Brunei ruler meets His Majesty King Al-Malek Fahd

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has recently made a goodwill call to His Majesty King Al-Malek Fahd ibn 'Abdul Aziz Al-Saud, the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques at As Safa Palace in Mecca.

During the call on 3 January, Their Majesties exchanged views on bilateral and regional issues, and co-operative efforts to strengthen relations between both countries.

The Brunei ruler also expressed happiness for the close and cordial relations, that had developed between the two countries and expressed gratitude for the generous facilites and hospitality continuously accorded by the Government of Saudi Arabia, not only to His Majesty and members of the royal families, but also to all Brunei Darussalam's pilgrims performing umrah and haj in Mecca over these years.

Present on the Saudi Arabia's side were His Royal Highness Prince Sultan ibn 'Abdul 'Aziz Al-Saud, the Second Deputy Prime Minister, Defence and Aviation Minister of Saudi Arabia, and His Royal Highness Prince Salmon ibn 'Abdul Aziz Al-Saud, Governor of Riyadh and other members of the royal family.

With His Majesty were His Royal Highness Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah, His Royal Highness Prince Haji 'Abdul 'Azim, His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Malik, His Royal Highness Prince Abdul Mateen and other members of the royal family.

His Majesty also consented to attend a 'Bersahur' (meal taken between midnight and dawn during the fasting month of Ramadan) ceremony hosted by His Royal Highness Prince Saud ibn Abdul Mohsen ibn 'Abdul 'Aziz Al-Saud, the Governor of Hail at his residence.

Meanwhile, Her Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajjah Saleha and Her Royal Highness Pengiran Isteri Hajjah Mariam attended a dinner given by Her Majesty Princess Jawhara Al-Ibrahim, wife of His Majesty King Al-Malek Fahd at As-Safa Palace on 1 January.

Brunei Darussalam and Saudi Arabia established diplomatic relations in 1984 and culminated with the state visit by His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam to Saudi Arabia in January last year.

His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and members of the royal family were in Mecca to perform the 'umrah' (visit a holy place as part of a pilgrimage).

24-hour operation on 28 February

The Y2K National Operation Cen tre will begin its 24-hour operation on 28 February to monitor the Y2K problems. 28 February 2000 is expected to be the critical date relating to the leap year problem.

The Minister of Communications, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Amar Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Haji Awang Zakaria, who is also the Chairman of the Y2K Coordinating Body announced the plan at the press conference held at the Y2K National Operation Centre in the Ministry of Communications on 3 January.

The Operation Centre began its 24-hour operation since 31 December 1999, beginning 8.00 pm to monitor any possibility of Y2K problems in the country, for which Brunei Darussalam is reported free from the problems.

The Minister said, with regard to the country's success in entering the new millennium without problems, the centre has reduced its 24-hour monitoring to 12.00 mid-night on 2 January.

He said, the success was timely with the country's confidence to be fully ready to go through various determined efforts and with close cooperation with concerned parties.

"The knowledge and experience we acquire to this end in handling Y2K problems is beneficial and need to be utilised to face any future challenges," he said.

The advancement of systems and facilities, and the provision of contingency plan, which has cost a big amount of allocation should be continuously utilised to upgrade the quality of service of respective agencies and organisations, said the Minister, while adding that, the advancement is a positive effect from Y2K issues, and enables the country to be more ready and capable of achieving good opportunities in the new millennium.

He said, the success also reflects that the Sultanate is confident and is always ready to face any form of challenges.

Yang Berhormat further pointed

that to this end, the Operation Centre had not encountered an incident or situation related to the problem of the year 2000. All critical services involving the public went on as normal.

In a statement issued at 3.45 am on 1 January, the Minister informed that the Operation Centre received a report, which confirmed that no problems occurred to critical services for the public.

All government services including electrical generating power in all districts, water supply and civil aviation such as Brunei International Airport and Royal Brunei Airlines functioned normally. Telephone services in all districts were free from the Y2K bug, except the problem on busy line due

to the high demand during the New Year's Eve. Hospital service also functioned as usual, and it recorded the birth of four newly born babies as we entered the new millennium.

Yang Berhormat also spoke on all government financial services, such as the Employee Trust Fund and commercial banks, which were free from Y2K bug.

Meanwhile, the Brunei Shell Company reported that all activities on oil and gas industry functioned as usual. Likewise, the port services, land transportation, sewage system, Radio and Television Brunei, Fire Services, Royal Brunei Armed Forces and Royal Brunei Police Force.

Public Service was urged to be more proactive and responsive in their action, especially in dealing with changes in the ways of thinking and attitude, as we face the new millennium. They should act as facilitators, a developer, and one who is capable of bringing about changes, as well as a thinker to the government.

The Minister of Religious Affairs, Yang Berhormat Pehin Jawatan Luar Pekerma Raja Dato Seri Utama Dr. Ustaz Haji Awang Md Zain made the call at the launching of Training and Exposure of 'Tasked 2000 in the New Millennium' and presentation of certificate to participants undergoing a course at the Institute of Public Service in Rimba on 6 January.

Public Service needs to give an excellent contribution based on noble values and positive work ethics, guided by the teachings of Allah, God the Almighty, in order to get His blessings, he said, adding that these are the administration's basis to instill confidence, people's unity and national resilience.

The Minister also called on officials and staff to be aware that

public service is a motivating engine to the country's administration, particularly in ensuring that the country's development and people's prosperity are achieved, and peace, laws enforcement and the provision of services are maintained.

He also spoke on the six categories of performance appraisal specified by the government in ensuring the level of public service's performance in the country

The ceremony was proceeded with video show on the information technology in the new millennium.

These are among the secrets of fasting in the month of Ramadan and Hari Raya Aidilfitri, the day of victory for Muslims who performed the fasting, said His Majesty.

His Majesty was speaking in a titah (royal address) broadcast nation-wide over radio and television on the eve of 'Hari Raya Aidilfitri' ('Eid Mubarak) on 7 January, which marks the end of the fasting month of Ramadan 1420 of the Muslim calendar.

Ramadan leaves many benefits in the souls of Muslims as the month is rich with education, capable of shaping their mental and physical, said His Majesty.

"In the obligation of fasting, we are not only trained to restrain ourselves from committing acts which are forbidden, but are also encouraged to always seek excellence in all fields and things we do," said the monarch.

His Majesty said, the fasting month had seen major successes among Muslims. Other than the success in 'Jihad Fisabilillah', Allah The Almighty bestows very special rewards for all good deeds we do during Ramadan, which are not available in other months. This includes reward for observing the night of 'Lailatul Qadar', the best compared to one thousand months.

While in Syawal, the month after Ramadan, Muslims are advised to perform the six-day fasting, whose benefits are equivalent to fasting the whole year.

The Hari Raya Aidilfitri began with a mass prayer held at all mosques in the Sultanate. His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and members of the royal family joined his subjects to perform a mass prayer held at the Jame' 'Asr Hassanal Bolkiah Mosque in Kiulap.

The Minister of Religious Affairs, Yang Berhormat Pehin Jawatan Luar Pekerma Raja Dato Seri Utama Dr. Ustaz Haji Awang Md Zain, his deputy, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Siraja Khatib Dato Paduka Seri Setia Ustaz Haji Awang Yahya, and other mosque officials greeted His Majesty and members of the royal family on arrival at the mosque.

Shortly after the prayer, His Majesty, Her Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajjah Saleha, Her Royal Highness Pengiran Isteri Hajjah Mariam consented to receive Hari Raya greetings from nearly 200 people, comprised of the Cabinet Ministers, Deputy Ministers, Permanent Secretaries, senior government officials and foreign diplomats, residing in the country and their spouses. The ceremony took place at Baitul Rahmah of Istana Nurul Iman on 8 January.

Also present at the ceremony were His Royal Highness Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah, His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah and Her Royal Highness Pengiran Anak Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajjah Zariah, His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah, His Royal Highness Prince Haji 'Abdul 'Azim, His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Malik, His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Malik, His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Mateen and members of the royal family.

His Majesty, Her Majesty The Raja Isteri and Her Royal Highness The Pengiran Isteri also consented to receive Hari Raya greetings from thousands of Bruneians and foreign visitors when Istana Nurul Iman was opened to the public for three days, beginning on the second day of Hari Raya.

His Majesty led male members of the royal family to receive greetings from male visitors. With His Majesty were His Royal Highness Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah, His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, His Royal Highness Prince

ration through concerted and continuing efforts from all parties, and in need of a strong economy.

Towards this, His Majesty's Government has formed the country's Economic Council chaired by His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Minister of Foreign Affairs. His Majesty's Government has also agreed with the proposals forwarded by the Council and considered to its findings on issues such as the decline of the country's economy and revenue, the increased unemployment and the increasing number of local entrepreneurs facing difficulties.

The monarch said, the Council also underlined several plans of action, and had identified long and short-term measures to help the country's growth and development. The short-term measure includes the allocation of B\$200 million to generate economic recovery, which would help local entrepreneurs through small and medium project.

His Majesty hoped that these measures could lessen the burden of local entrepreneurs, and thus would enable to help in the economic recovery.

Besides efforts towards economic recovery, His Majesty also stressed the need to give priority to maintaining a policy of having good relations with other countries, particularly in strengthening a long established relations with neighbouring countries, such as ASEAN, APEC, Commonwealth and the United Nations, as well as other regional and international organisations.

The need of such policy is even stronger when countries in the globe are increasingly interdependent with each other, said His Majesty.

His Majesty also spoke on the increasing competition in the international trade, where trade has become borderless due to the globalisation process.

This process, according to His Majesty, was brought about by the development of information technology, computer and communications, where



Religious activities during Ramadan

Ramadan, the ninth month in the Muslim calendar is a season of pious consciousness for Muslims throughout the world. Throughout Ramadan, Muslims all over the world perform the dawn to dusk fast, Islam's third tenet or pillar, whereby Muslims are refrain from eating and drinking, as well as other pleasures and wrongdoings, in order to seek blessings and forgiveness from Allah, God the Almighty.

Muslims in Brunei Darussalam observe Ramadan by performing various religious activities. Muslims will gain more reward from Allah, God the Almighty, for every good works and acts of kindness and piety they do in the fasting month of Ramadan than in the usual months. As Ramadan is the month of cultivation for the hereafter, everyone tries extra hard to get the specialty that Ramadan offers.


After breaking the fast at dusk, Muslims, men and women, perform the congregational 'Terawih' prayer at mosques and individual homes, which was followed by the recital of verses of the holy Quran, called the 'Tedarus' until late at night or late in the morning throughout Ramadan. For, Ramadan is the month, in which the revelation of the Holy Quran occurred and the most specialty it has is the night of 'Lailatulqadar'.

It is also during Ramadan that Muslims in the country frequently pay homage to their ancestors and loved ones, who have departed from this life. Activities carried out including tiding up of their gravesites and making some renovations if necessary, after which a 'tahlil' or prayer is read.


In Brunei Darussalam, a 'Tahlil' ceremony was also carried out at the Royal Mausoleum at Jalan Kubah Makam Diraja, for His Majesty's late parents, Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien and Al-Marhumah Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Damit.

Before Ramadan ends, Muslims throughout the world are obliged to perform the fourth tenet, 'Zakat and Fitrah' (tithe), whereby every Muslim, as commanded by Islam, needs to pay.

As Hari Raya Aidilfitri (the Eid





most countries and the world economy at present are influenced by electronic field known as E-Commerce, E-Economy, E-Information and others.

His Majesty said, facing this development and competition required adequate preparation in the aspect of knowledge, education and skill of manpower resources.

The monarch further stressed the importance to have well-educated and guided human resources, equipped with intelligence and skills in various development fields, as this has enabled most countries to go further and develop, even though they do not have natural resources compared to countries which depend on agricultural products alone.
