HM: Brunei, Thailand share similar views on many issues

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, said Brunei and Thailand have similar aspirations and views on many regional and international issues.

His Majesty pointed out that the two countries have been working very closely within the context of ASEAN as well as in other international forums in ensuring and promoting peace, stability and prosperity in South East Asia.

HM the Sultan was speaking at a banquet given by His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej of Thailand at the Chakri Throne Hall of the Boromabiman Palace in Bangkok on November 1.

Earlier, His Majesty said he hoped that his visit would further

Brunei, Korea cooperate for regional well-being

Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Korea have been working very closely in regional and international conferences because both countries share similar perceptions on the importance of establishing regional stability.

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah stated this in a speech at the state banquet at the Istana Nurul Iman in honour of President Roh Tae Woo and his wife.

HM the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan continued: "This is due to the fact that both our countries realize that stability and peace in our respective regions must be regarded as inter-related in order to ensure the security and future of Norht-East Asia and South-East Asia."

On ties between Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Korea, His Majesty said although the official relations were only established in 1984, the close links between the two countries had already existed long before that. "For many years, a number of your compatriots have come to Brunei Darussalam and played a role in promoting development and trade in this country," he added.

Brunei, Korea have longstanding relationship

B runei Darussalam had close ties with many countries around the world long before it regained full independence in 1984.

One such country is the Republic of Korea whose citizens started coming to Brunei decades ago and have played a role in promoting development and trade in the country.

The close links had developed even further since Brunei's independence and His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah's visit to the republic in the same year.

President Roh's visit, the first by a Korean head of state, will further strengthen the already close and cordial relations.

More world support for ASEAN resolution on Kampuchea

A SEAN's efforts in seeking support from the international community for the ASEAN resolution on Kampuchea have been very successful.

This was stated by the Foreign Minister, His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Perdana Wazir Sahibul Himmah Wal-Waqar Pengiran Muda Haji Mohamed Bolkiah in his opening address at the second meeting of the 22nd ASEAN Standing Committee in Bandar Seri Begawan on November 15.

HRH Prince Muda Haji Mohamed Bolkiah, who was referring to the 43rd United Nations General Assembly held in October, said the votes in favour increased by 5 to 122.

HRH the Foreign Minister, who is also the Chairman of the ASEAN Standing Committee, said: "This demonstrates to the Vietnamese that world opinion is on our side. It is our hope that Vietnam will be more realistic and take a more flexible position to withdraw its troops within an overall comprehensive political solution."

On the economic front, His Royal Highness announced that ASEAN's efforts at regional cooperation have once again shown positive developments with the decisions taken at the various ASEAN ministerial meetings and that the memorandum of understanding on brand-to-brand complementation in the automotive industry was approved by the ASEAN economic ministers in their 20th meeting in Pattaya in October.

HRH the Foreign Minister also disclosed that the 7th ASEAN Labour Ministers Meeting had agreed that an ASEAN project on the informal sector should be formulated in recognition of the sector's importance in generating

employment and economic growth for the region.

The development of this sector, he added, will help to make economic and social improvements in the region.

His Royal Highness said a further contribution towards regional cooperation by ASEAN ministers is their proposal to establish an ASEAN corporation in food, agriculture and forestry, which will help promote national and ASEAN interest and greater market share of ASEAN products.

Earlier, His Royal Highness congratulated Malaysia on its election to the seat of the nonpermanent member of the UN Security Council.

"I am confident that the membership of Malaysia will enhance the interest of ASEAN internationally, especially in ASEAN's effort to solve regional conflict," said His Royal Highness.

The three-day meeting was attended by envoys of the ASEAN member countries to Brunei Darussalam and senior officials of the ASEAN Secretariat.

His Majesty received the royal salute and then inspected a guard-of-honour mounted by members of the Thai armed forces.

Shortly after, the royal couple were driven to the Pavilion of the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration where His Majesty received the Key of the Bangkok City from its Governor, General Chamlong Srimuang.

After the brief but historical ceremony, HM the Sultan and HM the Raja Isteri were taken to the Boromabiman Palace where they stayed while in the Thai capital.

In the afternoon, the royal visitors made a courtesy call on Their Majesties King Bhumibol and Queen Sirikit at the Chitralda Villa, Dusit Palace, where an exchange of state awards took place.

HM King Bhumibol conferred the Most Auspicious Order of The Rajamitrabborn on HM the Sultan, and The Knight Grand Cross (First Class) of The Most Illustrious Order of Chulachomklao on HM the Raja Isteri.

HM the King also bestowed state awards on HRH Paduka Seri Pengiran Bendahara Seri Maharaja Permaisuara Pengiran Muda Haji Sufri Bolkiah; HRH Paduka Seri Pengiran Digadong Sahibul Mal Pengiran Muda Haji Jefri Bolkiah, the Finance Minister; and HRH Paduka Seri Pengiran Anak Hajjah

Masna, who each received the Knight Cordon Cross (Special Class) of The Most Exalted Order of The White Elephant, and The Knight Grand Cross (First Class) of The Most Exalted Order of The White Elephant on Yang Amat Mulia Pengiran Bini Mazuin and Yang Amat Mulia Pengiran Lela Cheteria Sahibun Najabah Pengiran Anak Haji Abdul Aziz, the Grand Chamberlain.

HM the Sultan bestowed Darjah Kerabat Mahkota Brunei (DKMB) on HM King Bhumibol and Darjah Kerabat Laila Utama Yang Amat Di-Hormati (DK) on HM Queen Sirikit, and Darjah Kerabat Seri Utama Yang Amat Di-Hormati (DK) on HRH Crown Prince Vajiralongkorn; HRH Princess Maha Chakri Siridhorn; HRH Princess Chulabhorn; and HRH Princess Somsawali and Darjah Paduka Seri Laila Jasa Yang Amat Berjasa Darjah Pertama (PSLJ) on Squadron Leader Virayuth Didyasawali.

On the second day, the royal visitors had separate itinerary. HM the Sultan visited the Chulachomklao Royal Military Academy at Nakhon Nayok District, and HM the Raja Isteri toured the Support Foundation, arts and handicrafts centre, and the Vimarnmek Mansion, a museum and former palace.

On the third day, after a visit to the Pavilion of the Bangkok Metropolitan at Pan Fah Bridge, HM the Sultan and HM the Raja Isteri proceeded to the Chitralda Palace to pay a courtesy call on HM King Bhumibol and HM Queen Sirikit, who accompanied them to the RTAF airfield from where the royal visitors left for Chaingmai.

Their Majesties and entourage received a tumultous welcome in

Chiangmai and were met on arrival by HRH Crown Prince Vajiralongkorn, the Chiangmai Governor, Pairat Decharin, and other leading citizens.

The traditional welcoming ceremony included a cultural dance performed by about 200 Northern Thailand dancers from the Chiangmai College of Arts.

Later HM the Sultan visited the Development Study of The Royal Projects in Huay Hong Krai, Doi Saket, where His Majesty received a briefing on the progress of the agricultural projects being carried out there. After that His Majesty graciously consented to release some fry into a fish pond and planted a tree.

Meanwhile, HM the Raja Isteri visited the Shinawata Silk Factory, an umbrella factory and the 'Chiangmai Treasure', which is Chiangmai's largest factory that makes antique furniture and other antique things.

In the evening, the Chiangmai Governor and his wife hosted a banquet in honour of Their Majesties and entourage.

Their Majesties ended their visit to Thailand the next day and were seen off at Chiangmai airport by HRH Crown Prince Vajiralongkorn, who, in keeping with tradition, presented a bouquet of flowers to His Majesty.

Also in the entourage were Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Bakti Diraja Dato Laila Utama Haji Awang Isa, the Special Adviser to His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan cum the Home Affairs Minister and Pengiran Sanggamara Diraja Major General Pengiran Haji Ibnu, the Deputy Defence Minister.

President and Madam Roh Tae Woo, accompanied by a high-level delegation, arrived on November 12 for a three-day state visit to Brunei Darussalam.

Welcoming the President and the First Lady at the Brunei International Airport were His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah and Her Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha.

Soon after their arrival, President Roh, escorted by His Majesty, mounted the special dais to receive the royal salute as the national anthems of both countries were played in turn. This was followed by a 21-gun salute.

Also at the airport were His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Perdana Wazir Sahibul Himmah Wal-Waqar Pengiran Muda Haji Mohamed Bolkiah, the Foreign Affairs Minister and wife, His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Bendahara Seri Maharaja Permaisuara Pengiran Muda Haji Sufri Bolkiah and wife; His Royal Highness Paduka Seri pengiran Digadong Sahibul Mal Pengiran Muda Haji Jefri Bolkiah, the Finance Minister; state dignitaries and foreign diplomats.

Thousands of flag-waving schoolchildren lined the route from the airport to Istana Edinburgh where the President and his wife stayed during their visit.

In a ceremony at the Istana Nurul Iman, HM the Sultan bestowed 'Darjah Kerabat Laila Utama Yang Amat Di-Hormati (DK)' on President Roh and the First Lady.

The President conferred The Grand Order of Magunghwa on HM the Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha and HRH Pengiran Isteri Hajjah Mariam, and Order of The Diplomatic Service Merit, Gwanghwa Medal on HRH Prince Muda Haji Sufri Bolkiah and HRH Prince Muda Haji Jefri Bolkiah, the Finance Minister.

He also conferred Order of The Diplomatic Service Merit, Heung-in Medal on Yang Amat Mulia Pengiran Lela Cheteria Sahibun Najabah Pengiran Anak Haji Abdul Aziz, the Grand Chamberlain, and Dato Seri Laila Jasa Awang Haji Zakaria, the Deputy Foreign Affairs Minister.

The itinerary of President and Madam Roh included visits to the Malay Technology Museum and the Arts and Handicrafts Centre, and a get-together session with the 300 Koreans living in the country.

His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah visited the Republic of Korea (ROK) in April 1984, and Brunei opened its embassy in Seoul in February 1987. The republic set up a consulate in Brunei in September 1983 and upgraded it to an embassy in 1984. ROK's imports of crude oil from Brunei amounted to \$202.3 million in 1987 and exported to Brunei vehicles, electrical goods and other products valued at \$7.1 million during the same year.

New labour steps, strategies needed: S.A.

The ASEAN Labour Ministers Meeting in Bali was told that it was important to take new steps and strategies to improve the economy and welfare of labourers in the ASEAN member countries.

This point was stressed to the meeting by the Special Adviser to His Majesty the Sultan cum Home Affairs Minister, Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Bakti Diraja Dato Laila Utama Haji Awang Isa, who also stated the importance of upgrading technical cooperation by utilising the ASEAN member countries' resources and the promotion of suitable international agencies.

The meeting, held from October 13 to 14, was officially opened by His Excellency Bapak Sudharmono on behalf of President Suharto

The meeting discussed various labour issues affecting the ASEAN member countries -Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore and Thailand.

It made known its stand on the practice of a number of developed countries on Trade Protectionism Policy, and voiced its opinion on the activities of the International Trade Secretariat, which closely involved trade issues with labourers' rights and other International Labour Standards.

It recognised the importance of the informal sector for its role in providing employment opportunities to the jobless and concurred to find a way to enhance its development.

It also agreed to take further action on the matters discussed at the Heads of Government Meeting in Manila in 1987, concerning the development of labour resource and manpower to encourage socio-economic development.

Pehin Dato Haji Isa's delegation included the Permanent Secretary at the Home Affairs Ministry, Dato Paduka Awang Haji Omar bin Haji Serudin and the Labour Commissioner, Awang Haji Zainal bin Haji Abdul Momin.

The minister and his delegation hosted a dinner for students from Brunei Darussalam, Malaysia, Singapore and Indonesia at the Al-Azhar University.

Brunei Darussalam has been sending students to the university since the Fifties and Pehin Dato Haji Mohammad Zain was the first Bruneian to graduate from it. At the moment a total of 137 Bruneians are pursuing their studies at the university.

Singapore FM's familiarisation tour

The newly appointed Singapore Foreign Minister, Mr Wong Kan Seng, paid a two-day visit to Brunei Darussalam on November 22, as part of his familiarisation tour of ASEAN countries.

HM: Whipping mandatory due to rise in crimes

His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah said that with effect from 28th September, 1988 whipping is mandatory punishment for criminal offences such as rape, assault, robbery, extortion and vandalism.

The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam announced this in a speech at a gathering to celebrate the Prophet Muhammad's birthday, which was held at the Taman Haji Omar Ali Saifuddien in the capital on October 23.

HM Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah said the new law was passed in view of the increasing number of crimes committed by locals and foreigners.

His Majesty added that if these crimes against the people and property were allowed to continue, they would surely affect the country's peace and harmony, and threaten the security of property. They would also affect the country's development.

His Majesty again reminded the people to preserve always the peace and harmony, and public property by respecting and obeying the country's laws and Islamic religious precepts.

HM the Sultan later led more than 46,000 Muslims, who represented government departments, school, colleges, villages, youth associations, private firms, and the security forces as well as other uniformed organisations, in a five-kilometre procession around Bandar Seri Begawan.

Among those who attended the function were His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Perdana Wazir Sahibul Himmah Wal-Waqar Pengiran Muda Haji Mohamed Bolkiah, the Foreign Affairs Minister; His Royal Highness Paduka Seri Pengiran Digadong Sahibul Mal Pengiran Digadong Sahibul Mal Pengiran Muda Haji Jefri Bolkiah, the Finance Minister; His Majesty's eldest son, His Royal Highness Prince Muda Al-Muhtadee Billah; cabinet ministers; and other dignitaries.

Y ouths with a technical or commercial career in mind had a chance to see last month what one of the country's leading institutions has to offer in technology and further education.

The Sultan Saiful Rijal College, located along Jalan Muara just a few kilometres from the capital, held an Open Day specially for this purpose on November 22 and 23.

This was the first time the college organised such event since its formation three years ago when the Sultan Saiful Rijal School of Building was merged with the Brunei Technical Training Centre.

At present the college has a teaching staff of more than 200, who specialise in diverse aspects of technology and further education in 27 sections and a student population of 920.

The Open Day was also designed to acquint parents and employers with the college activities and the wide variety of available courses, which are both technical and non-technical.

These courses, which lead to Royal Society of Arts, City and Guilds, Business and Technician Council as well as other qualifications, prepare them for the careers of their choice and at the same time equip them with the necessary skills needed by the country.

The college left nothing to chance to make the Open Day a success, and the hundreds of visitors were visibly impressed as some of the students, who acted as guides, showed them around the 8.9-hectare campus.

On display were an array of teaching equipment, workshops and laboratories, and students doing practical work in automotive, computer, radio, television, cookery and other fields of studies.

Also on show were exhibits by the Royal Brunei Armed Forces, Brunei Shell and Royal Brunei Airlines.

Education Minister's NZ trip

The Education Minister, Pehin Orang Kaya Setia Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Abdul Rahman bin Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Mohammad Taib paid an official visit to New Zealand from October 23 to 30 at the invitation of the Prime Minister, Mr David Lange.

Pehin Dato Haji Abdul Rahman had talks with Mr Lange, who is also the Education Minister on various educational issues.

The Bruneian minister, accompanied by a delegation of senior officials, also toured several higher learning institutions in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch, including those where a number of Bruneians studying or attending training courses.

Brunei a member of CBGL

Brunei Darussalam, along with a handful of countries has been selected as a member of the Commonwealth Board of Governors of Learning (CBGL).

The Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Education, Awang Haji Abdul Razak bin Haji Muhammad, represented Brunei at the CBGL's first meeting held in Vancouver, Canada from November 12 to 14.

The CBGL is responsible for the policies of the Commonwealth Agency of Learning that has been set up to coordinate educational programmes among Commonwealth member countries.


Pehin Dato Haji Hussain later presented prizes to the photographers whose entries were adjudged the best in their respective categories.

ASEAN journalists tour member countries


Thirty participants of the third ASEAN Journalist Exchange Programme, including five from Brunei Darussalam, arrived in Bandar Seri Begawan on October 16 for a four-day stay.

Brunei Darussalam was the third stop of their six-nation tour after Singapore, which is the host country this year, and Indonesia. During their stay in each of the ASEAN countries, the journalists had the opportunity to observe the national development of the respective countries, meet ministers and senior civil servants, and visit various places of interest.

The bi-annual project of the ASEAN Committee on Culture and Information was organised to tighten the bonds of friendship among ASEAN journalists and to expose them to each member country's economic, political and social progress.

The programme was initiated in 1983 with Indonesia as the first host nation and Brunei Darussalam participated for the first time in 1986.

The tree with many uses



I f you ask Bruneians about a tree called Vitex pubexens, chances are that most of them will shake their heads. This is because the tree is known locally as kulimpapa.

Kulimpapa, which grows up to a height of 6.5 metres, has many uses in the country. For example, the shoots when eaten raw with a sauce of shrimp paste are said to provide a relief for a wide range of diseases such as diarrhoea, stomach ache, asthma and high blood.

In a traditional ceremony, the matured leaves boiled with other local leaves are used as a herbal bath by a woman after giving birth.

The bark, which is yellow and tastes bitter as quinine, was an effective cure for fever in the old days.

The ripen fruit is black and is as big as an English berry, and the trunk is hardwood with a fine, smooth texture. It is one of the types of hardwood used for making the hilt of the kris, a wavy-bladed dagger of the Malays.


