

process of re-directing and expanding the role of the Primary Health Care System, and is giving high priority and allocating more resources to improving the system.

The implementation of the Primary Health Care Diploma is timely as we aim to develop a comprehensive and continuing, individualized and personalised health care system, that places emphasis on prevention rather than cure, said the Minister.

He hoped our doctors who are at the forefront of health services would take a greater interest in the long-term health of their patients by applying a holistic approach in maintaining or improving their physical, psychological and social well-being.

"Our doctors ought to demonstrate a caring approach in taking responsibility for co-ordinating their patients' total health care needs. They should therefore help their patient to take preventive measures, rather than resort mainly to the traditional practice of providing curative treatment," he said.

Meanwhile, the Permanent Secretary of the Health Ministry, Dato Seri Laila Jasa Haji Ahmad informed that the Diploma in Primary Health Care is a three-year part time course with fourteen modules being delivered over the period. The doctors will be able to pursue Master's degree, if they pass with good grades and also be eligible to sit for the MRCGP exam, set by the Royal College for General Practitioners, London.

The officials also spoke on several projects being implemented. These include the setting up of the equipment library, Continuous Medical Education and Advanced Nursing Practice, Internship Nursing Programme, Implementation of the Adverse Drug Reaction Registry, Internal Enquiry Board, Pre-operation procedure including operation theatre administration arrangement, Improvement of the Accident and Emergency Department, Reviewing the procedure for radiation safety, the establishment of clinical quality assessment committee, Homepage for the Health Ministry and the Establishment of Child Development Care.

Unleaded petrol to be fully used with effect from 1 March

The Government of His Majesty
The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan
of Brunei Darussalam has agreed to
the fully use of unleaded petrol with
effect from 1 March, said the Minister
of Industry and Primary Resources.

Beginning 1March, leaded petrol such as 'Regular' and 'Supershell' will be replaced with new products containing no lead.

In a speech at Board of Oil and Gas (BOGA) Night at Jerudong Polo Club on 5 February, Yang Behormat Pehin Orang Kaya Setia Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Abdul Rahman said, as a country with a small population, limited land area and water resources compared to other countries in the region, Brunei Darussalam always gives due concern on health and prosperity of its citizens and people, and views pollution issue as priority.

Upstream and downstream activities of oil and gas industry are frequently connected to pollution and ruins of the environment, he said. However, after being engaged in the industry, the Brunei Shell Petroleum Company has been able to avoid serious incidents on pollution and ruins of the environment.

At present, more than 75 per cent of the country's area is covered with proper forest reserve, rich with flora and fauna, and water free from pollution, he said.

The Minister further said that we should not be complacent with the increase in oil price at present, which this year, reaches US\$24 to US\$26 a barrel, but should look on our past experience, so that we would be more ready to face new challenges in the future.

He said, crude oil and natural liq-

uefied gas play a major role in the country's economic growth, and in this respect, he added, His Majesty's Government will give priority towards efforts to upgrade the country's economic diversification, particularly in the oil and gas industry, and will continue to strengthen the industry.

In this respect, he said, His Majesty's Government will continue to carry out economic programmes, including proposals forwarded by the Brunei Economic Council.

"The government, through BOGA will continue to diversify oil and gas industry, particularly in upstream and downstream activities, and identify effective methodologies implemented by regional countries in developing the oil and gas industry in their country and overseas. The Government will also open up new potential areas to be explored, especially in the deep-sea zone and several land areas," said Yang Berhormat.

The Minister also stressed the importance of the involvement of locals in the local companies. The government authority will continue to ensure that there are overall plannings for locals to fill main and important positions, including heads in the administration and management in all companies, where the government has its share.

The government authority would also emphasise on giving local Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) the opportunity to carry out activities conducted by the companies.

With the opportunity and confidence given to local SMEs, he said, these enterprises will grow, comparable to companies, which have established overseas.



role in bringing about stability, peace and progress in the region, said His Majesty.

The monarch went on to say that the Sultanate appreciates Malaysia's commitment towards ASEAN and will work closely together with Malaysia and other member countries to ensure that the region's stability and healthy growth is strongly maintained.

"Brunei Darussalam will also work closely with Malaysia in regional and international forums, including Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC), Oil International Conference (OIC), Non-Alignment Movement (NAM), Commonwealth and the United Nations.

"The cultural heritage and values we inherited give us the unique opportunity to contribute in regional and international affairs," added His Majesty.

"The 21st century brings with it many challenges, and thus forging closer links in cooperation and understanding would be more crucial," said the monarch.

His Majesty was confident that Brunei Darussalam and Malaysia would continue to work closely to further broaden and enhance their relations in order to upgrade cooperation and understanding.

His Majesty earlier said, the success of the Malaysian King in ruling Selangor Darul Ehsan is an excellent and encouraging achievement, and under the King's wise leadership, Selangor would certainly become a developed country by the year 2005.

Meanwhile, in his return titah, His Majesty Yang Di-Pertuan Agong said that Malaysia would continue its effort to upgrade understanding and cooperation to meet the vision and aspiration of respective country based on the policy of mutual respect.

Malaysia would always be ready to cooperate with Brunei Darussalam in all fields, including economy, trade and investments not only between the two countries, but also among the Third World countries, he said.

The Malaysian King also spoke on the cooperation between Brunei Darussalam and Malaysia at regional and international levels in various issues of mutual interest, which has contributed much to the region's peace and security.

The King was confident that Brunei Darussalam is capable of playing its vital role with ASEAN member states in identifying the direction the region should follow.

His Majesty said, the support and contribution Brunei Darussalam has made at the international level, particularly in strengthening Islam and supporting those who are being dominated, are efforts that should be appreciated by Islamic countries.

His Majesty later congratulated Brunei Darussalam for its success in hosting the 20th SEA Games and for winning the Malaysia Cup last year and was fully convinced that APEC, to be hosted by Brunei Darussalam this year would be a success and a milestone towards more excellent success in the future.

The Malaysian King has its own itinerary to the Royal Mausoleum to pay homage to His Majesty's late parents, Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, who passed away on 7 September 1986 and Al-Marhumah Duli Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Damit, who passed away on 13 September 1979.

Meanwhile, Her Majesty The Raja Permaisuri Agong, Tuanku Siti Aishah visited the Jame' Asr' Hassanal Bolkiah Mosque and the Association for the Handicapped Chilren (KACA) Building in Kiulap.

While in the country, Their Majesties The Yang Di-Pertuan Agong and The Raja Permaisuri Agong also met the Malaysian citizens at a ceremony held at the International Convention Centre.

Before leaving Brunei Darussalam on 2 February, His Majesty The Yang Di-Pertuan Agong and Her Majesty The Raja Permaisuri Agong made a farewell call to His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, Her Majesty The Raja Isteri and Her Royal Highness The Pengiran Isteri at the Balai Penghadapan, Istana Nurul Iman. HM Sultan sends congratulatory message

Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has consented to send a congratulatory message to His Excellency Mr Hojatole Eslam Seyyed Mohamed Khatami, President of the Islamic Republic of Iran on the occasion of the Republic's National Day anniversary on 11 February.

In the message, His Majesty expressed grati-

tude on the cordial relations and close understanding, which has been long established between the two countries. His Majesty is confident that such relationship would be further enhanced and upgraded in the future for the benefit of both countries and their people.

His Majesty also hoped that His Excellency would remain in good health and prosperity and the people of the Republic of Iran would always enjoy continuing peace and prosperity.

Brunei Darussalam and the Sultanate of Oman had agreed to the visa waiver between both countries with effect from 1 February 2000.

The agreement was made in the Sixth Bilateral Consultative Meeting between Brunei Darussalam and the Sultanate of Oman, held in Muscat from 12 February.

Her Royal Highness Princess Hajjah Masna, Ambassador-at-Large at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs attended the meeting. The three-day meeting was chaired by His Highness Sayyid Haitam bin Tareq bin Taimour Al-Said, the Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Sultanate of Oman.

While in Oman, Her Royal Highness Princess Hajjah Masna was also granted an audience by His Majesty Sultan Qaboos and called on His Excellency Yusof bin Alawi bin Abdullah, Minister in Resoponsible for Foreign Affairs.

The next Bilateral Consultative Meeting is expected to be held in Bandar Seri Begawan in 2001.

UBD establishes Corporation Limited

Universiti Brunei Darussalam has set up the UBD Corporation Limited (Koperasi Universiti Brunei Darussalam Berhad) for its employees.

This would enable the university to gain an independent business entity, which would partly reduce its total dependence on government funds as well as to promote the saving culture among its local staff.

This was highlighted by the Minister of Education, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Wijaya Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Abdul Aziz, the Chairman of the UBD council at the launching of UBD Corporation Limited on 20 January.

He said, the Corporation provides a 'halal' way for Muslims to invest their money. The minister also encouraged the Corporation's Board of Directors to always ensure the activities of the Corporation.

Meanwhile, the Chairman of the Corporation, Dr Haji Ismail bin Haji Duraman said, the Universiti Brunei Darussalam Corporation would take over the purchase of text books, reference books and academic journals.

This will be followed by other business ventures that is closely associated with life in the campus. Through this business venture, the Corporation will be able to take over business ventures by outside firms, he said.

"It is hoped that this will enable UBD to reduce its redundancy on the government. This will open up a source of income for UBD to finance various activities, but most important, it helps and gives opportunity to local officers and staff, especially those from the lower income brackets, to instill saving and investing habits by buying shares in this Corporation, he added.

The Chairman also said that the idea to set up a Corporation already existed since the opening of the uni-

versity in 1985.

"We feel that the launching of the Corporation is timely as we have come out of the economic crisis which hit the region since three years ago. This is the time to look into the future, for the benefit of the university, students as well as members of the Corporation, in the aspects of investment and savings," he said.

He said, at the same time, we must be able to generate revenue, while profit earned means dividends for members who purchase shares.

At present there are 412 local workforce in UBD out of 591 people. From this proportion, 131 are academic staff and 281 are supporting staff who works in the campus.

This show that 70% of the workforce in UBD are locals, majority of whom work as the support staff. This is the group that needs to be supported, economic wise, through the investment scheme in the UBD Corporation.


HM Sultan receives 'Junjung ziarah' from Brunei pilgrims


