HANOI, November 18 - APEC members are faced with the challenge of creating growth and sustaining development in a world filled with threats of terrorism, health pandemic and natural disaster.

Citizens urged to preserve identity


BERAKAS, November 14 – We must preserve our own identity, perfect it and do not change it easily.





CPI September 2006 decreased by 0.1%

The month of September 2006 experienced a slight decrease by 0.1 per cent from the previous month with an index of 102.3 for its Consumer Price Index (CPI). The decrease was partly attributed to the Brunei Grand Sales which started from September 15 until October 2006.

The cost of food and non-alcoholic beverages rose by 0.1 per cent due to higher prices of fresh fish, fresh prawn and other seafood, vegetable and palm oils, fruits, apices and snacks.

While lower prices of ready-made clothing and accessories, materials for male and female, and footwear led to a 4.2 per cent decrease in the cost of clothing and footwear.

Due to cheaper prices of furniture; household furnishings; audio, video equipments and musical instruments; kitchen appliances and utensils; crockery and cutlery; and household operation; the cost of household goods, services and operation dropped by 1.5 per cent.

On the other hand, higher prices of certain air fares led to a 0.2 per cent increase in the cost of transport.

Cost of communication declined by 0.6 per cent due to cheaper prices of instrument including accessories.

Meanwhile, the cost of medical and health increased by 0.1 per cent as a result of higher prices of proprietary medicines and supplies.

The cost of recreation and entertainment went up by 2.8 per cent due to higher prices of holiday packages.

Lower prices of personal care and personal effects and other personal goods led to lower cost of miscellaneous goods and services by 0.1 per cent.

The cost of housing, water, electricity and maintenance; and education remained the same as in the previous month.

The CPI in September 2006 was 0.2 per cent higher than that of the same month in 2005.

Brunei introduces 4th Issuance of Sukuk Al-Ijarah

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, November 2 - Brunei Darussalam through the Ministry of Finance announced the successful pricing of its 4th issuance of Short-term Sukuk Al-Ijarah.

The \$120 million issue carrying a maturity of 91 days begins on November 2, 2006 and matures on February 1, 2007, at a rental rate of 3.375 per cent.

This is the fourth issue of the short-term Sukuk Al-Ijarah by the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam following its successful maiden offering on April 6 this year.

BERAKAS, November 4 - Various activities had been lined up in conjunction with the Royal Brunei Land Forces (RBLF) 45th anniversary. On November 4, RBLF held a parade at the First Battalion Parade Square of the RBLF in Berakas Garrison.

Kidney cases rise each year

JERUDONG, November 12 – The Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam through the Ministry of Health has set up a renal department aimed at finding ways to tackle kidney problems.

Currently, there are around 430 patients with kidney problems nationwide. It is expected that the number will increase between 40 and 60 each year. The main cause for the rise is due to the prevalence of diabetes.

In curbing the rising number of kidney patients, the Permanent Secretary also urged restaurants and food vendors to assist the Ministry of Health in combating chronic diseases by reducing the use of oil, sugar and salt in the food sold.

The Permanent Secretary also hoped the Association of Kidney Patients could play a vital role in helping to raise awareness on kidney diseases among members of the public through campaigns that could see a reduction in the number of cases.

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, November 20 - Ministers of Agriculture and Forestry from ASEAN member countries as well as from China, Japan and South Korea agreed to an extension for East Asia Emergency Rice Reserve (EAERR) pilot project activities.

The agreement was reached at the 6th Asean Plus Three Ministers of Agriculture and Forestry meeting in Singapore on November 17.

Brunei Darussalam was represented by the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, Pehin Dato Seri Setia Doctor Haji Awang Ahmad. The meeting was held under the chairmanship of Mr Mah Bow Tan, Minister for National Development of Singapore. The pilot project includes stockpiled emergency rice reserve projects in Indonesia, Laos and Philippines for another year.

The ministers agreed that there is a need for Asean+3 countries to further strengthen collaboration with international agencies such as the Asian Development Bank (ADB), Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) and World Animal Health Organisation (OIE), to improve transparency, coordination and synergy to control and eradicate Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).

Brunei Darussalam underscored importance of enhancing capabilities in the diagnosis of animal diseases especially those related to HPAI; and welcomed the Republic of Korea's new project proposal to hold a symposium for the sharing of its Avian Influenza (AI) control system, facilities and equipment for diagnosis, as well as providing Asean member countries with AI rapid diagnostic kit on a pilot basis.
