# Uphold national identity for national survival - HM SULTAN



# Indonesian president on working visit

## Bilateral matters discussed

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and His Excellency President Haji Abdurrahman Wahid of the Republic of Indonesia have been discussing bilateral matters for the benefit of Brunei Darussalam and Indonesia.

At the meeting held at Istana Nurul Iman on 27 February both His Majesty and the President expressed satisfaction at the close friendly relations between their two countries.

Present at the meeting were His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Brunei Darussalam's Minister of Foreign Affairs, His Excellency Soerjadi Seordirja, Minister for Peace and Political Coordinator of Indonesia and His Excellency Alwi Shihab, Indonesian Foreign Minister.





At a press conference held prior to his departure to Jakarta, the Indonesian President among others said that Indonesia had proposed a form of cooperation between Brunei Darussalam, Indo-



nesia and Malaysia in the oil and gas sector. He also underlined the importance for Islamic countries in Southeast Asia to have a common planning strategy on oil drilling.

He said that the economic development of the Republic of Indonesia depends, among others, on foreign capital through official and unofficial working networks. In this respect, Indonesia welcomes foreign investment, and hoped that the Republic would soon recover towards prosperity.

This was His Excellency's first working visit to Brunei Darussalam since taking over the Presidency of the Republic of Indonesia. Welcoming and bidding farewell to His Excellency and Ibu Sinta Nuriyah at the Brunei International airport were His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Her Royal Highness Pengiran Anak Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajjah Zariah.

# Patrouille de France aerobatic show

The Brunei ruler later consented to take a close look at one of the Alphajets taking part in the show, and granted an audience to the eight pilots





### Takaful Special Study Plan for Orphans launched

His Royal Highness Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah has launched the Takaful Special Study Plan for Orphans, a project of the Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah Orphans' Fund. The ceremony took place at the International Convention Centre on 29 February.

The scheme is aimed at upgrading orphans' welfare by providing a form of coverage to ensure their future; e.g. in the event of their guardians dying or facing permanent disability.

The Takaful plan offered by the Islamic Insurance of Tabung Amanah Islam Brunei (TAIB) Sendirian Berhad provides insurance coverage for orphans by saving a certain amount of money for the scholarship's fund.

The Pengiran Muda Al-Muhtadee Billah Orphans' Fund welcomes donors to contribute and become sponsors to the plan. Those who wish to sponsor the orphans should ensure that the orphans are registered with the Pengiran Muda Mahkota Fund.

The TAIB Islamic Insurance has introduced eight packages, from the first package with a minimum contribution of B\$20.00 per month or B\$240.00 a year



to the eighth package offering B\$300.00 per month or B\$3,600.00 per year.

Meanwhile, two types of sponsorships have been offered to members of the public. Firstly, sponsoring on orphan on their own choice, and secondly, sponsoring any orphan selected by the Fund's Secretariat.

At the ceremony, His Royal Highness Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah met the 61 sponsors of the newly-launched scheme and orphans in the country.

The Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Education, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Orang Kaya Putera Maharaja Dato Seri Laila Jasa Haji Awang Abu Bakar, who is also Chief Executive of the Pengiran Muda Mahkota Fund, in a press conference held at the Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation's head-

quarters on 26 February said, the Takaful Plan is the first in the region implemented by an Islamic bank and decision is now being made to involve other commercial banks to together sponsor orphans registered with the fund. For the first two months, TAIB will sponsor \$20.00 each for 1,891 orphans.

Two thousands orphans decked out to meet and greeted His Royal Highness The Crown Prince Pengiran Muda Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah. The orphans came from the Brunei-Muara, Belait, Tutong and Temburong districts thronging the Plenary Hall.

The Takaful special study plan for the orphans was then launched by His Royal Highness, followed by his greeting the more than sixty main sponsors for the study plan.

cast nationwide on radio and television on 23 February, the eve of the anniversary, His Majesty spoke on the need for a national identity for facing all challenges and tests.

"In my view, we have it already. What is needed now is our effort to maintain it," the monarch said.

The important parts of the national identity, said His Majesty, are the attitude and spirit of loyalty to a ruler, piousness, high moral, determination and striving for success.

"All these are the objectives and aspirations which are difficult to achieve, be it by a small or a big nation. But, by the grace of Allah the Almighty, Brunei Darussalam has been able to achieve all these, with Islam as a guide," said His Majesty.

The Brunei ruler further reminded that Brunei Darussalam is not excluded from various changes and development brought by the new millennium, which require the people to strongly uphold the national identity, so that they will not be confused by these changes and developments.

To achieve the aspirations, the country continues to focus on several issues and agendas, the most important of which are security and prosperity that have been emphasized since the First National Development Plan (NDP).

The emphasis on these agendas aims to fulfill the Government's commitment in enhancing the country's sta-

bility and further upgrading the life quality of the citizens and people, said His Majesty.

His Majesty was happy to note that efforts towards economic recovery had been carried out, however, added His Majesty, the country's dependency on oil and gas production is still obvi-

This situation is expected to continue for as long as there is no alternative industry that can compete with the oil and gas industry, and this is obviously a challenge to us, His Majesty stressed.

In this respect, said His Majesty, manpower resources are one of the most important factors needed for starting any industry and entrepreneur

ship.

"It is important for Government and non-Government agencies to play their role in identifying an industry, which can upgrade the country's income and provide employment to locals," said His Majesty.

His Majesty also stressed the need to ensure that globalisation, which colours the new millennium would not impede the country's interest.

His Majesty further said globalisation process brought about by technology development, particularly information technology, also brought with it positive impacts, often connected with negative elements and difficulties.

Globalisation, can also be seen as a phenomenon which provides broad market opportunities, especially among entrepreneurs. It also plays a role to broaden borderless market, which should be accepted by all.

His Majesty pointed that in most countries, the government sector acts as a facilitator and regulator, while the private sector plays its role as motivator and prime mover of the economy.

"Close and concerted cooperation between the government and the private sector, is therefore, important to ensure that the country can attract more investors," said His Majesty.

"In this respect, Brunei Darussalam as the host country for the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Conference this year, will certainly face a heavy task and responsibility," added the monarch.

The hosting of the Conference is a big test on how far the country has the capability to lead the meeting, which involves several world and regional powers, said His Majesty, while adding that, it also requires us to forge our energy in ensuring that it will work properly and smoothly, and will be able to make the country's name known to the world.

His Majesty highlighted that the Conference will also provide an opportunity to countries in the Asia-Pacific region to look closely at Brunei Darussalam. This is in line with the effort to diversify the country's economy, as well as to give local entrepreneurs the best opportunity in

## BRUNEI – INDONESIA SIGN AGREEMENT ON ECONOMIC COOPERATION

Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Indonesia had signed an agreement on the Avoidance of Double Taxation and Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income. The signing ceremony took place at the Balai Penghadapan Bukit Kayangan in Bandar Seri Begawan on 27 February.

His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, signed on behalf of the Government of Brunei Darussalam while the Indonesian Foreign Minister, Mr. Alwi Shihab represented the Government of the Republic of Indonesia.

The agreement is aimed to encourage investment through incentives and enhance existing economic cooperation between the two countries.

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has recently received credentials from four newly-appointed ambassadors and High Commissioner to Brunei Darussalam, namely from the Republic of Iraq, Republic of Turkey, the United Arab Emirates and the Republic of South Africa.

The presentation ceremony took place at Istana Nurul Iman on 8 March.

His Majesty consented to receive the credentials of the Ambassador of Iraq, His Excellency Mr Adnan Malik Nafasi Al-Ghazali and the new Turkish Ambassador, His Excellency Koray Targay. Both Their Excellencies are based in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

Also presenting their credentials to the Brunei ruler were the new Ambassador of the United Arab Emirates, His Excellency Mohammed Sultan Saif Al-Suwadi, also based in Kuala Lumpur and the South African High Commissioner, Her Excellency Lindiwe Mabuza, based in Jakarta, Indonesia.

His Majesty later consented to grant separate audiences to the new diplomats.

Meanwhile, His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, also granted separate audiences to the four newly-appointed envoys at the Balai Penghadapan, Bukit Kayangan on the same day.

# Subcommittee on Customs Procedures welcomes plan to promote trade facilitation and E-commerce

The subcommittee on customs pro cedures has outlined work challenges programme for this year and welcomes the plan to promote trade facilitation and E-commerce.

In a speech at the First meeting of the APEC Subcommittee on Customs Procedures at the International Convention Centre on 18 February, the Deputy Minister of Finance, Dato Paduka Awang Haji Selamat described the advancement of the subcommittee's work as a real challenge, as Brunei Darussalam has limited resources and is much lacking in both expertise and experience.

The Subcommittee hoped to maintain the pace of progress of the work programme in order to contribute to the advancement of APEC's overall agenda, while at the same time, give high priority to continuing to build upon the good work already underway in the Subcommittee in attaining APEC's goal.

"We know that Brunei Darussalam could only do this with the understanding, support and cooperation of the other members of APEC," said the Deputy minister.

He said, Brunei Darussalam is making good progress in implementing WTO (World Trade Organisation) Valuation Agreement, which serves as the bedrock of customs procedures, by this year.

Since the Subcommittee was formally established in 1993, several APEC member economies namely the United States of America, Indonesia, Japan, Philippines, Canada, Malaysia and New Zealand has hosted and chaired its meetings and took the significant steps to ensure that the Subcommittee's targets were consolidated within APEC's priorities.

"These APEC member economies, in concert with other members, have all made their contribution to overall progress and achievements of APEC, including in advancing the work programmes of the APEC subcommittee on customs procedures in support of the overall agenda.

The Deputy Minister further highlighted the need for the Subcommittee to encourage and expedite the plan to conduct its own assessment of the implementation of the group's collective action plans.

The Subcommittee, on the other hand, has a comprehensive technical training programme funded by APEC

funds to assist its members in the implementation of the various action plans. The effectiveness of these programmes would add to the overall credibility of and support for APEC.

Meanwhile, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Orang Kaya Pekerma Dewa Dato Seri Paduka Awang Lim Jock Seng, in a press conference of the SOM 1 Meeting held on 14 February, spoke on the confidence of 21 APEC member economies on the economic stability after the crisis.

Several representatives underlined opportunities in E-commerce as a new branch and interaction among business community, while trade liberlisation is an important agenda to reanalyse plan and action of every member country and formulate a guideline to achieve the objective agreed in the Bogor Declaration.

APEC's Economic Committees will also prepare three reports before the APEC Summit in November. These include the Survey on APEC Economy for the year 2000, APEC after the Asian Economic Crisis, and report on the promotion of a country based on knowledge.


