ROYAL SPEECH IN CONJUNCTION WITH HIS MAJESTY'S 65TH BIRTHDAY ANNIVERSARY Continue balanced development agenda

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 15 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam called for the need to continue a balanced development agenda.

The matters were delivered in His Majesty's 65th birthday anniversary *titah* (royal speech) at the Balai

Three schemes introduce under HR Fund

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 15 – His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in his royal 65th birthday anniversary speech also announced the implementation of three schemes under the Human Resource (HR) Fund to be carried out in phases.

Earlier in the speech, His Majesty touched on educational progress where Brunei's educational investment and infrastructure are one of the best; and the percentage of people with high education is among the highest in the world including its literacy rate.

"This however, should not allow us to remain silent from viewing areas that have been found weak," said the sovereign.

Among the worrying matters were the rates of student dropouts, shortage of candidates with credit four (4) GCE 'O' or more; and limited opportunity for those with 'O' and 'A' level qualification to undertake courses at government's technical and vocational institutions.

As an immediate measure, His Majesty has consented for the implementation of these three schemes; firstly is the improvement on Training and Employment Scheme which is currently running by providing financial incentives to locals who have been trained with skills as long as they continue to work in the private sector.

Secondly is the Resource Capacity Development in the Private Sector Scheme where it is a scholarship that enables locals who are working in the private sector to enhance their qualification and skills by furthering their studies either locally or abroad.

Thirdly, the Local Scholarship for Technical and Vocational Education at Private Academic

Singgahsana Indera Buana (Throne Chamber), Istana Nurul Iman.

Firstly, the National Development Plan (RKN) must underlie strategic needs with effective implementation. Secondly, the planning of human resource development should be more orderly. And thirdly, to formulate a network of sufficient laws and orders is also needed to protect the importance of development, said His Majesty.

With these, said His Majesty, our economy will continue to grow, with the nation being able to provide wider employment opportunities to the younger generation, and the nation's financial position is more resilient and sustainable.





Institution Scheme specifically for `O' and `A' level school leavers who are qualified but do not obtain the limited opportunity to study at government's technical and vocational institutions.

And in addition, His Majesty also consented for changes to the provision of education allowance to officers and staff in the civil service especially for their children who are studying at private institutions recognised by the government, who are undertaking courses at tertiary level.

This education allowance for tertiary level is also extended to citizens and residents who are working in the private sector, who are active members of the Employees Trust Fund. This allowance will commence from January 1, 2012.

"I hope that these measures will increase the capacity and strengthen the private sector especially in creating more employment opportunities for locals," added His Majesty.

Change on passage allowance and introduction of new tariff

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 15 – His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in his 65th birthday royal speech has consented for change on passage allowance including extending it to all female officers and staff in the civil service.

This change will take effect on January 1, 2012, and as one of the benefits that is still extended to current members of civil service, this allowance will continuously be reviewed from time to time subject to the ability of government resources.

On the context of energy consumption, His Majesty also announced that the government is currently examining one new tariff, which among others, aims to assist low income group, and at the same time, to encourage public to avoid wastage. The new tariff will be enforced on January 1, 2012.

Earlier in his *titah*, His Majesty spoke on the continuous increase of consumption of domestic natural gas as fuel and national energy consumption per capita with Brunei being the highest in ASEAN. Government subsidy on petroleum product had also increased more than 45 per cent last year, compared to the previous year.

At the same time, payment of arrears for electricity for housing and business sectors are also continuously increasing, said His Majesty.

To overcome this problem, His Majesty had consented for the replacement of post-paid electrical power meter to pre-paid meter for private housing, which will be implemented for free and fully borne by the government.

HM expresses concern on housing and health issues

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 15 – His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in his 65th birthday royal speech expressed his concern on housing and health issues.

"These will also be the same with housing for the people. The construction programme will not only be implemented quickly, but will also be sustainable in terms of land usage, construction cost and government subsidy, and the owner's capability to pay," said His Majesty.


As for the owner's capability, His Majesty had consented for a research to be conducted to identify a saving system, where housing applicants can save for housing the earliest possible. This saving system will be introduced as soon as the research is completed.

More houses for citizens

KUALA BELAIT, July 30 - As one of its continuous effort to provide shelter and comfort to its citizens, the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam through its National Housing Programmes have awarded more people and citizens with land grants and homes.

On July 30, a total of 812 people received keys to semidetached and terrace houses under the Panaga National Housing Scheme, in the Belait District. Out of the number, 411 people received keys to semi-detached houses, while 401 people received terrace houses.

Present to personally award the keys to their new homes was His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam held at the Conference Hall in Kuala Belait.

Soon after the house key presentation, His Majesty visited the Perdana Wazir Secondary School at Jalan Setia Pahlawan. The Perdana Wazir Secondary School was initially known as Kuala Belait English School, but it was upgraded to its current name on September 12, 1970. Currently, there are 811 students registered at the school with a teaching workforce of 85 people.

His Majesty also stopped over at the residence of Penghulu Mukim Kuala Belait who is also acting as Village Head of Pekan Kuala Belait, Awang Haji Pungut bin Ali, at the Kampung Pandan National Housing Programme and visited several residence of the recipients.

Prior to that, on July 12, His Majesty also had presented the house keys to 650 recipients of the semi-detached and terrace houses under similar housing programme. The ceremony took place at Conference Hall in Kuala Belait.

Housing Scheme by the government reflects His Majesty's caring leadership in giving attention to the welfare, prosperity and harmony of the people and residents in the country.

In the Financial Year 2011/2012 Provision alone, the Housina Development Department received a total of more than \$14 million. The national housing policy is in line with His Majesty's vision towards enhancing the standards of living of the people in the country.

Local mortality rate decreases

TUNGKU, July 2 – Brunei Darussalam's health sector continues to show positive developments. The latest indicator showed that its mortality rate in 2009 showed a decrease which was 7.4 for every 1,000 deliveries. This showed a vast difference when compared to the mortality ratio of pregnant mothers in 1960 where it was 487.2 for every 100,000 births which was about 20 deaths annually; where as in 2009 there were 15.1 deaths in every 100,000 births indicating one death per year. The establishment and continuous health services for pregnant mothers and children have benefited mother's health thus showing a significant decline in mortality rate.

These were highlighted by the Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Adanan at the launching of National Public Health Symposium 2011 held at Universiti Brunei Darussalam (UBD).

The minister also said that Brunei Darussalam has been declared malaria-free by World Health Organisation (WHO) since 1987 which is a significant achievement in public health.

He further added that with high protection and excellence intake of Expanded Programme of Immunisation (EPI), few diseases in the nation have been prevented such as children vaccination where there have been no cases on diphtheria and tetanus since 1990. The nation has also been declared polio-free since 2000 while childhood tuberculosis pertussis, mumps, measles and rubella are on lower level.

The two-day symposium entitled 'Healthy Environment, Healthy Living, Healthy People' was attended by 250 participants comprising of doctors and nurses working in public health and health officers.

It was attended by local and international participants comprising of educators; researchers; parents; professionals: officers from various agencies and nongovernment; including international participation from Australia, China, Philippines, Indonesia, India, Pakistan, Malaysia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Singapore, Spain and United Arab Emirates.

Brunei 1st ASEAN country to have National Physical Activity Guidelines

BERAKAS, July 9 - A poor diet and non-active physical are the cause of the effects of diseases that are not infectious.

The Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Adanan stated the matter at the launching of The National Physical Activity Guidelines for Brunei Darussalam held at the International Convention Centre.

With the launching of the book, Brunei Darussalam is the 1st ASEAN country to have the National Physical Activity Guidelines.

The book contains information and practical guidance on the practice of physical activity required per day which is suitable for all ages to obtain optimal health benefits.

The guidelines, among others, aimed as reference and source of information on specific physical Brunei Darussalam activities for and are intended to be used by organisations, agencies, groups and professionals especially in the areas

of health, either from government or non-government sector.

In conjunction with the launching of the book, the Ministry of Health held a symposium on the National Physical Activity Guidelines and Sesquicentenary Professor invited of Public Health, School of Public Health, University of Sydney, Australia, Professor Adrian Bauman as a lecturer specifically on 'Promoting Physical Activity in the Community: Barriers and Facilitating Factors'.

10 RBAF personnel join UNIFIL

RIMBA, July 12 - A total of 10 Royal Brunei Armed Forces (RBAF) personnel participated in the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL).

The farewell ceremony was held at Royal Brunei Air Base.

Present was RBAF's Deputy Commander, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Datu Brigadier General Mohamad Tawih bin Abdullah who also handed over the national flag to the Head of the Contingent, Officer Commanding of the Royal Brunei Land Force's First Batallion Commanding Company, Major Muhammad Suwardi Ariffin.

This is the seventh despatch of the RBAF personnel to Lebanon since 2008. The national contingent will join troops from Malaysia under the command of Company 7 or MALCOY 7. The deployment of Brunei Darussalam's contingent in Lebanon is in line with the UN's mandate besides being an opportunity for the RBAF to show Brunei's presence in the UN peacekeeping force.

Public concerns on 'Radio Frequency Field Electro-Magnetic'

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 12 – The Minister of Communications, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Abdullah touched on public's concern on the risk of 'Radio Frequency Field Electro-Magnetic' (RF-EMF).

The minister was speaking at the opening of the 17th ASEAN Telecommunication Regulators' Council (ATRC) Meeting held at Songket Hall, Rizqun International Hotel in Gadong. According to the minister, on May 2011, a task force under the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) has issued a report on RF-EMF. The minister added with the growth of mobile users, operators and service providers face a dilemma in addressing public concerns on RF-EMF. The minister also stressed that regulatory actions will be taken against service providers if emissions are found to be above the safe limits set by the international guidelines.

The three-day meeting was attended by heads of the ASEAN telecommunications regulatory authorities, officials and dialogue partners from China and Japan. The meeting among others discussed the implementation of the ASEAN ICT Masterplan (AIM) 2015. AIM is a roadmap that charts the development of the ICT sector in ASEAN over the next five years. The sharing of Policy and Regulatory among ASEAN members will also be discussed.

Implement Strategic Medium Term to improve food safety

This is because the contribution of primary industries including agriculture is small compared with other ASEAN member countries which is only accounted for about one per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the country.

The matter was stated by the Acting Director of Agriculture and Agrifood, Dayang Hajah Aidah at the 31st ASEAN Food Security Reserve Board Meeting (AFSRB) held at the Centrepoint Hotel in Gadong.

The Acting Director said this can be seen as Brunei Darussalam is importing 60 percent of its food requirements and about 75 percent of the total came from ASEAN countries.

The Acting Director added the agenda for food safety was often the main topic of meetings, conferences, forums and workshops covering issues of human concern caused by natural disasters, political and socio-economic upheaval, either at national, regional or international.

Brunei Darussalam hosted the twoday meeting which was attended by representatives from ASEAN member countries and ASEAN Secretariat.

Minister attends informal meeting of ASEAN EAS

BALI, REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA, July 19 – Brunei Darussalam's Minister of Education, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abu Bakar attended the Informal Meeting of ASEAN East Asia Summit (EAS) Education Ministers' Meeting in Bali, Indonesia on July 18.

Prior to the meeting, the ministers also attended the Informal Meeting of ASEAN Education Ministers Meeting and Informal ASEAN + 3 Education Ministers Meeting. Both meeting were chaired by the Minister of Education, Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abu Bakar as the Chairman of the ASEAN Ministers of Education.

During the meeting, the minister reviewed progress made in ASEAN

cooperation in education since their last meeting in January in Bandar Seri Begawan, when the ASEAN Five-Year Work Plan on Education (2011-2015) was adopted. The ministers also exchanged views on new ideas and initiatives for regional cooperation.

Meanwhile, in the informal meeting of ASEAN EAS, the minister shared current initiatives in the quality assurance sector which included working closely with other regional and international accreditation agencies such as the Asia Pacific Quality Network (APQN); ASEAN Quality Assurance Network (AQAN); and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA).

International workshop on Scoliosis

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 23 – Brunei Darussalam had conducted an 'International Workshop On Scoliosis' which aimed to educate local and foreign backbone surgeon on Scoliosis management.

Organised by Neurosurgery Department of Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha (RIPAS) Hospital; the workshop was a result of close cooperation between Brunei's Ministry of Health and AO International Backbone, an international body that specialise in worldwide development and training of backbone.

The workshop which was held until July 23 were attended by doctors from Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Oman, People's Republic of China and Philippines.

For the past three years, 30 patients had undergone operation for Scoliosis led by scoliosis surgeon specialist from AO Bones Faculty who visited Brunei every six months.

AMBD issues new polymer currency notes

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, July 18 -Autoriti Monetari Brunei Darussalam (AMBD) has issued new \$1, \$5 and \$10 polymer notes featuring advanced security features. These new polymer notes will circulate side by side with present notes, and will still remain legal tender in Brunei Darussalam and in countries which accept them.

The issuance of the new polymer currency notes was in conjunction with the 65th birthday of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam.

These new polymer notes contain the following security features:

A. Omar `Ali Saifuddien Mosque and the ceremonial barge form the complex clear window design incorporating a shadow image and vignette of `1' numeral; Lapau (Royal Ceremonial Hall) forms the complex clear window design incorporating a shadow design and vignette `5' numeral, and Jame' `Asr Hassanil Bolkiah Mosque forms the complex clear window design incorporating a shadow design and vignette `10' numeral;

- B. Other security features include His Majesty's portrait, initials `HB' and a section of the mosque or Lapau design which will appear when the banknote is raised to the light;
- C. Dynamic optical feature alternates between gold and blue when viewed at varying angles;
- D. A flower design is formed through the combination of front and back printing in perfect registration when the note is held up to the light;
- E. Complex fine line background security patterns in multiple rainbow print with fluorescing



elements illuminate under the ultra violet light;

- Multicolour raised fine line printing of His Majesty's portrait, red Crest of Brunei Darussalam, the flower design and surrounding text;
- G. Raised printing of the Braille `1', `5', and `10' for the visual impaired;
- H. Vertical and horizontal serial numbers on the front are printed in varying sizes fluoresce yellow/ green under the ultra violet light.

- By air Brunei's national carrier, Royal Brunei Airlines travels to more than 20 destinations around the world. The airline also has worldwide office for you to book a return flight to Brunei (to know the nearest RBA's office at your place, please log to: www.bruneiair.com)
- International airlines such as Singapore Airlines, Malaysia Airlines and Thai Airways also fly frequently to Brunei. Beginning July 2006, Air Asia, one of Malaysia's lowest airfare carrier has direct flight from Kuala Lumpur to Brunei.
- Arrival by plane would land you to Brunei International Airport (BWN), the sole airport in the nation.
- For those who enjoy journey by sea, you can reach Brunei by boat or ferry. The main ferry terminal in Brunei is the Serasa Ferry Terminal at Muara. You can catch a ferry from Labuan, Sabah or Lawas and Sundar, both in Sarawak, a state of the neighbouring country, Malaysia. Another option is via a boat from Limbang, Sarawak which will arrive at the jetty around Jalan Residency area in the Capital.
- You would have two options of entry point to Brunei by land transport. You can enter through the Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait District or the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post in Brunei Muara District. The Sungai Tujoh Immigration Control Post in Belait is the entry point for those from Miri, Sarawak. While the Kuala Lurah Immigration Control Post is the entrance for those coming from Limbang, Sarawak; Kota Kinabalu; and Kalimantan.
